MINUTES

CITY OF ALTAMONT March 09, 2023

REGULAR MEETING

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM with Mayor Richard Hayward presiding. Mayor Hayward opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and prayer. Councilmembers present: Ben Cochran, Kyle Wiford, Lyle Sykes & Cameron Johnston.

MINUTES

Councilmember Cochran moved and Sykes seconded to approve the minutes from February 23, 2023. Motion carried.

INVOICES

Councilmember Johnston moved and Cochran seconded paying the invoices totaling \$49,427.70, not to include invoice number 2152023, making the total invoices \$47,585.70. Motion carried.

Council would like for invoice number 2152023 reviewed in the City Office.

SHANE HOLTZMAN

Shane Holtzman was present to answer questions from Council about placing a permanent gate on 7th Street North of Harrison Auditorium. The gate would be secured when not in use and used to barricade the road during home basketball games. A letter included in the packet from USD 506 Superintendent John Wyrick states that, "The gate will be secured on each side when not in use. The school will also make sure the gate has the required signage/reflective tape as required by the city." Shane thought that they wanted to go with square tubing and Councilmember Sykes stated that was his thought also, as they looked more robust. Mayor Hayward said that Chief Shields would like the Police Department as well as the Utility Department to have a key to unlock the gates when they are in the open locked position, if needed.

USD 506 BARRICADES

Councilmember Cochran moved and Sykes seconded to allow 506 to build the barricades to set up on 7th Street north of Harrison Auditorium. Motion carried.

NATURAL GAS PRE-PAY

The City Council previously agreed to enter an agreement for Natural Gas Prepay with KMGA. Included in their packets was the agreement to be signed between KMGA and the City of Altamont.

Councilmember Cochran moved and Johnston seconded to enter into the natural gas prepay participation agreement with KMGA and MMGA. Motion carried.

OFFICE HOUR CHANGE

During the February 23 Council Meeting the council was presented a new office hour schedule. The proposed schedule would change the open door hours of the City Office from 8AM-5PM Monday-Friday to 7:30AM-5PM Monday-Thursday & 7:30AM-1:30PM on Fridays. This schedule would allow for anyone who needs to do business in the City Office time outside of a normal 8-5 work week to do so. The new schedule would also give the Utility Department more open office hour time during their work schedules. Councilmember Cochran stated that he thinks there is a really good City Office staff right now and if this little change is going to improve moral and retention then he is all for it. Mayor Hayward was in agreeance.

Councilmember Cochran moved and Wiford seconded allow the proposed City Office hours as written in the minutes which is Monday-Thursday 7:30AM-5PM and Friday 7:30AM-1:30PM effective May 1st. Motion carried.

20 ACRE HAY BIDS

The City of Altamont is requesting bids for the mowing, baling and removal of hay for the 2023 harvest season. The general scope of the project includes approximately 20 acres located at McMillian and Huston Avenues. Council was on board to taking bids again and wants to move forward with advertising it.

NRP

Council was provided with a brochure with general information about the Neighborhood Revitalization Program. NRP is a program that would provide incentives for housing and building improvements through property tax rebates. NRP would provide residential and commercial property owners a 100% rebate of the tax increase, less a 5% administration fee. Residential homeowners would have to make a minimum investment of \$5,000 towards their property, and commercial property owners would have to make a minimum investment of \$10,000 towards their property. Council would like to move forward with NRP

INSURANCE RENEWAL

Council was provided with an email from Brannon Green with Assured Partners about the renewal of the city insurance policy, along with an attached quote. City Administrator LeaAnn Myers also included a letter to council about the renewal rates. The insurance policy would go from \$63,194.00 in 2022 to \$70,290.00 for 2023.

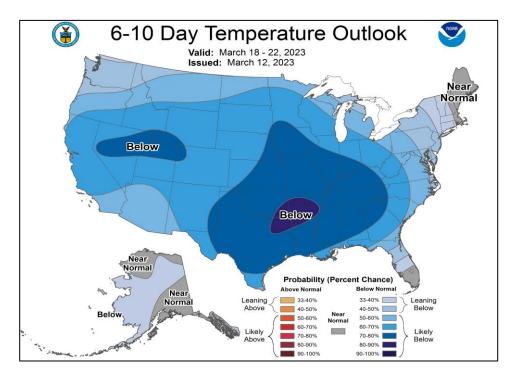
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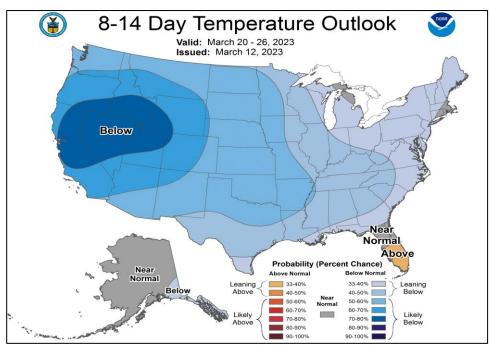


KMGA Member Update – March 15, 2023

The calendar says we are a few days away from Spring, but the weather forecast is hanging on to winter. NOAA's forecast through March 26th expects well below normal temperatures across the lower 48 states of the U.S.

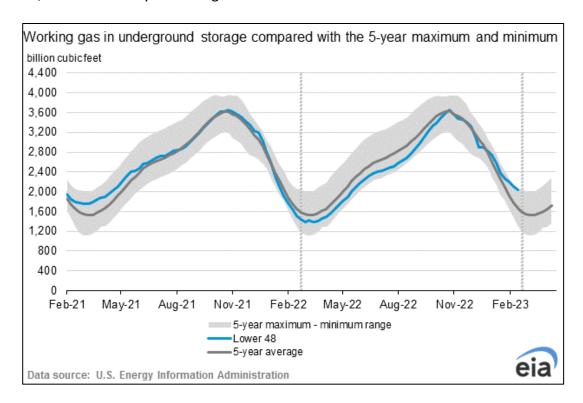




Natural Gas Production and Storage Levels

In EIA's Short-term Energy Outlook report, EIA Administrator Joe DeCarolis stated, "The natural gas market is particularly uncertain, but we expect that US natural gas production will establish new record highs in both 2023 and 2024, leading to lower domestic prices". The EIA boosted its total natural gas marketed production forecast for 2023 by 2.36 Billion Cubic Feet per day (Bcf/d) to 109.11 Bcf/d on average and estimated production will grow further to average 111.24 Bcf/d in 2024.

According to NOAA January and February, the first two months of 2023 combined were among the three warmest on record for that period going back to 1895. The historically mild 2022-23 winter season across much of the US has created a surplus in gas storage levels. As of March 3rd, storage inventory levels are 21.5%, or 359 Bcf, above the five-year average.

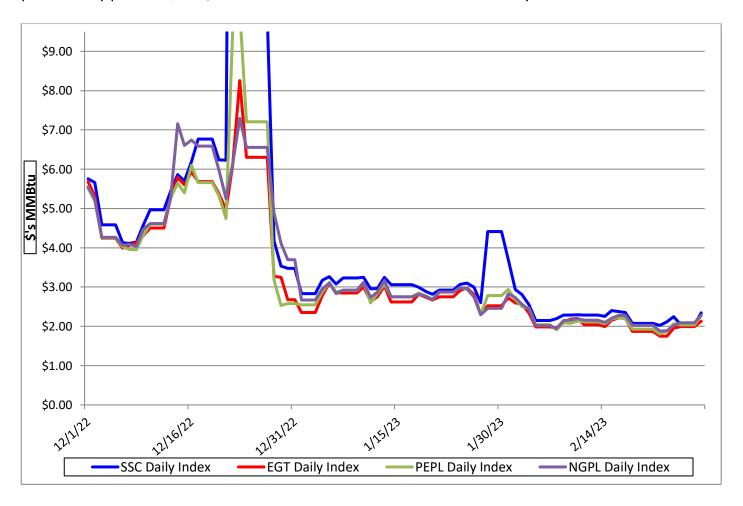


Natural Gas Prices

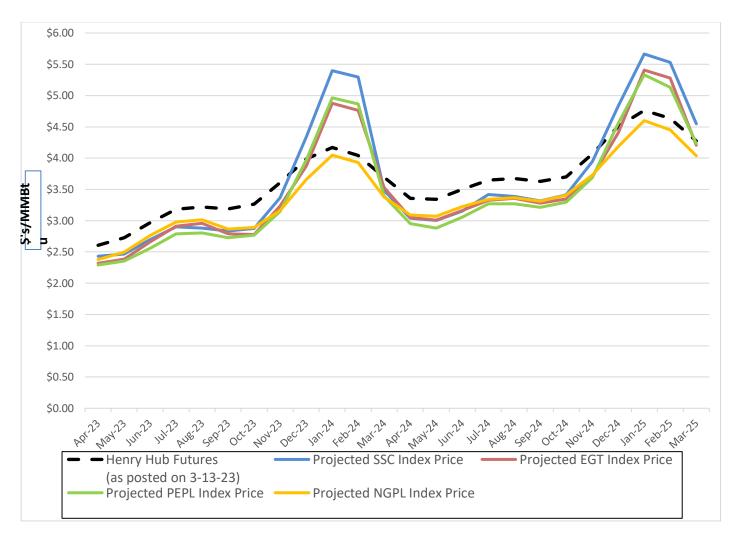
As noted in previous member updates during the summer of 2022, both daily and monthly index gas prices were high. For the months of June-August the daily index averaged around \$7.35/MMBtu, while the monthly pricing for 2 of the 3 summer months was above \$8.00/MMBtu.

Winter 2022-23 saw monthly prices remain high, with January seeing the highest monthly prices posting at \$8.43/MMBtu. January's monthly prices were reflected of the cold weather and supply constraints experienced during the Christmas weekend.

The chart below is a snapshot of the daily index prices for Dec 2022-Feb 2023. The highest prices posted came with the cold weather during the Christmas weekend with Southern Star index price nearly reaching the \$30/MMBtu mark. Daily prices dropped significantly after the Christmas storm and have remained low since that time (except for the jump in price at the end of January due to colder weather). This drop in price has been driven by the extreme mild weather. The lowest posted daily price of \$1.75/MMBtu was on the Enable index on February 23rd.



Looking forward, the Henry Hub Futures contract price is relatively low through March 2025, shown as the dashed line in the chart below. Some drivers in this pricing trend are U.S. storage inventory is at a surplus coming out of winter, mild winter has created high storage inventory levels in Europe, LNG prices in the Europe and Asian markets have dropped from near \$40/MMBtu in December to just over \$10/MMBtu, and U.S. gas production projected to reach new levels.



Henry Hub, located in Erath, Louisiana is a nexus of several natural gas interconnections. Because market conditions vary between Henry Hub and the roughly 40 or so physical trading locations around the U.S., a published "basis" per MMBtu is utilized to approximate this difference in geography and local market conditions.

In the chart above the current published basis has been applied to the posted Henry Hub price to achieve a projected mid-continent index price. You can see the basis is typically a negative component during summer months and a positive component in the winter months.

Fear and uncertainty remain within the natural gas market and industry. It will only take one incident and/or news article to impact natural gas prices.

Natural Gas Supply Purchasing Strategy Policy

As we move out of the winter season, we have begun the process of our annual review of the current purchasing policy. KMGA staff has recently been in contact with several entities within the natural gas industry seeking input on possible modifications to the policy. We will be making recommendations with any policy changes to KMGA's Executive Committee in the coming months.

Kansas AG Lawsuit

As we shared with you earlier, the Kansas Attorney General has filed suit against Macquarie Energy related to the February 2021 Winter storm seeking redress under the Commodity Exchange Act. The claim is that Macquarie manipulated the Southern Star daily gas index for February 17, 2021, for the benefit of Macquarie. The estimated damages to Kansas consumers (KMGA, Atmos Energy, Kansas Gas Service & Black Hills) is \$50 million.

There isn't anything additional to report to date, but we will continue to work with our legal counsel to monitor this case and keep you updated with any developments.

Regional Meetings

Last year we held four regional meetings across the state. We believe these meetings were very beneficial to both our members and KMGA. We are currently working on dates/times/locations for regional meetings in 2023. We will get our schedule out to you as soon as we have that completed.

- 2. **Building Repairs** TW Construction completed the repairs on the Utility building behind 501 S Huston.

- 4. **Police** Michael Shields attended the Kansas Narcotics Officers Association training.

- **K.S.A. 75-4319.** Closed or executive meetings; conditions; authorized subjects for discussion; binding action prohibited; certain documents identified in meetings not subject to disclosure. (a) Upon formal motion made, seconded and carried, all bodies and agencies subject to the open meetings act may recess, but not adjourn, open meetings for closed or executive meetings. Any motion to recess for a closed or executive meeting shall include a statement of (1) the justification for closing the meeting, (2) the subjects to be discussed during the closed or executive meeting and (3) the time and place at which the open meeting shall resume. Such motion, including the required statement, shall be recorded in the minutes of the meeting and shall be maintained as a part of the permanent records of the body or agency. Discussion during the closed or executive meeting shall be limited to those subjects stated in the motion.
- (b) No subjects shall be discussed at any closed or executive meeting, except the following:
- (1) Personnel matters of nonelected personnel;
- (2) consultation with an attorney for the body or agency which would be deemed privileged in the attorney-client relationship;
- (3) matters relating to employer-employee negotiations whether or not in consultation with the representative or representatives of the body or agency;
- (4) confidential data relating to financial affairs or trade secrets of corporations, partnerships, trusts, and individual proprietorships;
- (5) matters relating to actions adversely or favorably affecting a person as a student, patient or resident of a public institution, except that any such person shall have the right to a public hearing if requested by the person;
- (6) preliminary discussions relating to the acquisition of real property;
