



Dear Bladensburg Residents and Community Stakeholders, the summer months have been extremely busy for the Town of Bladensburg! The Town completed the repaving of 57th Avenue (between Annapolis Road and Emerson Street) which is a major access point for metro buses, Ward 2 residents as well as traffic to four schools (Bladensburg High School, Elizabeth Seton High School, Port Towns Elementary School and Rogers Heights Elementary School). Construction of the new track and football field for Bladensburg High School and the new Bladensburg Library are nearing completion. Both projects are expected to be complete this fall.

Additionally, the State of Maryland's Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration has started major work on SHA 769-C also referred to as 48th Street and Quincy Place. On the segment closest to Annapolis Road, 48th Street, underground pipes were replaced and the roadway was resurfaced. With the heavy rains we experienced during the summer months the work on 48th Street has already begun to make a major difference. To continue the work, we advocated for measures to slow down traffic along this stretch of roadway by making it a one-way street, as well as requested a walking path for residents, especially our students.

With the start of a new school year, I encourage the community members to support our student athletes by attending and supporting their sports activities. Having strong community support for our students during the fall sports season will help them feel supported and boost their confidence. Let's help the next generation by showing our support. Just visit the school websites for the sports schedules.

The Town also held several community events over the summer to engage with residents including the annual Juneteenth Celebration, the 4th of July Fireworks Event, Celebration of Former Mayor David Harrington's Life, and the Prince George's County Office of Storm Drain Maintenance (Department of Public Works and Transportation) presentation on the Pilot Flood Barrier Project. Please be on the lookout for information regarding the next opportunity to hear about the Flood Barrier Project and ask questions.

Please also remember the Town elections are coming up on October 2, 2023. Please take the time to learn about the candidates to help inform your decisions.

Finally, on behalf of the Town Council and Staff, please continue to stay connected with the Town of Bladensburg. We are excited about the opportunity to continue making our community a beautiful and safe place to live, learn, work, and play!

Beautification is on my mind: As I walk through the Town, I want to make this a place that makes everyone proud. Over the next few months, we will begin a Town Beautification Team to help maintain our right of way and update the monument and gateway signage. This process will take place over the fall and next spring. An item was approved in September, and the concept is hiring part-time labor to enhance our current public works teams during the fall and spring to give us some additional "people-power" as we close the year. ARPA funds will fund this vital project. This team will focus on commercial corridors to spruce up our curb appeal.

Flood Channel Project: On August 2, 2023, the Town and the County met with residents at Bladensburg Elementary. Residents raised some significant issues, and we have been collaborating with the County to ensure we address their concerns. We are working hard with the County to provide information on the flood channel project. We have another presentation scheduled at the September 11, 2023, Council Meeting so residents can learn more about this vital project.

New CDBG Funding: On September 8, 2023, the Town was notified that we are being awarded \$155,000 in PY 48 CDBG Reprogramming Funds to repair bridges and infrastructure throughout the Town. Staff will be working on getting these projects out to bid this Fall for repairs in the early Spring of 2024. We are excited about this award from Prince George's County; more updates will be coming soon!

769C Construction Update: Work is almost completed on this project. The State had a slight delay when they had to order a different kind of barrier, which will be installed later this month. The work done will improve access and pedestrian safety in the area. The Town will send information updates on Social Media and the Port.

Election Update: Remember, Election Day is October 2, 2023, and polls open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Please follow the Town website, social media, and email notices as election day draws nearer.

Green Initiatives

In preparation for the Town's Sustainability certification renewal, we have been working on a few items to place Bladensburg at the forefront of Maryland Communities. Below are some items that the staff has been working to implement;

- Join the Green Team! As part of our sustainability project, we will need your help on our Green Team. Members assist the Town in making Green Policy decisions and help us to spread the word about our events and initiatives.
- Town Tree Planting: In the fall, the Town will work on a Tree planting project with CKAR (Central Kenilworth Avenue Revitalization: Community Development Corporation). The Chesapeake Bay Trust funds this project to provide shade in urban areas.
- Rain Barrels: The Town is working on a joint project to fund and teach residents how to install Rain barrels at their residences.
- New Charing Station Update (PEPCO): The newly installed rapid charging station is in progress; we have contacted Pepco to set up a date for a small ribbon cutting this fall. This will add two more charging spaces to the Town Hall and allow vehicles to charge faster than our existing stations.

SAFETY

- School is back in full swing, which means that there's more traffic on the roads in the morning and late afternoon. Be alert when you're crossing the street or driving in a school zone.
- Falling leaves can pose a hazard, no matter if you're driving or walking. Leaves can be very slippery, which is a big trigger for autumn slip and falls.
- Be prepared for unexpected temperature changes.
- Test your batteries and replace them if necessary. Make sure you have backups on hand in case of power outages or other emergencies.

WELLNESS

- Get prepared for Daylight Savings Time: November 5
- Buy in-season food: pumpkin, squash, eggplant, etc.
- Moisturize your skin with body cream instead of lotion
- Stay active! Raking leaves and walks around the Bladensburg Waterfront Park counts!
- Ensure you have your winter tools and preparation plan
- Keep a schedule. The fall season can get very busy and festive!
- Boost your immune system: drink plenty of water, wash your hands often, and eat nutritionous foods



A message from your Bladensburg Volunteer Fire Department Chief

IF WE CAN'T YOU CAN'T

It's that time of year again when our community scholars return to school to learn. grow and live healthy lives. But this is not possible if we as drivers ignore basic rules. If a school bus is stopped with its red light on you must stop. This includes the fire department. Fire department, even in an emergency, cannot go around a school bus unless the red lights on the bus are turned off. It should never be acceptable to accept an increased risk of injuring or worse losing a young life. Scholars struggle with enough troubles in the world and they should not accept drivers who disobey the law. According to a report on Good Morning America, "In 2020, 235 child pedestrians (0-14 years old) died in roadway crashes and 81 died in incidents on driveways or private lots. An additional 245 pedestrian deaths were older teens (15-19 years old)".

School Bus Zone & Danger Zone

School bus safety tips for drivers:

- Prepare to stop when a slowing bus has its overhead yellow lights flashing
- Stop at least 20 feet away from buses when red lights are flashing, unless driving in the opposite direction on a divided highway
- Slow down in or near school and residential areas
- Look for clues-such as safety patrols, crossing guards, bicycles, and playgrounds-that indicate children might be in the area
- Watch for children between parked cars and other objects

School buses are like traffic signals:

- When overhead lights are flashing yellow: Prepare to stop
- When overhead lights are flashing red: Stop
- When hazard warning lights are flashing: Proceed with caution

Remember to do what's right as a responsible adult and stop for all school buses when the red lights are on.





WASTE, RECYCLING & PICKUP INFORMATION

Monday: Yard waste must be placed into paper yard waste bags or a trash can marked with an X. Brush has to be tied up in a bundle weighing no more than 25-30LBS per bundle.

Tuesday: Household Trash, & building materials generated by homeowners only! 2 X 4's etc. most be tied in a bundle No longer than 4ft. weighing NO more than 25-30LBS per bundle. Plywood most be cut in half No longer than 4ft. NO bricks or concrete.

Wednesday: Recycling

CODE ENFORCEMENT

LEAF PREPERATION

It is important to know that the Town will pick up leaves generated from your residents on the designated pick-up day which will be posted in your neighborhoods. The leaves can also be collected by placing them in approved yard waste containers, and, or paper bags. The weight regulation is no more than 25 lbs.

·NOTE: It is also important to know that failure to adhere to the regulations could result in Warnings and fines.

MATRESS DISPOSAL

·Please remember that all Mattress and box springs must be covered with plastic to prevent possible Bedbug transmission. Please remember there is a weekly bulk trash removal, and you items must be called in at least a day prior to the pickup day which is Friday. Please call Bates Trucking (301 773-2069), before 2pm Thursdays.

While grass is in hibernation, we must remember that fallen leaves can clog drains and gutters. We request that if you desire to dispose of your leaves they must be placed in approved paper leaf recycling bags. You can purchase them at Home Depot & Lowes.

Lastly, Save the date for the Town of Bladensburg Clean-up & Green-up event at Bladensburg Town Hall: Saturday, October 21.
