I am very pleased to share some of the important planning projects and upcoming events taking place in Buffalo Grove.

The Village just completed the largest planning study ever undertaken in Buffalo Grove that has resulted in the Lake Cook Corridor Market Study and Plan. The Plan is a result of two years of planning and was shaped by public input received throughout the many public engagement activities hosted by the Village. The plan's objective is to determine how

the Village can best reposition the Lake-Cook Corridor so that it can optimize its growth potential. The first stage of the Plan focuses on redevelopment of the Town Center and Chase Plaza properties. The concepts for both centers are driven not only by public input, but by market realities. The planning in Buffalo Grove continues! The Village of Buffalo Grove has retained Ratio, a planning and design consultant, to guide the Village in developing a subarea plan for the Prairie View Metra Station area. The project will produce a community-driven vision and plan. The plan will take into consideration the opportunities and challenges of the unincorporated areas, as well as Metra's North Central Service which provides service to the Prairie View Metra Station. This project, which kicks off this spring, will include community engagement. The project team would like to hear the thoughts and ideas of residents, property owners, businesses, local officials and other stakeholders. ## Help Preserve Buffalo Grove's Water Environment

In accordance with state and federal storm sewer regulations, residents are reminded that it is unlawful to dump chemicals, paints, solvents or any other pollutants in inlets, creeks, or on Buffalo Grove streets.

The Clean Water Act authorizes the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), to regulate point sources that discharge pollutants into waters of the United States through the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit program.

'Point sources' are generated from a variety of municipal, construction and industrial operations, including treated wastewater, processed water, cooling water and stormwater runoff from drainage systems. In place since 1990, the NPDES Stormwater Program regulates discharges from municipal





separate storm sewer systems (MS4s), construction activities, industrial activities and those designated by EPA due to water quality impacts.

If residents observe activities that are believed to be adding pollutants into inlets, creeks, or on streets, or have questions about pollution reports or stormwater quality concerns, they are asked to contact the Public Works Department at **847-459-2547**.

## **Buffalo Grove Hydrant Flushing 2018 Information and Schedule**


Public Works will be flushing fire hydrants through Saturday, May 26, 2018. Flushing will begin at 5:30 a.m. and continue until 9:00 p.m.

Hydrant flushing is a yearly preventive maintenance activity, performed to inspect the operation of a fire hydrant, measure the flow (gallons per minute) produced at the hydrant nozzle, and to remove any sediment that may have collected in the system between flushing.

Signs will be posted throughout the area where hydrant flushing will occur 24 hours in advance of the operation.

Residents may experience cloudy and orange colored water during hydrant flushing operations. While the water is safe to drink, it can discolor clothing. Residents are advised to check the water color before starting a load of laundry during this time. ### **New RV Regulations in Buffalo Grove**

The Village of Buffalo Grove recently approved new regulations for the parking and storing of recreational vehicles (RVs) outside. Under the new regulations which will take effect on August 1, 2018, a single-family property can store up to one RV on the driveway from Tuesday, May 15, to Sunday, September 30. During the remainder of the year, the outside storage of an RV is allowed in the rear and/or side yard of a lot and must meet zoning setbacks. The RV must also be screened from public view with landscaping or fencing, and be parked on a hard surface such as asphalt or pavers.

### **Only Rain Down the Drain**

Storm drains and roadside ditches lead to inland lakes, streams, rivers and to Lake Michigan. Any motor oil, pet waste, leaves, grass clippings or dirty water from washing a car that enters a storm drain gets into the water without being treated.

Residents are reminded not to dump the above substances, or anything else down the storm drain or into a ditch. Pollutants that get into storm drains can poison fish, birds and other wildlife, and can find their way into drinking water supplies. Dirt, litter, branches and grass clippings can also clog storm drains and cause flooding. Be sure to report anyone dumping materials into a storm drain or ditch to Buffalo Grove officials by calling 847-459-2525.



#### **How Residents Can Prevent Water Pollution:**

- 1. Sweep up driveways and sidewalks instead of hosing them down with water or blowing debris into the street.
- 2. Do not dump anything down a storm drain or into a ditch.
- 3. Plant bare spots in your yard.
- 4. Compost your yard waste.
- 5. Use fertilizers sparingly and avoid pesticides.
- 6. Direct downspouts away from paved surfaces.
- 7. Take your vehicle to a car wash instead of washing it in the driveway.
- 8. Check vehicles for leaks and recycle motor oil just four quarts of oil can form an eight-acre oil slick if spilled or dumped down a storm drain.
- 9. Pick up after your pet.
- 10. If you are on a septic system, have it inspected and pumped regularly.

### Buffalo Grove Named Tree City USA for 30th Year

This year, Buffalo Grove was named a 2017 Tree City USA by the Arbor Day Foundation, in honor of its commitment to effective urban forest management. This is the 30th consecutive year Buffalo Grove has been awarded the honor of being named a Tree City USA.

Buffalo Grove achieved this recognition by meeting the Tree City USA program's four requirements, which include having a tree board or department, a tree care ordinance, an annual community forestry budget of at least \$2 per capita and an Arbor Day observance and proclamation.

The Public Works Forestry Section, along with the Village as a whole, have had many successes in 2017 pertaining to tree planting and growth.

- Buffalo Grove celebrated Arbor Day by handing out 903 sapling trees to all the third-grade classrooms in the Village.
- Forestry staff trimmed 5,370 trees, focusing efforts to achieve a five-year cycle trimming program.
- There were 153 trees planted in 2017. Buffalo Grove remains focused on species diversity as trees are planted throughout the Village.
- Forestry staff removed an acre of buckthorn (an invasive shrub or tall tree) undergrowth from a woodland area and began a habitat restoration project with the help of grant funding.
- Five of Buffalo Grove's ISA-certified arborists became credentialed as municipal specialists. **TREE CITY USA** For this credential, arborists were tested on the areas of public relations, administration, risk management, and policy and planning as they pertain to municipal arboriculture.

# Lawn Irrigation and Safe Drinking Water

In an effort to provide the highest quality of water, and to comply with federal and state regulations, the Village requires that all water customers with lawn irrigation systems have a reduced pressure zone (RPZ) type backflow prevention device installed.

This device must be tested yearly prior to the irrigation system being pressurized and started up in the spring. The tests must be performed by a State Certified Inspector and results need to be entered in Backflow Solutions' web portal database once certification of the device is completed. Backflow Solutions provides online backflow management and cross connection control programs to municipalities and water purveyors, helping to organize, streamline and improve compliance with EPA regulations.

#### Q. What does a backflow prevention device do?

**A.** A backflow prevention device prevents the flow of non-potable (and possibly dangerous) water from your lawn into your house, and then into the public water supply.

#### Q. Does it really need to be tested every year?

**A.** Yes. To keep your family and the community safe, these devices need to be checked regularly to be certain they are in working condition. This is also a requirement of both state and municipal codes:

1.E.P.A. Title 35 Section 653.802 part e subpart 1' - Each device shall be tested at least annually or more frequently if recommended by the manufacturer.

## **Buffalo Grove Steps Up Dead Tree Enforcement Efforts**

In the wake of the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) infestation, thousands of dead ash trees remain on private properties throughout Buffalo Grove. Dead trees of any species are in violation of Village ordinance and pose a possible hazard to the general public. The responsibility of removing these trees rests solely with individual property owners. Inspections will begin in late spring after the trees leaf out and continue through late fall. Village employees will be out inspecting properties and issuing violation notices where appropriate.

Residents that are found to be in violation of the code will be issued a violation notice letter and have 30 days for which to comply. The Village will work with residents to become compliant before citations are issued. 'Village of Buffalo Grove Municipal Code 13.05.110 A.2' - Reduced pressure principle backflow prevention devices shall be tested at the time of installation and annually prior to system start up or more frequently if recommended by the manufacturer and required service performed within five days.

### Q. Are there different kinds of RPZ type backflow devices?

**A.** Yes, but only RPZ-type devices are acceptable for lawn irrigation systems. If you have any other type of device, it will not pass the inspection.

#### Q. Where can I find a Cross Control Device Inspector?

**A.** Buffalo Grove will fax, email or mail lists of State Certified Inspectors who have completed work in the Village. For this list, contact the Public Works Department at **847-459-2545**. 

## **Arbor Day 2018 Celebration**

Arbor Day was first observed as a formal holiday in the year 1872 in Nebraska when a resolution by J. Sterling Morton proposed, "To set aside one day to plant trees, both forest and fruit," which was accepted by the Nebraska State Board of Agriculture. That year, April 10 was declared Arbor Day, and as a result, more than one million trees were planted in Nebraska on that date. J. Sterling Morton has since become known as the Founder of Arbor Day, and to honor him, Arbor Day has been celebrated on his birthday, April 22, for many years.

National Arbor Day is celebrated the last Friday in the month of April throughout the United States, Puerto Rico and other U.S. territories. While other holidays celebrate a past event, Arbor Day celebrates an ongoing concern for future generations. Trees planted represent the belief that in the future, bountiful vegetation will be available to benefit the wildlife habitat, as well as provide for erosion control, wood products, and shelter from the sun and wind.

Buffalo Grove celebrated Arbor Day this year on April 27 by handing-out sapling trees to all third-grade classrooms at local schools. Each year, 1,000 trees are passed out to be planted by children who can care for them and watch them grow. The hope is that children and the community are inspired to share this emphasis and concern, and continue this tradition for generations to come.

## **Buffalo Grove Celebrates 60 Years**



In the March/April edition of the Buffalo Grove Village News, the origins of the Buffalo Grove area back in the 1830s were outlined. Although the exact origin of how Buffalo Grove got its name remains uncertain, the traditional account is that along with the Pottawatomi Indians and the English and French settlers, the buffalo left the Wheeling woods in the morning and grazed their way diagonally to Long Grove. The buffalo drank and rested along the 'Buffalo Creek', a name it earned after a buffalo skeleton was found beside it.

Between the 1840s and the 1950s, the area became a farming community with all the usual farm commodities. It had a special reputation as an important dairy farming area, supplying milk, cheese and other dairy products to the metropolitan Chicago area. Until the early part of the 20th century, the Weidner Cheese Factory on Dundee Road, just west of Buffalo Grove Road, was the principal industrial interest in the area. The dairy farmers met the daily 7:00 a.m. 'milk train' in Wheeling, which transported the Buffalo Grove milk to Chicago for processing and consumption.

In 1926, the Public Service Company of Northern Illinois offered electric power to the farms of the Buffalo Grove area. In 1930, the first concrete road to be built in northern Illinois was opened – Dundee Road. This great improvement allowed automobiles to operate in the area and opened the way for technological, commercial and residential growth in the area.

After World War II, there was a demand for homes outside the city of Chicago, which led to a wave of new 'suburban' settlers in the Buffalo Grove area. A builder, Al Frank acquired close to 100 acres of land from the Raupp family, and in 1957, built three model homes on St. Mary Parkway and began selling them. The development consisted of approximately 1,000-square-foot homes on quarter-acre lots for around \$15,000. Early residents had no sidewalks or streets. Cars were parked on Buffalo Grove Road and residents walked on paths and unpaved lanes to reach their homes.

Buffalo Grove has come a long way in 60 years and residents can be proud of the rich and wonderful history of the community!

#### **Pet License Update**

Buffalo Grove will no longer require the purchase of an animal license, which went into effect Tuesday, May 1, 2018. Illinois law requires all pets to be vaccinated under the Animal Control Act (510 ILCS 5) and have the vaccination tag on their pet(s) at all times. The vaccination tag is provided by the vaccinating veterinarian who is required to file the animals' information with Cook or Lake County, depending on where the animal lives. Other tags that identify the pet owner's information are helpful to public safety when trying to reunite lost pets with their owners. Microchipping your pet is another way to help recovered pets get home safely.

Dog park permits can be purchased in person at the Alcott Center, 530 Bernard Drive in Buffalo Grove. While pet licenses are no longer required to purchase a dog park permit, dog owners must provide current vaccination records. For more information, please visit bgparks.org.
