Request Council Approval for APD Purchase for Outfitting New Vehicles

- 1. The Athens Police Department is looking to outfit the 4 new vehicles that were recently approved by council to purchase at the September 2022 council meeting via state-wide contract.
- 2. In order to outfit these new APD police interceptors, we are looking to piggyback off of a solicitation held by the University of Tennessee that was competitively bid and awarded to Trucker's Lighthouse with an amended contract extended to 2027 for their entire product line. APD has used Trucker's Lighthouse in the past for outfitting their vehicles and trust this supplier to satisfy their needs. The attached quote is for \$37,273.60.
- 3. Whereas we are authorized by statute to piggyback off a lead government agency from a bidding process in compliance with state law, we are also required to seek specific authorization by the governing body for purchases \$25,000 and above.
- 4. On behalf of the Athens Police Department, the Purchasing Division would like to request council approval for \$37,273.60, which is budgeted for this expenditure, to outfit these new vehicles.

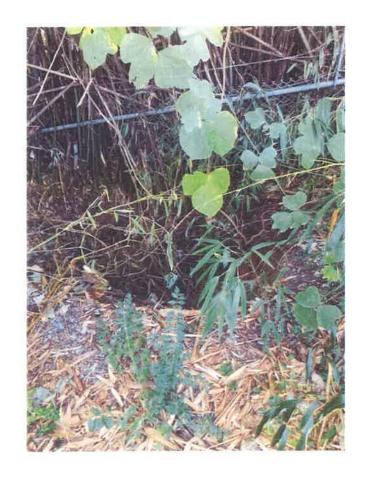

Stormwater Pipe Replacement Project

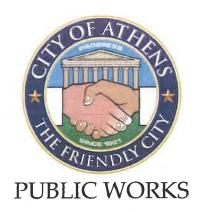
Stormwater Pipe that runs from Howard Street to Cleveland Avenue was inspected recently as part of information gathering for applying for ARPA stormwater funds. It was discovered that a section of this pipe had collapsed and poses threat of property damage if not repaired quickly. During that inspection the rest of the pipe was discovered to be in bad condition. The pictures below show the collapse at ground level on the Howard Street side. This is located on the property line between David and Sandra Wilkey's property and the Athens Housing Authority property.







We are in the position to replace the pipe with our crews but will need to purchase the materials. Contech Engineer Solutions has a state contract for the 48" corrugated metal pipe that is required for this project. The purchase can be made through the Tennessee State Contract Purchasing agreement with Contech. The estimated cost for pipe materials is \$55,068.00. The cost of the materials is reimbursable through the ARPA funding because this project is part of the original scope of work.

Background

The City recently opened bids for the Campus Transportation Improvements project to accommodate the increased traffic volume to be generated by the new school. The bids included two base bid packages, as well as one bid alternate.

A total of two bids were received for the project. Regardless of which combination of base bid packages and bid alternates that may be accepted, the low bidder is Adams Construction. The low bid will be in an amount of \$2,757,391.13, based upon the engineer's estimate of quantities. However, the bid is based upon unit quantities so the final cost could increase or decrease based upon the actual quantities used for the project. The bid total is broken down as follows:

Background

The City's agreement with Stantec to provide engineering, design, and bid services for the Public Safety Training Facility was based upon some components being a fixed fee and others being based on time and materials. Because of a few different factors, the time needed to complete the process took longer than originally estimated. Some of the time and materials line items took longer than anticipated and resulted in a higher cost. Additionally, some of the design needed to be updated once we found out we were going to be able to acquire some of the adjoining property. This allowed us to provide greater space between site components which results in a more usable and safer design. Also, the need to break the bid documents into several alternates required additional time.

As a result, an additional \$31,500 is needed to cover the costs of the design and construction related services.

Action Item

Approve an amendment to the agreement with Stantec in an amount of \$31,500 for services related to the Public Safety Training Facility.

SUBJECT: Allocating ARPA Funds for the City

In February of this year, the council approved the allocation of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) toward four projects for the City. As a reminder, the City will receive a total of \$4,159,922.74 through the State as our portion of the funds. We received \$2,079,961.37 in November, 2021 and will receive the same amount in November of this year.

The \$4,700,000 allocation approved in February were for the following projects: Animal Shelter Building - \$600,000; Public Works Building - \$2,500,000; Fire Training Tower - \$600,000; and City Hall Renovations - \$1,000,000. We allocated more than we are receiving to allow some flexibility in submitting the expenditures so that they are used as quickly as possible. Since we have temporarily delayed working on City Hall to concentrate on the other projects, I would like to amend the \$4,700,000 allocation to be as follows: Animal Shelter Building - \$900,000; Public Works Building - \$2,900,000; and Fire Training Tower - \$900,000. By adjusting the allocations, the next reporting period ending March 31, 2023 should be the last period for reporting expenditures and simplify the reporting requirements.

Please let me know if I can supply any additional information for the use of these funds.

WHEREAS, the lowest bid received for Division 2: 14" Diameter Force Main was from Morgan Contracting, of Knoxville, for the construction of the 2020 Athens CDBG Sewer System Improvements; and

WHEREAS, references were checked for W & O Construction, Inc. and Morgan Contracting; and

WHEREAS, the City of Athens with concurrence with Athens Utilities Board (AUB) believes it is best to award W & O Construction, Inc. and Morgan Contracting to complete this project; and

WHEREAS, the bids received from W & O Construction, Inc has a construction cost of \$2,805,000 for Division 1 and Morgan Contracting has a construction cost of \$1,816,383 for Division 2.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Athens, Tennessee, as follows:

That the recitals above are true and accurate and form a part of this Resolution; and

That meeting in regular session this <u>15th</u> day of <u>November</u>, 2022, that contingent upon concurrence of ECD and AUB that the lowest bids of W & O Construction and Morgan Contracting be accepted to furnish the necessary labor and materials for the rehabilitation of the abovementioned wastewater system.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Council understands that additional funds are required to accept the construction bids and acknowledges that Athens Utilities Board shall provide supplemental funding to cover cost overages, and furthermore resolves to grant authority to the Mayor to enter into agreements and execute documents for the successful implementation for this project subject to the approval of the state.

The parcels total approximately 1.16 acres feet in area. The Zoning Code states the following for the minimum lot size in the I-2 District, "Where public water and sewer service is available, there shall be required a minimum land area of two (2) acres". The adjacent 12.51-acre tract under common ownership to the south that these parcels are being incorporated into by subdivision plat is zoned B-3 as well. A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MCMINN ANIMAL SHELTER AT 320 SOUTH JACKSON STREET TO BE NAMED THE LARRY DEAN WALLACE, SR ANIMAL SHELTER AND ADOPTION CENTER

WHEREAS, in 2004, McMinn Regional Humane Society board members approached Larry Dean Wallace, Sr. for assistance with shelter repair and expansion; and

WHEREAS, from that moment forward, Mr. Wallace's vision was in continuous motion for improved conditions for the animals of McMinn County until the day he received his great reward; and

WHEREAS, as a former McMinn County Sheriff, Colonel of the Tennessee Highway Patrol, and Director of the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation – Mr. Wallace utilized his law enforcement connections for the betterment of our community; and

WHEREAS, he enlisted trustees from the former Brushy Mountain State Penitentiary to provide labor to build and renovate outdoor kennels; and

WHEREAS, this pivotal project extended the shelter's outreach from 15 to 37 kennels and saved thousands of dogs' lives; and

RECITALS:

The Consultant possesses a high degree of professional skill and experience and is a unique provider of professional consulting services in retail recruitment.

The Client desires to hire the Consultant to provide professional consulting services because of its professional skill and experience.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual covenants and agreements set forth in this Agreement, the Client and the Consultant, intending to be legally bound, do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>CONSULTING SERVICES.</u> The Consultant agrees to provide the following professional consulting services to the Client (the "<u>Services</u>"):
 - A. <u>Research.</u> The Consultant will identify the Client's retail trade area using a blend of demographics, political boundaries, drive times and/or custom boundaries. One market visit per calendar year is included in this agreement, additional travel outside of this agreement and requested by the Client shall be approved and paid for by the Client. The Consultant will represent the Client at International Council of Shopping Center conferences and provide updates according to the yearly conference schedule.
 - **D.** <u>Updates.</u> The Consultant will provide the Client Representative with updates within three business days of receipt of a request from the Client Representative (as defined in Section 4 below).

- I. <u>Limitation on Liability; Sole Remedy</u>: Each party's liability to the other party arising out of or related to this Agreement or the Services will not exceed the amount of the Consulting Fee. City of Athens' employee Compensation Adjustment

Staff contracted with Burris, Thompson and Associates in 2018 for a professional study and review of the City of Athens' employee Classification and Compensation Plan. Management concurred and Council adopted the recommendations made by the firm to regain competitiveness and equity in our compensation plan for all employees. To provide the Council with the best possible data ahead of budgetary discussions for the current fiscal year, staff contracted with Burris, Thompson and Associates (BTA) again to conduct a Salary Benchmark Review and to provide their findings and recommendations to keep the classification and compensation plan competitive for our positions and the changes in market conditions.

The Council has been very kind to employees over the past several years as many improvements have been made in benefits and pay for our Team. Even during uncertain times, the Council has rewarded the hard work of our public servants with pay increases that has kept employees above the rate of inflation and/or the Consumer Pricing Index (CPI) – so their dollars go just as far, if not farther today than when they started.

In the Salary Benchmark Review this year, BTA recommended moving the pay ranges for all jobs 9-10% to stay competitive for recruiting, and to provide a 5% pay increase to all employees to remain competitive for retaining employees. The Council adopted the recommendation of staff to shift the pay range by 5% and to increase pay by 5%. Due to the uncertainty of the economy and potential issues with equitability, this was the best we could do, and employees are thankful for the Council's support, but we anticipated that more would likely be needed again this year to meet inflationary and consumer pricing challenges. Revenues have continued to hold steady or increase, and while this does not mean it will be sustained, staff is comfortable in recommending that the Council consider another pay range increase of 3% for recruitment and a pay increase of 3% for retention in order to keep pace with inflation (>8%) and CPI.

CITY OF ATHENS, TENNESSEE Narrative on Financial Analysis October, 2022

This narrative will discuss various aspects of the financial data presented to the city council for the above-referenced month. July, and 2 or 3 subsequent months will be above the normal percentages, primarily on the expenditure side because of several factors, as discussed below.

General Fund

Overall, we collected about \$527,000 more through October this year, primarily because we received \$292,000 more in sales tax, \$177,000 more in property taxes, \$168,000 less from the direct appropriation grant from the State, \$67,000 more in AUB in lieu of taxes, \$33,000 more in state sales tax and \$60,000 more in interest revenue. As a percentage we collected 1.65% more than the budgeted revenues for last year.

PLEASE NOTE: On the financial spreadsheet that accompanies this report, at the top you will see General Fund revenues. I have only broken out major sources of revenue such as property taxes and sales taxes. The "total revenues" amount includes smaller items that I did not show in detail. A complete listing of all revenue accounts can be found on your computer-generated report titled "Statement of Actual and Estimated Revenues".

Expenditures are always going to show high in the early budget months, primarily due to the retirement contribution being paid in July and the fleet management transfer.

Another factor that makes the percentage spent look high is the fact that we set up annual purchase orders for known or recurring monthly expenses. For example, in the City Council division we pay for the monthly taping of council meetings. To avoid having to prepare a purchase order every month, we prepare one for the entire year and pay off of it monthly. This total PO is included in the "expended & encumbered" percentage.

Expenditures and encumbrances for this year are \$649,000 more than this time last year, showing 46.96% this year. The variance is due to the fund balance transfer to the capital projects fund being \$400,000 more than the amount in the previous year and the debt service transfer being \$80,000 more than this time last year.

Sanitation

Revenues and expenditures are comparable to the prior year.
