1. 3rd Street Sidewalk

- Submitted Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) on 11/15/23. HR Green was notified on February 29 that the \$115,000 requested funding was approved.
- Submitted Statewide TA Set-Aside application on 11/27/2023 for the Safe Routes to School (SRTS) sidewalk and trail extension. On 04/09/24 the DOT announced approved funding of \$650,000 for the 3rd Street Sidewalk Extension Project.
- Submitted Regional TA- Set-Aside application on 02/16/2024 for the planning, design, and construction of on- and off-road facilities for pedestrians, bicyclists, and other non-motorized forms of transportation in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. I was notified by the ECICOG on 03/27/24 that the project has been recommended for approval. A funding summary will be provided to the City soon.
- Concept sidewalk/trail alignment and opinion of construction cost have been updated per the changes discussed at the 10/10/23 Public Meeting.
- Continued coordination for the proposed alignment/pedestrian crossing at the interchange with lowa DOT
- Preparation for grant applications:
 - Speed Feedback Signs Program

Action Items: Availability of a local match to be approved by the City via resolution. Award letters and funding agreements will be sent to the City.

2. Sidewalk Program

Submitted draft Sidewalk Inspection Guidelines and policy.

Action Items: Met with City staff to gather feedback on 6/21/23. On hold until further direction from the City is provided. HR Green has provided recommendations and costs to perform a City-wide survey of existing sidewalk and ADA ramp conditions to provide information necessary to propose a fair implementation plan and schedule for the Program.

3. Cedar & Huber Reconstruction

- Final plans, OPC, and temporary construction easement provided to the City on 9/11/23.
- IDNR water and sanitary permit drafts complete.
- Bidding and construction schedule to be determined based on the alley sewer project and available budget.

4. Well 7 siting study

- Met with the City and new school superintendent to discuss the proposed future well location.

Action Items: Waiting for direction from City staff.

5. Water Treatment Plant Disinfection – Liquid Chlorine (bleach)

- HR Green reviewing Contractor submittals
- Shaffer Plumbing has completed most of the demolition work in the existing chlorine gas room to make space available for new liquid feed system components.

Action Items: Temporary bleach system installed and in operation. Demolition work in progress. The construction and installation of a permanent bleach system will be completed in May 2024.

6. Sewer in Alley between Ford and N Huber

- Received construction permit from the IDNR, expired August 3, 2023; HR Green will apply for new IDNR construction permit when all easements have been obtained.
- Bidding schedule TBD (after homeowners sign all easement documents).
- City Staff, HR Green, and the City Attorney met on 10/26/23. It was determined that the City
 would reach out to all affected property owners to obtain signatures on updated documents and
 distribute checks for completed acquisition and easement agreements. The City Attorney will
 pursue eminent domain for the remaining properties.
- The City mailed letters to residents in February 2024, requesting homeowners to visit City Hall to sign the agreements and collect compensation.

Action Items: City staff to obtain signatures on updated acquisition and easement documents, provide payment to property owners who have provided signatures, and coordinate with the City Attorney to pursue eminent domain as needed. City Council to approve initiation of the eminent domain process for any outstanding properties.

7. City GIS

- Cemetery Mapping Project
 - Work is ongoing on updating Headstones and Plots.
- Lead Service Line Inventory
 - o Steve and Robert to roll out the Survey to residents.
- Fire Department Map
 - O HR Green will be sending out a field person to GPS fire hydrants in town to get a more accurate location. Once this mapping is completed, a map will be reviewed for accuracy and then printed for the Fire Department. We have a tentative plan to send out a field person to map these in April or May. Depending on the progress with LSLI, this could get pushed until after May.

8. Dillon Military Bridge

- Established ownership 50/50 with Jones County and the City according to the current 28E agreement.
- Discussed potential funding of repair or replacement with Mary Rump at ECICOG. Identified available STBG funds available for bridge repairs. Mary Rump has recommended that this funding NOT be used for pedestrian bridges.
- Developed a preliminary opinion of construction cost for a new pedestrian bridge for comparison to possible rehabilitation construction cost of the bridge.
- Requested historical plans from the Iowa DOT and inspection reports from Origin Design neither have been provided to date.

Action Items: HRG has provided a proposal for City Council consideration to provide a secure, safe inspection of the bridge to determine if rehabilitation is possible or if relocation to the bank adjacent to the river is necessary for its preservation and use as part of a future trail network.

Amanda and Matt McWherter, property owners at Riverside Cemetery (Block K, Lot 3, Plots 2, 3, & 4, and Block K, Lot 4, Plot 1) seek approval for placement of a simple bench monument on Block K, Lot 4, Plot 1. Their son Adam, who died January 20th of this year, was laid to rest in Block K, Lot 3, Plot 4.

It is a traditional bench seat with 2 legs and is 48" long by 14" front to back. They would like to install it on a large concrete foundation 96" x 36", which would cover the entire plot, giving the bench excellent stability, and lending itself to protection from mishaps from wildlife and/or cemetery maintenance. The concrete would be 6" thick, and with postholes, would be level even if the ground has a grade variation.

Work would be done, in a timely fashion, by the Brannon Monument Company of Dubuque, IA, who would subcontract the concrete work with Ben Capron. The cost of the granite bench would be in the \$2500 range, plus the cost of detailed etchings per their choices. The concrete foundation would be in the \$750 range. These costs would be the sole responsibility of the McWherters.

Attached is HR Green's proposal for the inspection of and relocation of the Dillon Military Bridge. The way that HR Green's costs break down, the administration and work association with the bridge inspection and analysis is \$20,000.00. The cost associated with the sub-contractor, Modjeski & Masters to perform the inspection is \$40,300 for a total of \$60,300 for the inspection and analysis. The remaining amount of \$21,054.90 is associated with the conceptual design to relocate the bridge. This work will not commence without approval from Anamosa, after the bridge inspection is complete and direction to move forward with Rehabilitation in-place (Option 1) or Relocation (Option 2). This amount was added into the agreement for conceptual design in hopes that it would keep the project moving forward with either Option as details for the final design are coordinated. 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THIS **AGREEMENT** is between <u>The City of Anamosa</u> (hereafter "CLIENT") and HR GREEN, INC. (hereafter "COMPANY").

1.0 Project Understanding

1.1 General Understanding

The purpose of this project is to inspect and analyze the existing conditions of the former Military (Cemetery) Road Bridge to determine if it can remain in-place and be used as a pedestrian bridge or be relocated adjacent to the river and be used as part of a future trail network.

1.2 Design Criteria/Assumptions

The project will follow relative AASHTO design standards and Federal Highway Administration Bridge Inspection practices.

2.0 Scope of Services

The CLIENT agrees to employ COMPANY to perform the following services:

Task A – Project Management and Administration

The work tasks to be performed under Project Management and Administration shall consist of the following:

A.1 Development of Project Instructions, Schedule, and Detailed Work Plan

Prepare written instructions for project staff. Provide background, names of contacts, communications procedures, responsibilities, schedule and budget information, and other important elements for the project. Establish a graphic project schedule indicating critical dates, milestones, and deliverables. Prepare a detailed work plan with specific staff assignments, by task, corresponding to the schedule.

A.2 Project Monitoring and Progress Reports

Maintain the system for monitoring progress and expenditures to allow monthly tracking by task. Prepare and submit monthly progress reports outlining the following:

- Activities during the reporting period,
- Activities planned for the following period,
- Problems encountered and recommended solutions,
- · Overall status, and
- Billing summary of percent spent, percent completed, and scheduled percent completed.

It is assumed two (2) reports will be prepared for this contract. This task includes reviewing the project schedule, budget and status with senior management at two (2) month intervals.



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A.3 Project Management

The project manager for the Consultant will be responsible for general coordination with the Client regarding project activities, meetings, invoicing, and deliverables. This task includes interoffice administration and coordination of the project including periodic interoffice meetings, which will be attended by the project manager and task managers, as well as general day-to-day administrative tasks.

- Prepare meeting minutes and action items,
- · Track progress, monitor and maintain monthly project schedules,
- · Distribution of plans and coordination of responses,
- · Notifications as needed, and
- · Billing.

Task B - Bridge Analysis

B.1 Bridge Inspection

The first step in the process will be to complete a bridge inspection, performed by Modjeski and Masters, to determine the existing conditions of the structure for the purpose of completing an engineering analysis of it. This will help the CLIENT determine the best course of action for the bridge. Scope and fee detail can be provided upon request.

B.2 Bridge Analysis and Technical Memorandum

It is anticipated the COMPANY will evaluate the following two options:

- 1. Rehabilitate the existing truss to allow it to remain in-place and continue being used by pedestrians.
- 2. Relocate the existing truss adjacent to the north side of river to be incorporated into a future trail project.

The COMPANY will analyze the bridge by creating a mathematical model of the existing truss in a structural analysis program. This will be used to evaluate both options listed above, accounting for the existing condition of the truss as reported, and aid in determining if any rehabilitation of the existing truss is necessary.

The COMPANY will provide an opinion of cost for both options. The cost for Option 2 will include relocation costs (crane rental and labor) and the cost for a new foundation for the truss to be set on.

The COMPANY will develop a brief technical memorandum summarizing the estimated costs and any other qualitative advantages or disadvantages associated with each option. COMPANY will submit the memo to the CLIENT for review and address any comments or be available to answer questions to help the CLIENT select a preferred course of action.

B.3 – Bridge Relocation Option



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If Option 2 is selected, the COMPANY will perform the following tasks to allow for the truss to be relocated:

Determine Feasible Pick Points – the COMPANY will use the mathematical model created to determine potential points where the truss can be lifted from during the relocation process. A design detail will be developed that identifies feasible pick points for the Contractor.

Analyze New Support Condition – COMPANY anticipates providing foundation supports under each of the truss's nodes, where horizontal, vertical, and/or diagonal members intersect. The new support condition will alter the members forces/stresses as compared to the existing support condition. COMPANY will utilize the same mathematical model to determine the new member forces.

Conceptual Foundation Costs – COMPANY will identify potential foundation types for cost estimating purposes. Anticipated options include drilled shafts and spread footings. Approximate quantities will be estimated for the most feasible option.

COMPANY will develop a detailed Opinion of Probable cost for the truss foundation and associated grading, utilizing standard bid items and historical bid data.

Task C – Concept Design - Schematic Plan Preparation

The Consultant will perform schematic design services including the preparation of schematic design plans. Plan preparation shall conform to SUDAS procedures. Schematic plans will only be submitted to the Client and include:

C.1 Title Sheet (A sheet)

The title sheet will include the following: Index of Sheets, Mileage Summary, Legend, Location Map, Project Number, and Design Designation.

C.2 Estimate of Quantities (C Sheets)

Determine bid items to be included in the project, along with their appropriate tabulations.

C.3 Plan Sheets (D Sheets)

Schematic geometry plans for proposed bridge relocation. Includes utilizing available base mapping information and existing right of way/easements to develop a proposed site plan and any surface preparation needed to relocate the bridge. This site plan will include a railing to protect the existing abutment to remain in place from pedestrians.

C.4 Conceptual Opinion of Probable Cost

Prepare a schematic Opinion of Probable Construction Cost. Preliminary construction cost opinions shall be based on schematic estimated quantities for major construction items. Detailed quantity takeoffs will not be developed for the preliminary construction cost opinion. Other construction items such as erosion control and mobilization will be estimated based on historical percentages of total construction costs.

Construction cost opinions will be submitted with the Schematic Plans.



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C.5 Site Visits

The conceptual design of this project will be completed using aerial imagery of the highest quality available in conjunction with a site visit from the consultant by two (2) staff members. The visit to the site will enable the Consultant to review aerial imagery against existing conditions to note discrepancies with the aerial photographs where it impacts the site plan.

Task D - Permitting and Utility Needs Review

D.1 Permit Needs

Identify the permits and approvals that will be required prior to any construction work beginning. Examples include:

- USACE Section 408 permit for new construction on levee
- SHPO/Section 106

D.2 Utility Needs

Investigation of existing utilities within the site and understanding what can stay in place or needs to be relocated through lowa ONE Call locates.

3.0 Deliverables and Schedules Included in this Agreement

The expected deliverable include:

- Bridge Inspection Report
- Bridge Analysis Technical Memorandum
- Conceptual Design and Schematic for Option 2, Bridge Relocation

After notice to proceed, we will schedule the inspection with our Subconsultant. After inspection is planned, we will complete the work on the following schedule:

- Inspection Report completed three (3) weeks after inspection starts.
- Bridge Analysis Technical Memorandum completed (3) weeks after receipt of Inspection Report.
- Concept Design, Permitting, and Utility Needs will be completed (4) weeks after concurrence on Bridge Analysis Technical Memorandum

This schedule was prepared to include reasonable allowances for review and approval times required by the CLIENT and public authorities having jurisdiction over the project. This schedule shall be equitably adjusted as the project progresses, allowing for changes in the scope of the project requested by the CLIENT or for delays or other causes beyond the control of COMPANY.

4.0 Items not included in Agreement/Supplemental Services

The following items are not included as part of this AGREEMENT:

Final Project Design / Construction Plan Preparation



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- Topographic Survey
- Real Estate Services (e.g. title searches, appraisals, appraisal reviews, negotiations, acquisitions and closings).
- Eminent Domain / Condemnation Services
- Hazardous Materials Investigations and Testing
- Soil Management and Mitigation Plans
- Private Utility Relocation Design and Plan Preparation
- Bidding Assistance
- Construction Observation
- Construction Survey
- Verification Testing Services
- Environmental and Cultural Resource Services
- Existing Truss and Abutment Rehabilitation Details
- Hydraulic Analysis
- Preparation of Permit Applications
- Geotechnical investigation and final foundation design. Permitting and approvals may impact foundation types and details.
- · Regional Trail design
- Replacement Pedestrian Bridge Design
- Historic monumentation

Supplemental services not included in the AGREEMENT can be provided by COMPANY under separate agreement, if desired.

5.0 Services by Others

As stated above, Modjeski and Masters will be the subconsultant providing bridge inspection services. There scope and fee are attached.

6.0 Client Responsibilities

The CLIENT will provide access to the site and any past information associated with the bridge or site.

7.0 Professional Services Fee

7.1 Fees

The fee for services will be based on COMPANY standard hourly rates current at the time the AGREEMENT is signed. These standard hourly rates are subject to change upon 30 days' written notice. Non-salary expenses directly attributable to the project such as: (1) living and traveling expenses of employees when away from the home office on business connected with the project; (2) identifiable communication expenses; (3) identifiable reproduction costs applicable to the work; and (4) outside services will be charged in accordance with the rates current at the time the service is done.



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7.2 Invoices

Invoices for COMPANY's services shall be submitted, on a monthly basis. Invoices shall be due and payable upon receipt. If any invoice is not paid within 30 days, COMPANY may, without waiving any claim or right against the CLIENT, and without liability whatsoever to the CLIENT, suspend or terminate the performance of services. The retainer shall be credited on the final invoice. Accounts unpaid 30 days after the invoice date may be subject to a monthly service charge of 1.5% (or the maximum legal rate) on the unpaid balance. In the event that any portion of an account remains unpaid 60 days after the billing, COMPANY may institute collection action and the CLIENT shall pay all costs of collection, including reasonable attorneys' fees.

7.3 Extra Services

Any service required but not included as part of this AGREEMENT shall be considered extra services. Extra services will be billed on a Time and Material basis with prior approval of the CLIENT.

7.4 Exclusion

This fee does not include attendance at any meetings or public hearings other than those specifically listed in the Scope of Services. These service items are considered extra and are billed separately on an hourly basis.

7.5 Not Used

7.6 Payment

The CLIENT AGREES to pay COMPANY on the following basis:

Time and material basis with a Not to Exceed fee of \$81,354.90.

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8.0 Terms and Conditions

The following Terms and Conditions are incorporated into this AGREEMENT and made a part of it.

8.1 Standard of Care

Services provided by COMPANY under this AGREEMENT will be performed in a manner consistent with that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the same profession currently practicing at the same time and in the same or similar locality.

8.2 Entire Agreement

This AGREEMENT and its attachments constitute the entire understanding between CLIENT and COMPANY relating to COMPANY's services. Any prior or contemporaneous agreements, promises, negotiations, or representations not expressly set forth herein are of no effect. Subsequent modifications or amendments to this AGREEMENT shall be in writing and signed by the parties to this AGREEMENT. If the CLIENT, its officers, agents, or employees request COMPANY to perform extra services pursuant to this AGREEMENT, CLIENT will pay for the additional services even though an additional written agreement is not issued or signed.

8.3 Time Limit and Commencement of Services

This AGREEMENT must be executed within ninety (90) days to be accepted under the terms set forth herein. The services will be commenced immediately upon receipt of this signed AGREEMENT.

8.4 Suspension of Services

If the Project or the COMPANY'S services are suspended by the CLIENT for more than thirty (30) calendar days, consecutive or in the aggregate, over the term of this AGREEMENT, the COMPANY shall be compensated for all services performed and reimbursable expenses incurred prior to the receipt of notice of suspension. In addition, upon resumption of services, the CLIENT shall compensate the COMPANY for expenses incurred as a result of the suspension and resumption of its services, and the COMPANY'S schedule and fees for the remainder of the Project shall be equitably adjusted.

If the COMPANY'S services are suspended for more than ninety (90) days, consecutive or in the aggregate, the COMPANY may terminate this AGREEMENT upon giving not less than five (5) calendar days' written notice to the CLIENT.

If the CLIENT is in breach of this AGREEMENT, the COMPANY may suspend performance of services upon five (5) calendar days' notice to the CLIENT. The COMPANY shall have no liability to the CLIENT, and the CLIENT agrees to make no claim for any delay or damage as a result of such suspension caused by any breach of this AGREEMENT by the CLIENT. Upon receipt of payment in full of all outstanding sums due from the CLIENT, or curing of such other breach which caused the COMPANY to suspend services, the COMPANY shall resume services and there shall be an equitable adjustment to the remaining project schedule and fees as a result of the suspension.

8.5 Books and Accounts

COMPANY will maintain books and accounts of payroll costs, travel, subsistence, field, and incidental expenses for a period of five (5) years. Said books and accounts will be available at all reasonable times for examination by CLIENT at the corporate office of COMPANY during that time.

8.6 Insurance

COMPANY will maintain insurance for claims under the Worker's Compensation Laws, and from General Liability and Automobile claims for bodily injury, death, or property damage, and Professional Liability insurance caused by the negligent performance by COMPANY's employees of the functions and services required under this AGREEMENT.

8.7 Termination or Abandonment

Either party has the option to terminate this AGREEMENT. In the event of failure by the other party to perform in accordance with the terms hereof through no fault of the terminating party, then the obligation to provide further services under this AGREEMENT may be terminated upon seven (7) days' written notice. If any portion of the services is terminated or abandoned by CLIENT, the provisions of this Schedule of Fees and Conditions in regard to compensation and payment shall apply insofar as possible to that portion of the services not



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terminated or abandoned. If said termination occurs prior to completion of any phase of the project, the fee for services performed during such phase shall be based on COMPANY's reasonable estimate of the portion of such phase completed prior to said termination, plus a reasonable amount to reimburse COMPANY for termination costs.

8.8 Waiver

COMPANY's waiver of any term, condition, or covenant or breach of any term, condition, or covenant, shall not constitute a waiver of any other term, condition, or covenant, or the breach thereof.

8.9 Severability

If any provision of this AGREEMENT is declared invalid, illegal, or incapable of being enforced by any Court of competent jurisdiction, all of the remaining provisions of this AGREEMENT shall nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and no provision shall be deemed dependent upon any other provision unless so expressed herein.

8.10 Successors and Assigns

All of the terms, conditions, and provisions hereof shall inure to the benefit of and are binding upon the parties hereto, and their respective successors and assigns, provided, however, that no assignment of this AGREEMENT shall be made without written consent of the parties to this AGREEMENT.

8.11 Third-Party Beneficiaries

Nothing contained in this AGREEMENT shall create a contractual relationship with or a cause of action in favor of a third party against either the CLIENT or the COMPANY. The COMPANY's services under this AGREEMENT are being performed solely for the CLIENT's benefit, and no other party or entity shall have any claim against the COMPANY because of this AGREEMENT or the performance or nonperformance of services hereunder. The CLIENT and COMPANY agree to require a similar provision in all contracts with contractors, subcontractors, sub-consultants, vendors and other entities involved in this project to carry out the intent of this provision.

8.12 Governing Law and Jurisdiction

The CLIENT and the COMPANY agree that this AGREEMENT and any legal actions concerning its validity, interpretation and performance shall be governed by the laws of the State of Iowa without regard to any conflict of law provisions, which may apply the laws of other jurisdictions.

It is further agreed that any legal action between the CLIENT and the COMPANY arising out of this AGREEMENT or the performance of the services shall be brought in a court of competent jurisdiction in the State of lowa.

8.13 Dispute Resolution

Mediation. In an effort to resolve any conflicts that arise during the design or construction of the project or following the completion of the project, the CLIENT and COMPANY agree that all disputes between them arising out of or relating to this AGREEMENT shall be submitted to non-binding mediation unless the parties mutually agree otherwise. The CLIENT and COMPANY further agree to include a similar mediation provision in all agreements with independent contractors and consultants retained for the project and to require all independent contractors and consultants also to include a similar mediation provision in all agreements with subcontractors, sub-consultants, suppliers or fabricators so retained, thereby providing for mediation as the primary method for dispute resolution between the parties to those agreements.

8.14 Attorney's Fees

If litigation arises for purposes of collecting fees or expenses due under this AGREEMENT, the Court in such litigation shall award reasonable costs and expenses, including attorney fees, to the party justly entitled thereto. In awarding attorney fees, the Court shall not be bound by any Court fee schedule, but shall, in the interest of justice, award the full amount of costs, expenses, and attorney fees paid or incurred in good faith.

8.15 Ownership of Instruments of Service

All reports, plans, specifications, field data, field notes, laboratory test data, calculations, estimates and other documents including all documents on electronic media prepared by COMPANY as instruments of service shall remain the property of COMPANY. COMPANY shall retain these records for a period of five (5) years following



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completion/submission of the records, during which period they will be made available to the CLIENT at all reasonable times.

8.16 Reuse of Documents

All project documents including, but not limited to, plans and specifications furnished by COMPANY under this project are intended for use on this project only. Any reuse, without specific written verification or adoption by COMPANY, shall be at the CLIENT's sole risk, and CLIENT shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless COMPANY from all claims, damages and expenses including attorneys' fees arising out of or resulting therefrom.

Under no circumstances shall delivery of electronic files for use by the CLIENT be deemed a sale by the COMPANY, and the COMPANY makes no warranties, either express or implied, of merchantability and fitness for any particular purpose. In no event shall the COMPANY be liable for indirect or consequential damages as a result of the CLIENT's use or reuse of the electronic files.

8.17 Failure to Abide by Design Documents or To Obtain Guidance

The CLIENT agrees that it would be unfair to hold COMPANY liable for problems that might occur should COMPANY'S plans, specifications or design intents not be followed, or for problems resulting from others' failure to obtain and/or follow COMPANY'S guidance with respect to any errors, omissions, inconsistencies, ambiguities or conflicts which are detected or alleged to exist in or as a consequence of implementing COMPANY'S plans, specifications or other instruments of service. Accordingly, the CLIENT waives any claim against COMPANY, and agrees to defend, indemnify and hold COMPANY harmless from any claim for injury or losses that results from failure to follow COMPANY'S plans, specifications or design intent, or for failure to obtain and/or follow COMPANY'S guidance with respect to any alleged errors, omissions, inconsistencies, ambiguities or conflicts contained within or arising as a result of implementing COMPANY'S plans, specifications or other instruments of service. The CLIENT also agrees to compensate COMPANY for any time spent and expenses incurred remedying CLIENT's failures according to COMPANY'S prevailing fee schedule and expense reimbursement policy.

8.18 Opinion of Probable Construction Cost

As part of the Deliverables, COMPANY may submit to the CLIENT an opinion of probable cost required to construct work recommended, designed, or specified by COMPANY, if required by CLIENT. COMPANY is not a construction cost estimator or construction contractor, nor should COMPANY'S rendering an opinion of probable construction costs be considered equivalent to the nature and extent of service a construction cost estimator or construction contractor would provide. This requires COMPANY to make a number of assumptions as to actual conditions that will be encountered on site; the specific decisions of other design professionals engaged; the means and methods of construction the contractor will employ; the cost and extent of labor, equipment and materials the contractor will employ; contractor's techniques in determining prices and market conditions at the time, and other factors over which COMPANY has no control. Given the assumptions which must be made, COMPANY cannot guarantee the accuracy of its opinions of cost, and in recognition of that fact, the CLIENT waives any claim against COMPANY relative to the accuracy of COMPANY'S opinion of probable construction cost.

8.19 Design Information in Electronic Form

Because electronic file information can be easily altered, corrupted, or modified by other parties, either intentionally or inadvertently, without notice or indication, COMPANY reserves the right to remove itself from its ownership and/or involvement in the material from each electronic medium not held in its possession. CLIENT shall retain copies of the work performed by COMPANY in electronic form only for information and use by CLIENT for the specific purpose for which COMPANY was engaged. Said material shall not be used by CLIENT or transferred to any other party, for use in other projects, additions to this project, or any other purpose for which the material was not strictly intended by COMPANY without COMPANY's express written permission. Any unauthorized use or reuse or modifications of this material shall be at CLIENT'S sole risk. Furthermore, the CLIENT agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold COMPANY harmless from all claims, injuries, damages, losses, expenses, and attorneys' fees arising out of the modification or reuse of these materials.

The CLIENT recognizes that designs, plans, and data stored on electronic media including, but not limited to computer disk, magnetic tape, or files transferred via email, may be subject to undetectable alteration and/or uncontrollable deterioration. The CLIENT, therefore, agrees that COMPANY shall not be liable for the completeness or accuracy of any materials provided on electronic media after a 30-day inspection period, during



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which time COMPANY shall correct any errors detected by the CLIENT to complete the design in accordance with the intent of the contract and specifications. After 40 days, at the request of the CLIENT, COMPANY shall submit a final set of sealed drawings, and any additional services to be performed by COMPANY relative to the submitted electronic materials shall be subject to separate agreement. The CLIENT is aware that differences may exist between the electronic files delivered and the printed hard-copy construction documents. In the event of a conflict between the signed construction documents prepared by the COMPANY and electronic files, the signed or sealed hard-copy construction documents shall govern.

8.20 Information Provided by Others

The CLIENT shall furnish, at the CLIENT's expense, all information, requirements, reports, data, surveys and instructions required by this AGREEMENT. The COMPANY may use such information, requirements, reports, data, surveys and instructions in performing its services and is entitled to rely upon the accuracy and completeness thereof. The COMPANY shall not be held responsible for any errors or omissions that may arise as a result of erroneous or incomplete information provided by the CLIENT and/or the CLIENT's consultants and contractors.

COMPANY is not responsible for accuracy of any plans, surveys or information of any type including electronic media prepared by any other consultants, etc. provided to COMPANY for use in preparation of plans. The CLIENT agrees, to the fullest extent permitted by law, to indemnify and hold harmless the COMPANY from any damages, liabilities, or costs, including reasonable attorneys' fees and defense costs, arising out of or connected in any way with the services performed by other consultants engaged by the CLIENT.

COMPANY is not responsible for accuracy of topographic surveys provided by others. A field check of a topographic survey provided by others will not be done under this AGREEMENT unless indicated in the Scope of Services.

8.21 Force Majeure

The CLIENT agrees that the COMPANY is not responsible for damages arising directly or indirectly from any delays for causes beyond the COMPANY's control. CLIENT agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold COMPANY, its consultants, agents, and employees harmless from any and all liability, other than that caused by the negligent acts, errors, or omissions of COMPANY, arising out of or resulting from the same. For purposes of this AGREEMENT, such causes include, but are not limited to, strikes or other labor disputes; severe weather disruptions or other natural disasters or acts of God; fires, riots, war or other emergencies; disease epidemic or pandemic; failure of any government agency to act in a timely manner; failure of performance by the CLIENT or the CLIENT'S contractors or consultants; or discovery of any hazardous substances or differing site conditions. Severe weather disruptions include but are not limited to extensive rain, high winds, snow greater than two (2) inches and ice. In addition, if the delays resulting from any such causes increase the cost or time required by the COMPANY to perform its services in an orderly and efficient manner, the COMPANY shall be entitled to a reasonable adjustment in schedule and compensation.

8.22 Job Site Visits and Safety

Neither the professional activities of COMPANY, nor the presence of COMPANY'S employees and subconsultants at a construction site, shall relieve the general contractor and any other entity of their obligations, duties and responsibilities including, but not limited to, construction means, methods, sequence, techniques or procedures necessary for performing, superintending or coordinating all portions of the work of construction in accordance with the contract documents and any health or safety precautions required by any regulatory agencies. COMPANY and its personnel have no authority to exercise any control over any construction contractor or other entity or their employees in connection with their work or any health or safety precautions. The CLIENT agrees that the general contractor is solely responsible for job site safety, and warrants that this intent shall be made evident in the CLIENT's AGREEMENT with the general contractor. The CLIENT also agrees that the CLIENT, COMPANY and COMPANY'S consultants shall be indemnified and shall be made additional insureds on the general contractor's and all subcontractor's general liability policies on a primary and non-contributory basis.

8.23 Hazardous Materials

CLIENT hereby understands and agrees that COMPANY has not created nor contributed to the creation or existence of any or all types of hazardous or toxic wastes, materials, chemical compounds, or substances, or any other type of environmental hazard or pollution, whether latent or patent, at CLIENT's premises, or in connection with or related to this project with respect to which COMPANY has been retained to provide



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professional services. The compensation to be paid COMPANY for said professional services is in no way commensurate with, and has not been calculated with reference to, the potential risk of injury or loss which may be caused by the exposure of persons or property to such substances or conditions. Therefore, to the fullest extent permitted by law, CLIENT agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold COMPANY, its officers, directors, employees, and consultants, harmless from and against any and all claims, damages, and expenses, whether direct, indirect, or consequential, including, but not limited to, attorney fees and Court costs, arising out of, or resulting from the discharge, escape, release, or saturation of smoke, vapors, soot, fumes, acid, alkalis, toxic chemicals, liquids gases, or any other materials, irritants, contaminants, or pollutants in or into the atmosphere, or on, onto, upon, in, or into the surface or subsurface of soil, water, or watercourses, objects, or any tangible or intangible matter, whether sudden or not.

It is acknowledged by both parties that COMPANY'S Scope of Services does not include any services related to asbestos or hazardous or toxic materials. In the event COMPANY or any other party encounters asbestos or hazardous or toxic materials at the job site, or should it become known in any way that such materials may be present at the job site or any adjacent areas that may affect the performance of COMPANY'S services, COMPANY may, at its option and without liability for consequential or any other damages, suspend performance of services on the project until the CLIENT retains appropriate specialist consultant(s) or contractor(s) to identify, abate and/or remove the asbestos or hazardous or toxic materials, and warrants that the job site is in full compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

Nothing contained within this AGREEMENT shall be construed or interpreted as requiring COMPANY to assume the status of a generator, storer, transporter, treater, or disposal facility as those terms appear within the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, 42 U.S.C.A., §6901 et seq., as amended, or within any State statute governing the generation, treatment, storage, and disposal of waste.

8.24 Certificate of Merit

The CLIENT shall make no claim for professional negligence, either directly or in a third party claim, against COMPANY unless the CLIENT has first provided COMPANY with a written certification executed by an independent design professional currently practicing in the same discipline as COMPANY and licensed in the State in which the claim arises. This certification shall: a) contain the name and license number of the certifier; b) specify each and every act or omission that the certifier contends is a violation of the standard of care expected of a design professional performing professional services under similar circumstances; and c) state in complete detail the basis for the certifier's opinion that each such act or omission constitutes such a violation. This certificate shall be provided to COMPANY not less than thirty (30) calendar days prior to the presentation of any claim or the institution of any judicial proceeding.

8.25 Limitation of Liability

In recognition of the relative risks and benefits of the Project to both the CLIENT and the COMPANY, the risks have been allocated such that the CLIENT agrees, to the fullest extent permitted by law, to limit the liability of the COMPANY and COMPANY'S officers, directors, partners, employees, shareholders, owners and subconsultants for any and all claims, losses, costs, damages of any nature whatsoever or claims expenses from any cause or causes, including attorneys' fees and costs and expert witness fees and costs, so that the total aggregate liability of the COMPANY and COMPANY'S officers, directors, partners, employees, shareholders, owners and sub-consultants shall not exceed \$50,000.00, or the COMPANY'S total fee for services rendered on this Project, whichever is greater. It is intended that this limitation apply to any and all liability or cause of action however alleged or arising, unless otherwise prohibited by law.

8.26 Drywells, Underdrains and Other Infiltration Devices

Services provided by COMPANY under this AGREEMENT do NOT include the geotechnical design of drywells, underdrains, injection wells or any other item that may be devised for the purpose of removing water from the CLIENT'S property by infiltration into the ground. Due to the high variability of soil types and conditions such devices will not be reliable in all cases. While for this reason COMPANY does not recommend the use of these devices, in some cases their use may be necessary to obtain an adequate amount of area for development on the CLIENT'S property. Since the use of these devices is intended to enhance the value of the CLIENT'S property and, in some cases, allow development that would otherwise not be possible, the CLIENT will assume all risks inherent in the design and construction of these devices, unless the contractor or a Geotechnical Engineer assumes these risks. Typical risks include but are not limited to:

Failure to obtain the required release rate;



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- Variability of the soils encountered during construction from those encountered in soil borings. (Soils
 can vary widely over a small change in location, horizontal or vertical, particularly with regards to
 permeability);
- Failure of the device due to siltation, poor construction or changes in the water table;
- Need to obtain additional soils information (i.e. borings etc.) to evaluate the function of installed devices:
- · Reconstruction of failed or inadequate devices;
- Enlargement of detention/ retention facilities to make up for release rates that are lower than those
 used in the stormwater design, including engineering design and additional land required for such
 enlargement; and
- Regular maintenance to remove accumulated silt over the device's life span.

If the use of these devices is required COMPANY will advise the CLIENT that a Geotechnical Engineer must be retained to consult on the project. The CLIENT must enter into a separate agreement directly with this consultant. They will not be sub-contracted through COMPANY nor are their fees included as part of this AGREEMENT. COMPANY will work together with this consultant to obtain a final design. Our collaboration may include the use of a common standard detail or the creation of a new standard detail. COMPANY may make suggestions to the Geotechnical Engineer on ways to tailor these devices to meet the needs of the overall site design. The Geotechnical Engineer will evaluate these suggested details and modifications based on his experience and measured soils information to estimate the release rate for each detail considered. COMPANY may use a release rate of these devices as provided by the Geotechnical Engineer for the design of the stormwater system. This rate may be faxed to us, as a draft copy of the Geotechnical Engineers report or as a final copy of that report. In no case will COMPANY accept responsibility for the determination of the expected release rate of these devices.

If certification of the contractor's construction of these devices is required by the municipality or desired by the CLIENT a Geotechnical Engineer must also be obtained for these services. This is highly recommended in order to observe the actual soils where the devices are being constructed and to verify that the construction methods used do not violate any assumptions made by the Geotechnical Engineer during the design and evaluation of the standard detail. If a Geotechnical Engineer is not retained by the CLIENT to provide construction review, the CLIENT shall assume all risks that the devices may fail requiring additional geotechnical investigation or reconstruction and shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless COMPANY from all claims, damages and expenses including attorneys' fees arising out of or resulting therefrom. Any construction observation services provided by COMPANY shall not include these devices.

8.27 Environmental Audits/Site Assessments

Environmental Audit/Site Assessment report(s) are prepared for CLIENT's sole use. CLIENT agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold COMPANY, its consultants, agents, and employees harmless against all damages, claims, expenses, and losses arising out of or resulting from any reuse of the Environmental Audit/Site Assessment report(s) without the written authorization of COMPANY.

8.28 Not Used

It is agreed that the professional services of COMPANY are limited to a review and observation of the work of the contractor to ascertain that such work is proceeding in general accordance with the contract documents and that such contract documents have not been prepared by the COMPANY. Unless otherwise stated, the CLIENT warrants that any documents provided to COMPANY by the CLIENT or by the prior consultant may be relied upon as to their accuracy and completeness without independent investigation by the successor consultant and that the CLIENT has the right to provide such documents to COMPANY free of any claims of copyright or patent infringement or violation of any other party's rights in intellectual property. It is further agreed that the CLIENT will defend, indemnify and hold harmless COMPANY from any claim or suit whatsoever, including all payments, expenses or costs, arising from or alleged to have arisen from an error or omission in the plans, specifications or contract documents. COMPANY agrees to be responsible for its employees own negligent acts, errors or omissions in the performance of their professional services.

8.29 Design Without Construction Observation

It is agreed that the professional services of COMPANY do not extend to or include the review or site observation of the contractor's work or performance and the CLIENT assumes all responsibility for interpretation of the contract documents and for construction observation. It is further agreed that the CLIENT will defend, indemnify
