

Buckingham County Electoral Board Meeting

July 20, 2021

The Electoral Board met in the basement conference room of the Administrative Complex on July 20, 2021 at 9:00 a.m. All Board members and the Director of Elections/Registrar were present. Chairman, Rick Caldwell, called the meeting to order. Larry Davis read the minutes of the previous meeting which were approved.

Lindsey Taylor, Director of Elections/Registrar, updated the Electoral Board on old business and addressed several items of new business.

Voter credit for the June 8th election was scanned and sent to the State with no issues. Lindsey sent sympathy cards to the families of Nan Holt and Valerie Breault, both of whom had been long-time election workers.

In new business, Lindsey will attend Regional Training in Richmond on August 31, 2021. She reviewed the changes in voting laws and presented the candidates who have qualified for the November 2021 ballot.

A new law calls for the Town of Dillwyn to become a separate precinct in 2022. Possible locations were discussed. This will require new voting machines and a cart.

The Board approved the purchase of two electronic poll books to be used for early voting in the next election. The money in our budget for cyber security has not been spent yet, but this needs to be done soon. A letter will be sent to the Board of Supervisors to request a rollover of the Electoral Board budget.

At 10:30, Lindsey was excused from the meeting and the Electoral Board completed the General Registrar evaluation.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:15 a.m.
