Two Palatine Men Charged in Buffalo Grove Stabbing

Buffalo Grove, IL. - Two men have been charged with Class 1 Attempted Murder for a stabbing that occurred on Wednesday, June 28, at approximately 9:30 p.m. in the 600 block of Trace Drive.

Buffalo Grove Police were dispatched to the apartment for a report of a person who had been stabbed. When officers arrived, they located the victim who was bleeding from lacerations in the arm and a puncture wound on the back. Aid was rendered to the victim by the officers until Buffalo Grove paramedics arrived. The victim was transported to a nearby hospital for emergency surgery and is currently recovering.

Buffalo Grove Police were able to identify two suspects who were known to the victim: Ryan Bruce, 33, from the 1900 block of Cambridge Court in Palatine, and Ryan Neises, 20, from the 1500 block of Norway Lane, also in Palatine.

Further investigation revealed the victim had a previous altercation with one of the suspects and was spotted by the suspect near a Burger King. The victim was followed home where the stabbing took place. The suspects fled the scene prior to police arriving.

By Sunday, July 3, Bruce and Neises had both been taken into custody with assistance from the Palatine Police Department. Through further investigation and consultation with the Cook County State's Attorney's Office, Bruce and Neises were each charged with Class 1 Attempted Murder.

On July 4, Bruce and Neises were transported to Cook County Bond Court at 26th and California where they received no bonds. A second bond hearing took place on July 6 and both men are still being held without bond. Their next court date is set for July 29 at 9:00 a.m. at the Cook County Circuit Court in Rolling Meadows. The public is reminded that individuals charged with any crime are considered innocent until proven guilty.
