

2024 Getty Marrow Undergraduate Internship Program



Education and Public Engagement Internship at The Gilb Museum of Arcadia Heritage

The Gilb Museum of Arcadia Heritage has been awarded a grant from the Getty Foundation to hire one undergraduate student for a summer Education and Public Engagement Internship. The intern will receive a stipend for a ten-week, full-time internship. The internship will begin June 2024.

About the Gilb Museum

The mission of the Gilb Museum of Arcadia Heritage is to collect, preserve and recognize Arcadia's heritage; to create a shared identity for a diverse community; and to celebrate the City's rich history with exhibits and educational programs that will encourage community involvement.

Eligibility

The Getty Marrow Undergraduate Internship Program aims to increase diversity in and provide support for Los Angeles-area museums and visual arts organizations. To be eligible, individuals must be a member of a group underrepresented in careers related to museums and visual arts organizations, which can include groups defined by – among other things - socioeconomic status, cultural background, physical or other disability, geographical origin and/or any life experiences that add diverse and underrepresented perspectives. Each intern candidate must meet the following eligibility criteria: (1) they must be a currently enrolled undergraduate and have completed at least one semester of college by June 2024 (Students who graduated by April 2024 are also eligible but students who are enrolled in a second BA or BS program are not eligible); (2) they must be a resident of or attend college in Los Angeles County; and (3) they must be a United States citizen or permanent resident (non-citizen authorized to live and work in the United States on a permanent basis; also known as a "green card" holder). Students with DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrival) status valid through the internship period are also eligible.

Position Description

The Museum Education and Public Engagement internship will give interns the opportunity to gain experience in researching, program development, and in the conducting of educational programs for youth, adults, seniors, and Girl Scouts. By the end of the internship the intern will have gained skills in museum education, public speaking, lesson plan development, and volunteer management.
