Buffalo Grove Police Investigate Aggravated Battery

Buffalo Grove, IL – Buffalo Grove Police are conducting an aggravated battery investigation after a victim was stabbed and hospitalized for his injuries. The man has since been released and is expected to fully recover. The police department would like to assure the public this was a targeted and isolated incident, and there is no threat to the community.

On Saturday, November 9, 2019 at approximately 11:00 p.m., police were called to an apartment building on Trace Drive about a man who had been 'cut' several times and was bleeding heavily. Once officers arrived, they determined the offender(s) had left the area and assisted the Buffalo Grove Fire Department in rendering aid to the 52-year-old victim. Paramedics transported him to an area hospital where he was treated and released the following day.

Buffalo Grove Investigators, with the assistance of the Lake County Major Crimes Task Force (LCMCTF) have determined the offender and the victim were known to each other.

“Our agency, along with the Buffalo Grove Fire Department, and LCMCTF worked diligently to provide safety and security to all those involved,” said Police Chief Steven Casstevens. “I would like to extend my gratitude to those who responded and performed their duties at the highest levels.”

The investigation is ongoing, and no further details will be released at this time.
