NEWLY UPDATED TOWN PARK:

Named After Former Mayor David Harrington

The Mayor and Town Council unanimously approved renaming the recently updated Town Park located at 4229 Edmonston Road after former Mayor David Harrington during the May 8, 2017 Town Council meeting.

Mr. Harrington has served our community for more than a decade as Mayor, a County CouncilMember, and as a Maryland State Senator. Mr. Harrington currently serves as the President and CEO of the Prince George's County's Chamber of Commerce. The update to the park was the result of Lt. James Flynn applying for and receiving grant funding through the Maryland Department of Natural Resources and community Development Block Grant funds the PGCDHCD. Lt. Flynn served as the Project Manager and played a key role in the success of this project.

Lt. Flynn was committed to providing an enjoyable outdoor recreational amenity for everyone living, doing business and visiting the Bladensburg community; when you visit the park, you will see first-hand the pride he took in providing you with a top rated park.

The David Harrington Park has been updated to inculde a variety of amenities to include:

- NEW pavilion with picnic tablesa new grill to have cookouts on.
- NEW cushioned walking path, designed to be easier on the knees & feet when you are walking.
- NEW covered picnic area next to the playground to provide parents with shade while their children are playing in the playground area.
- NEW exercise equipment stations to provide the community with an enjoyable exercise experience.

PUBLIC WORKS

Town of Bladensburg residents, the season has come again to keep your grass cut and do some outdoor cleaning. The Town of Bladensburg Public Works advises for all residents to place all yard waste in heavy duty yard waste bags for collection on Wednesdays. Here are a couple more tips about keeping your property looking beautiful:



- Grass must be kept below 12 inches (2.5 to 3.5 inches is a good grass height)
- Tree Limbs/Yard Waste must be tied in small bundles NO longer than 3-4ft in length. Yard Waste includes weeds, leaves, tree limbs, grass, flowers, soft plants and trimmings.
- Keep the community clean by simply picking up any trash or litter on the curb of your property.

Survey Questions Included:

- **2.** Are you willing to pay for a parking permit?
- **3.** If yes, would you be in favor of restricting the number of parking permits per household?
- **4.** Do you have off-street parking such as a driveway available to use?
- 5. If so, do you use your driveway for parking?
- **6.** If you do not use your driveway, would you be willing to pay a higher permit fit to park on the street?




TREASURER'S CORNER

- from Vito Tinelli

Last month, the Mayor and Council wrapped up the last of their Budget Work Sessions for final adoption. Some of the budget highlights are as follows:

- Tax rates for real estate and business personal property remain unchanged for over a decade
- Staffing increased to provide essential services to include additional Police Officers, Code Enforcement personnel, Dispatchers, and a Public Works Director.
- General and Administrative expenses remained almost constant compared to prior year
- Capital Purchases funded through our fund balance for items such as new police cruisers, outfitting expansion of Public Safety offices, new Town of Bladensburg gateway signs, and also for road improvements.
- Very lean general and administrative expenses of 17% to include the Mayor and Council, Town Administrator, Treasurer, and Town Clerk Departments
- 83% of total budget provides a service to the Town.



The FY18 Budget is set for adoption at the June 2017 Mayor and Council Meeting.

- A General purpose permit must be obtained before sponsoring a yard sale. Each residence is limited to three General purpose permits per year.
- The placement of any signage on utility poles or trees is prohibited.

COMMUNITY LED

TNI (Transitioning Neighborhood) Team

In April of 2012, County Executive Rushern Baker launched the **Transforming Neighborhoods Initiative (TNI).** The purpose of TNI is to improve the quality of life of neighborhoods, while identifying ways to improve service delivery throughout the county for all residents. This initiative focuses on partnering with communities to uplift neighborhoods in the county that face significant economic, health, public safety and educational challenges.

The goal is to achieve the County Executive's Vision of a Thriving Economy, Great Schools, Safe Neighborhoods and High Quality Healthcare by targeting cross-governmental resources to neighborhoods that have significant needs.

The Bladensburg/East Riverdale communities were one of five community areas designated as a TNI area. Due to the continued drop in crime over the past five (5) years and the increase in property values, the County notified the Town in June of 2016 they would be transitioning the Bladensburg/East Riverdale TNI from a County led initiative to a community led initiative effective January 1, 2017. In February 2017 a Town of Bladensburg TNI Team was formed representing the community to include:

- A resident from Ward I & a resident from Ward II
- An HOA from Ward I & an HOA from Ward II
- A business representative from the Town of Bladensburg

- A community organization from the Town of Bladensburg
- Chief Stone from the Bladensburg Police Department
- Shaun Rienhart, Code Enforcement Supervisor from the Town of Bladensburg
- Linda Turner, Manager, Transforming Neighborhoods Initiative (TNI), County Exec. Office
- Jeffrey Swilley, Assistant Director of Business Services Prince George's County's Economic Development Corporation- Workforce Services Division
- Debi Sandlin, Town Administrator, Town of Bladensburg

The Town's TNI Team held their initial meeting in February and identified four (4) goal areas to focus on over the next year. The four goal areas identified include:

- 1. Jobs and Workforce Training
- 2. Rebranding Bladensburg
- 3. Environment
- 4. Identify Partnerships

The TNI meetings are open to all residents living in the community and businesses located in the Town. We encourage everyone to attend and participate in the discussions and work with the TNI Team to improve the quality of live for everyone living and doing business in the Town of Bladensburg.
