Mayor Buttram opened the meeting for petitions and requests from the audience. Robert Greene, Director of Athens City Schools, stated the 2013 Report Card for Athens City Schools had been received from the Tennessee Department of Education and they ranked 1<sup>st</sup> in Math and 2<sup>nd</sup> in Reading in the Southeast District Ranking and 14<sup>th</sup> in Math and 23<sup>rd</sup> in Reading in the System State Ranking. He wanted to congratulate the teachers, administrators, staff and parents. C. David Derrick, 102 Nash Drive, stated he wanted to speak on the sales tax issue even though the item had been removed from the agenda. Mr. Derrick felt the .75% increase in sales tax was too much and a .25% increase would be more appropriate. He commented that several of his neighbors and friends had expressed their displeasure over some of the projects the City was applying for grant funding. These grants are not free and the City has to provide a certain amount of matching dollars. Mr. Derrick acknowledged revenues had not kept up with expenses but felt administrative costs were too high.
