DAVID C. HARRINGTON

It is with profound sadness that we share the loss of a Town of Bladensburg family member, former Mayor David C. Harrington. David was the Town's first African American Mayor and served from 1995-2002. In addition, he served the Prince George's County Council and was State Senator for District 47. After leaving public service, he became CEO of the Prince George's Chamber of Commerce, where he cultivated resources and support for businesses in Prince George's County. He was a wonderful person who continued to offer support for Bladensburg in each of his leadership roles.

On Thursday, September 21, 2017, the Town of Bladensburg dedicated the newly renovated Town park as 'David C. Harrington Community Park'. We will continue to honor his commitment to the Town of Bladensburg and the Port Towns community. He truly will be missed.



280TH ANNIVERSARY OF BLADENSBURG

On October 29, 1742 when the Maryland General Assembly yielded to the desires of several inhabitants and passed an act to build the Town of Bladensburg, originally called Garrison's Landing. Bladensburg's early history was rich in events and folklore. The Port of Bladensburg was one of the busiest trading centers in all of the colonies. In addition, the Battle of Bladensburg in 1814 and the infamous Bladensburg Dueling Grounds brought national recognition to the Town. The Town was also noted for it's many firsts, including the first Balloon Ascent, the first railroad in America, the first Sauropods (dinosaur) fossil found and the first municipality in Prince George's County.

Alluding to the rich maritime heritage of the port town of Bladensburg, architectural references to the dynamic nature of water and its limitless potential are themes carried throughout the new two-story branch library. Two full-height glass curtain wall systems soar above the streetscape while a continuous masonry band grounds the structure, firmly anchoring it to the site. An abundance of glazing establishes a direct connection with the surrounding neighborhood, allowing pedestrians to glimpse the contemporary interiors of the library while at the same time directing views of the building occupants towards the exterior environment. The new branch library hopes to serve as a catalyst for the community, further advancing the comprehensive vision for redevelopment of the area.

A message from your volunteer Bladensburg Fire Department Chief

September is National Preparedness month. It is critically important to have a plan in the event a disaster strikes. Potential disasters that can impact the Bladensburg area includes flooding, tornadoes, and windstorms. Families and businesses need to have a shelter in place plan, an evacuation plan, and a communications plan for various types of events. It is important to have an emergency preparedness kit for travel to include clothes, cash, food, and maps. Remember if the power goes out in the area, credit cards will not work to purchase fuel, food, or hotels. If you are sheltering in place every person needs to have at least 72 -96 hours of supplies to maintain basic needs until help can arrive.

The Bladensburg Volunteer Fire
Department in conjunction with Prince
Georges County Fire Department will
respond to any emergency that we are
called for. However, during severe
disasters response time can be delayed
because of the emergency call volume
that will occur. Personal preparedness
and planning will help keep everyone
safe and potentially reduce overloaded
calls so we can reach those in highest
priority.

AMIERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT

The Town of Bladensburg has received approximately \$4.9 million dollars through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). Thus far, the Town has spent approximately \$800,000. This includes community assistance programs such as housing rental and mortgage assistance, an upcoming food assistance program for the Thanksgiving holiday, COVID supplies such as masks and test kits, compensation for essential workers who served through pandemic, police vehicles, ShotSpotter technology for public safety, and trauma kits for teachers at Bladensburg schools to use in the event of an emergency.
