STATEMENT OF COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS December 14, 2020

The City Council of the City of Anamosa met in Regular Session December 14, 2020 at the Anamosa Library and Learning Center and via Zoom at 6:00 p.m. with Mayor Rod Smith presiding. The following Council Members were present: John Machart, Rich Crump (via Zoom), Jeff Stout (via Zoom), Kay Smith, Alan Zumbach, and Galen Capron. Absent: none. Also present were Beth Brincks, City Administrator/Clerk; Rebecca Vernon, Library Director. Due to the restrictions on public gatherings, the public utilized Zoom to participate in the meeting from their homes. Iowa Code Chapter 21, as interpreted, permits public meetings to be held electronically.

Mayor Rod Smith called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Roll call was taken with a quorum present. All votes will be called as roll votes.

Pledge of Allegiance.

Director Vernon gave some brief instructions on use of Zoom and how to participate in the meeting.

Motion by Smith, Second by Zumbach to approve the agenda. Ayes: all. Nays: none. Motion carried.

Motion by Zumbach, second by Machart to approve the minutes of the November 23, 2020 Regular City Council meeting. Ayes: all. Nays: none. Motion carried.

The Mayor opened the Public Hearing on a proposal to enter into Loan Agreement #1 in a principal amount not to exceed \$250,000 for funding economic development grants for downtown property improvements at 6:03pm.

No written or verbal comments were made at the meeting or received prior to the meeting. There being no further objections, comments, or evidence offered, Council Member Smith moved to close the hearing, second by Capron. Ayes: all. Nays: none. Motion carried.

The Mayor opened the Public Hearing on a proposal to enter into Loan Agreement #2 in a principal amount not to exceed \$700,000 for constructing, furnishing and equipping municipal police facilities at 6:04pm.

No written or verbal comments were made at the meeting or received prior to the meeting. There being no further objections, comments, or evidence offered, Council Member Machart moved to close the hearing, second by Stout. Ayes: all. Nays: none. Motion carried.

The Mayor opened the Public Hearing on a proposal to enter into Loan Agreement #4 in a principal amount not to exceed \$100,000 for planning, design and constructing of street and highway improvements at 6:07pm.

Tim Wallace of Snyder and Associates presented an overview of current engineering projects. Project cost estimates were given at approximately 8 million dollars. Council discussed future development and costs. Other options for a frontage road were also discussed. Bryce Ricklefs gave his views and interests in the project.

Motion by Crump, second by Zumbach to approve leaving the current outside agency funding as approve by Resolution 2020-11 on March 9, 2020. Ayes: all. Nays: none. Motion carried.

Motion by Crump, second by Machart to approve the City of Anamosa Procurement Policy as required for Federal Grant Funds. Ayes: all. Nays: none. Motion carried.

Motion by Smith, second by Zumbach to approve Resolution 2020-76 hiring and setting the salary for the Street Superintendent. Roll vote. Ayes: Machart, Zumbach, Crump, Smith, Stout, and Capron. Nays: none. Motion carried.

Motion by Crump, second by Capron to approve the November 2020 Treasurer's Report as presented. Ayes: all. Nays: none. Motion carried.

Motion by Smith, to approve the current bills, second by Zumbach. Ayes: all. Nays: none. Motion carried.

City Administrators Report: Brincks reported the new City website has been launched. Working on budget worksheets. City Clerk ad has been run and posted. May have a request for a special meeting to interview candidates.

Mayor and Council Reports: The Mayor made a statement about shopping local and supporting local businesses. Downtown decorations are very impressive. He also gave an update of the last Hometown Pride meeting and current activities downtown.

Smith informed everyone about the Park and Rec Department fund raiser.

Stout reported that the Park and Rec Board has not met. The Tree Walk was being held

virtually this year. Director Vernon gave directions to view the Tree Walk. Capron reported that the solid waste commission meeting was fairly routine.

Machart reported that emergency management is still seeing PPE shortages.

DESCRIPTION OF ADDITIONAL SERVICES:						
The original soil borings performed onsite indicated that the subsurface conditions are not ideal for the proposed flow equalization basin. These conditions consisted of deep bed rock, unsuitable backfill, and abandoned structures. Due to these conditions, additional geotechnical services were required at the original site to determine the full extent of the subsurface conditions. After the original geotechnical services were conducted, the City had the opportunity to purchase land adjacent to the plant that potentially is better suited for a flow equalization tank. To accommodate this new location requires geotechnical investigation of subsurface conditions, surveying the new area, and some minor adjustments to the approved facility plan. This supplemental agreement includes fees for the additional geotechnical investigations, surveying the new property, electrical service and design services associated with new site, and adjustments to the approved facility plan and associated permits.




