

The Derby: Evolving to Serve for the Next 100 Years

Established in 1922 by renowned jockey George Woolf, The Derby has long been a beloved fine dining destination in Arcadia. Its iconic red booths, cozy fireplaces, and walls adorned with thoroughbred art and memorabilia have drawn guests in year after year. However, behind its charming facade lies a challenge: the building was never equipped to handle the high number of patrons it serves daily. Those visiting during peak hours often endure long wait times, while staff grapple with space constraints due to an unconventional layout. Over time, the wear and tear of the building has been heightened by factors like smoke, grease, and water damage.

Setbacks & Successes

From his humble beginnings as a busboy to assuming ownership in 2007, Dustin Nicolarsen's dedication to preserving The Derby's legacy has remained steadfast.

"The Derby holds a really special place within our community, and I had a very specific list of duties from the previous owner to protect the history of the restaurant," said Dustin. "There are thousands of different dining options in the San Gabriel Valley, and getting our guests to return to us over and over is something that we're incredibly grateful for."

Dustin has invested heavily in remodeling the space since becoming the owner. However, the onset of the pandemic created significant challenges. With the abrupt shutdown of indoor dining, there was an immediate loss of revenue. Unexpectedly, a local news segment brought much-needed attention to the business. In response, guests rallied behind the restaurant by purchasing gift certificates. Notably, one generous individual bought \$15,000 worth, demonstrating a remarkable show of support to keep the restaurant afloat during trying times.

Fueled by the support of the community, Dustin pursued various avenues to secure The Derby's future. Repeatedly, traditional banks cited the building's condition as a barrier to receiving financial assistance, but they acknowledged its land value. Ultimately, a strategic partnership was formed with an individual who shared an understanding of The Derby's significance, leading to the necessary funding for the restaurant's next chapter.

The Derby Mixed-Use Project

In December 2023, the Arcadia City Council approved The Derby Mixed-Use Project. This project will require demolishing The Derby's current building and constructing a new, expanded version. In its place will be a mixed-use development, consisting of a six-story building, with 214 residential units and three restaurants. Of the 214 units, nine will be dedicated as affordable units for seniors. The new 3,300 square feet restaurant has been designed to retain many of The Derby's most recognizable design elements while adding new elements such as an indoor-outdoor second-story bar and dining area.

Preserving The Derby's Charm

As part of the project review process, a detailed historical report was commissioned. Despite being a historic symbol within the community, the report concluded that the building does not hold significant historic status from a regulatory standpoint. This finding stems from the extensive modifications and expansions made to the building over the years to meet the restaurant's evolving needs.

Although The Derby will be a completely new building, prioritizing its historic charm will be the highest priority in the project. Once complete, guests arriving at the newly constructed restaurant will immediately recognize the iconic Derby and Guest Parking signage and be greeted by valet service. Inside, visitors will find a near exact replica of the original dining room, complete with the familiar red booths, fireplaces, and chimneys. The stained-glass windows will retain their distinct characteristic, incorporating reused components. Most notably, thoroughbred enthusiasts will be enthralled by the expanded area dedicated to showcasing the impressive horse racing memorabilia, which will be named "The Derby Centennial Collection."



PROTECTED TREES ON YOUR PROPERTY

Trees are essential to the unique character and charm of Arcadia and the City has long prioritized the preservation of oaks, sycamores, and mature trees. Trees enhance the City, support property values, and provide ecological resources, amongst other benefits.

The City has a **Tree Preservation Ordinance** which outlines **requirements** for the **maintenance** and, where necessary, **removal** of protected trees.

Property owners are responsible for the proper care of protected trees on their property and must receive approval from the Planning Division before removing a protected tree.

If you wish to trim or remove a tree and are unsure if the tree is protected, please call Planning staff at (626) 574-5423 or consult with a licensed arborist.

April is National Volunteers Month and the Arcadia community is fortunate to have such dedicated volunteers who contribute their time and skills to serving the city, schools, and charitable organizations!

Did you know?

The **Arcadia Police Foundation** has raised funds to sponsor crucial operations such as the K9 program. Established in 2015, the K9 Program consists of two dogs committed to protecting and serving Arcadia. K9 Kopper, a scent discrimination bloodhound, is trained to search for missing adults, children, or individuals with mental disabilities. K9 Kruz is certified in both patrol and narcotic detection duties.

In January 2024, the **Arcadia Chinese Association** hosted a fundraiser to benefit the Arcadia Fire Department Foundation. This event successfully raised \$20,000, which will be allocated towards various fire fighting training projects.

The **Friends of the Library** sponsored the Arcadia Public Library's summer reading program using funds raised from their book sales. Children, ranging from infants to 8th graders, earned virtual tickets through reading, which they redeemed for various prizes. In 2023, a total of 1,345 participants logged an impressive 693,554 reading minutes throughout the summer months!
