Public Works Qualifies for Nearly \$10 Million in Grants

The Buffalo Grove Public Works Department, and the Village as a whole, believe that maximizing grant funding opportunities is vitally important to maintaining efficient streets and roadways, and reducing the overall burden on Buffalo Grove taxpayers.

Over the last few years, Public Works Engineering Division has successfully identified roads that could qualify to become Federal Aid Urban (FAU) routes, which enable certain projects to be funded in part, by grants. In 2016 that is exactly what happened with Thompson Boulevard and Brandywyn Lane. Since then, the Engineering Division has applied for and successfully received \$9.8 million in federal funds for the reconstruction of these two roads, which was previously estimated at a cost of \$12.4 million. Due to these grants, the Village will only be responsible for approximately \$2.5 million of the costs. Bernard Drive has also been approved as an FAU route within Cook County, and the Village plans to apply for federal funding when grants become available.

This edition of the Village Newsletter Public highlights the Works Department. The strategic goal for Public Works is to maintain and enhance the Village's core infrastructure including, streets, sewers, the water system and urban forest with adequate levels of service for each asset category. The following sections are part of the Public Works Department: Engineering, Building Maintenance Division, Street Division, Public Works Administration, Forestry and Ground Division, Central Garage

Division, Drainage Division, Water Division and Sewerage Division. Each of these divisions are staffed by a team of individuals who are oftentimes challenged with working overnights, evenings and early mornings, especially when the Village has extreme weather. We are grateful for the commitment from these individuals for ensuring our strategic goals for this important department are reached!

This is the time of year that the Village hosts many great events for children and adults alike. These events include the Public Works Open House and 'Touch a Truck' event, the Police Department's Bike Rodeo, the Buffalo Grove Symphonic Band, Jazz Band concert, and the Fire Department's 'Fire Up!' Food Truck Festival benefitting the Muscular Dystrophy Association. Don't forget the Community Blood Drive in early June, and of course, our wonderful Farmers' Market that begins June 16th!

Touch a Truck: The Public Works Department is hosting its annual open house on May 18th from 10:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. at the Public Service Center, 51 Raupp Boulevard in Buffalo Grove. The event includes opportunities for children and adults to 'touch a truck' to gain a better understand of the equipment used by Public Works, with photo opportunities for children and adults alike. There will be live demonstrations starting at 10:30 a.m. as well as giveaways, free food and raffles.

Bike Rodeo: The Buffalo Grove Police Department will host the 'Bike Rodeo' on May 11th from noon until 2:00 p.m. at Mike Rylko Community Park, 1000 N. Buffalo Grove Road in Buffalo Grove. Children will have the chance to maneuver around obstacles, practice stopping and ensure their bike helmets are fitted properly! There will also be prizes and giveaways; come out for a chance to win the grand prize – a new bike!

Symphonic Band and Jazz Band: Enjoy the Buffalo Grove Symphonic Band and Jazz Band. The annual spring concert, 'Wind Band Classics' takes place on May 19th at 7:00 p.m. at Stevenson High School. This concert will feature wonderful music going as far back as Felix Mendelssohn in one of the earliest pieces for winds alone - as well as the music of great composers such as Granger, Holst and others. Featured in this program will be a long-lost arrangement of Howard Hanson's Opera, 'Merry Mount' as arranged by the late Chicago composer, Charles Garland. This selection has not been heard

Fire Up! Food Truck Festival: On June 1st from noon until 4:00 p.m. at Woodland Park, 2500 N. Buffalo Grove Road in Buffalo Grove, the Professional Firefighters and Paramedics Local 3177 with be hosting their first annual Fire Up! Food Truck Festival for MDA to benefit the Muscular Dystrophy Association. The event will include at least 10 Food Trucks, beer provided by Revolution Brewery, and activities for all ages, including the cover band Focal Point, raffles, fire trucks on display, and games for kids. Community Blood Drive: The Health Commission is hosting a blood drive on June 1st from 8:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. at the Alcott Center, 530 Bernard Drive in Buffalo Grove. Waste Management
New Contract, New Service



As part of a new contract with Waste Management (WM), Buffalo Grove residents now have a new At Your Door (AYD) service that began May 1, 2019. Help Preserve Buffalo Grove's **Water Environment**

In accordance with state and federal storm sewer regulations, residents are reminded that it is unlawful to dump chemicals, paints, solvents or any other pollutants in inlets, creeks, or on **Buffalo Grove streets.**

The Clean Water Act authorizes the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), to regulate point sources that discharge pollutants into waters of the US through the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit program.

'Point sources' are generated from a variety of municipal, construction and industrial operations, including treated wastewater, processed water, cooling water and stormwater runoff from drainage systems. In place since 1990, the NPDES Stormwater Program regulates discharges from municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4s), construction activities, industrial activities and those designated by EPA due to water quality impacts.

If residents observe activities that are believed to be adding pollutants into inlets, creeks or on streets, or have questions about pollution reports or stormwater quality concerns, they




Buffalo Grove Employee Spotlight Deputy Director of Public Works



Buffalo Grove Hydrant Flushing 2019 Information and Schedule

Public Works will be flushing fire hydrants starting Saturday, May 27 through July 16, 2019. Flushing will begin at 5:30 a.m. and continue until 9:00 p.m.



Hydrant flushing is annualy scheduled to preform preventive maintenance and to inspect the operation of fire hydrants. The flow (gallons per minute) produced at the hydrant nozzle is measured, and any sediment that may have collected in the system between flushings is also removed.

Signs will be posted throughout the areas where hydrant flushing will occur, 24 hours in advance of the operation.

Residents may experience cloudy and orange colored water during hydrant flushing operations. While the water is safe to drink, it can discolor clothing. Residents are advised to check the water color before starting a load of laundry during this time. Junior Police Academy



The Buffalo Grove Police Department is hosting its annual Junior Police Academy (JPA)! Motivated youngsters with a positive attitude who are interested in learning all areas of police work (between the ages of 11 and 15) are being sought. Only Rain Down the Drain

Storm drains and roadside ditches lead to inland lakes, streams, rivers - and to Lake Michigan. Any motor oil, pet waste, leaves, grass clippings or dirty water from washing a car that enters a storm drain gets into the water without being treated.

Residents are reminded not to dump these substances, or anything else down the storm drain or into a ditch. Pollutants that get into storm drains can poison fish, birds and other wildlife, and find their way into drinking water supplies. In addition, dirt, litter, branches and grass clippings can also clog storm drains and cause flooding. Be sure to report anyone dumping materials into a storm drain or ditch to Buffalo Grove officials by calling 847-459-2525.



How Residents Can Prevent Water Pollution:

- 1. Sweep up driveways and sidewalks instead of hosing them down with water or blowing debris into the street.
- 2. Never dump anything down a storm drain or into a ditch.
- 3. Plant bare spots in your yard.
- 4. Compost yard waste.
- 5. Use fertilizers sparingly and avoid pesticides.
- 6. Direct downspouts away from paved surfaces.
- 7. Take your car to a car wash instead of washing it in the driveway.
- 8. Check cars for leaks and recycle motor oil. Just four quarts of oil can form an eight-acre oil slick if spilled or dumped down a storm drain.
- 9. Pick up after your pet.
- 10. If you are on a septic system, have it inspected and pumped regularly.

Weiland and Lake Cook Road Project Update


Buffalo Grove residents should be prepared for two upcoming major road projects. The Lake County Department of Transportation (LCDOT) will be managing the reconstruction of Weiland Road, from Lake Cook Road to Aptakisic Road; Lake Cook Road reconstruction from Raupp Boulevard to Hastings Drive, will be managed by Cook County.

Utility relocation has already begun for both the Lake Cook Road and Weiland Road projects, and is expected to continue throughout the spring and summer. This work may require lane closures or flaggers, which should be confined to between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Weiland Road from Lake Cook Road to Deerfield Road will be the first road project to begin in 2019 with construction expected to start in June or July. While LCDOT is leading this project, they have hired Baxter and Woodman Consulting Engineers to oversee the day-to-day work.

Lake Cook Road from Raupp Boulevard to Hastings Drive, and Weiland Road from Deerfield Road to Aptakisic Road may begin before the end of the 2019 construction season; Cook County is still in the process of design and other procurements.

Lawn Irrigation and Safe Drinking Water

In an effort to provide the highest water quality and comply with federal and state regulations, the Village requires that all water customers with lawn irrigation systems have a reduced pressure zone (RPZ) type backflow prevention device installed.

Backflow prevention devices must be tested yearly prior to the irrigation system being pressurized and started up in the spring. The tests must be performed by a State Certified Inspector, and results need to be entered in Backflow Solutions' web portal database once certification of the device is completed. Backflow Solutions provides online backflow management and cross connection control programs to municipalities and water purveyors, which help to organize, streamline and improve compliance with EPA regulations.

Q. What does a backflow prevention device do?

A. A backflow prevention device prevents the flow of non-potable (and possibly dangerous) water from your lawn into your house, and then into the public water supply.

Q. Does it really need to be tested every year?

A. Yes. To keep your family and the community safe, these devices need to be checked regularly to be certain they are in working condition. This is also a requirement of both state and municipal codes:

'I.E.P.A. Title 35 Section 653.802-part e subpart 1' - Each device shall be tested at least annually or more frequently if recommended by the manufacturer.

'Village of Buffalo Grove Municipal Code 13.05.110 A.2' - Reduced pressure principle backflow prevention devices shall be tested at the time of installation and annually prior to system start up or more frequently if recommended by the manufacturer and required service performed within five days.

Q. Are there different kinds of RPZ type backflow devices?

A. Yes, but only RPZ-type devices are acceptable for lawn irrigation systems. If you have any other type of device, it will not pass the inspection.

Q. Where can I find a Cross Control Device Inspector?

A. Buffalo Grove will fax, email or mail lists of State Certified Inspectors who have completed work in the Village. Contact the Public Works Department at **847-459-2545** to obtain this list. Residents may also contact the organization BSI for a list of certified plumbers at **800-414-4990** or by visiting **bsionlinetracking.com/customer**. Road Construction Season 2019

Street Improvement Project

Reconstruction began in April and is expected to be completed in July of 2019. These improvements include full curb replacement, full pavement base and surface replacement, select sidewalk repairs and minor storm and sanitary sewer improvements.

The roads involved in this project include:

- Caren Drive from Thompson Boulevard to Thompson Boulevard
- Caren Court from Caren Drive to its end
- Ronnie Drive from Thompson Boulevard to Thompson Boulevard

The next phase of this project is set to begin this month and completed in June of 2019. These improvements include spot curb replacement, pavement surface replacement, select sidewalk repairs and minor storm and sanitary sewer improvements.

The roads involved in this project include:

- Fremont Way from Camden Court to Bristol Lane
- Fremont Way from Arlington Heights Road to Fremont Way
- Fremont Way from Route 53 to Fremont Way

Sidewalk Improvement Project

The project is scheduled to begin this June and be completed in July of 2019. Improvements will include sidewalk replacement resulting from heaved, broken or sagging sidewalks that pose potential safety issues. The map to the right details the areas of the project work. Residents whose access will be affected will receive a letter from the contractor before the work starts.

Pavement Patching Project

This project is underway and will be completed this month (May). Pavement sections are being removed and replaced in one day to help extend the life of the overall roadway. The contractor will keep the road open to traffic and will coordinate directly with any residents along the selected patch areas. The projected neighborhoods included are The Crossings, River Oaks, The Woodlands at Fiore and Old Farm Village.

Other construction projects may include sewer cleaning, sewer lining, pavement markings and a variety of other minor repairs. These types of repairs typically involve a low impact to residents, and oftentimes are completed in just a few hours.

BG Police Honor Those Killed in the Line of Duty

National Police Week

May 15 was designated as Peace Officers Memorial Day in 1962 by President John F. Kennedy, and the week that this date falls in as National Police Week. This week has become a time of remembrance, honor, and hope for law enforcement, and is when tens of thousands of law enforcement officers from around the world converge on Washington, D.C. While there, they participate in planned events that honor law enforcement professionals who have paid the ultimate sacrifice and lost their lives in the line of duty.

Beginning May 12, 2019, Buffalo Grove Police Officer Matthew Mills and Sergeant Robert Broussard will be representing the Police Department in Washington D.C. for National Police Week. They will take part in memorials honoring officers those killed in the line of duty in 2018 and attend events that bring officers from throughout the world together. Officer Mills and Sergeant Broussard will also exchange BGPD challenge coins and patches.

According to the Officer Down Memorial Page, there were 150 law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty in 2018. Those officers will be honored during the 31st Annual Candlelight Vigil, held on the National Mall on May 13. The vigil is a somber and humbling experience, where family, coworkers, and law enforcement supporters come together to share experiences, memories, and details surrounding these tragic deaths.

A visible way of participating from afar is to take part in 'Project Blue Light', which was initiated by the Concerns of Police Survivors group. Residents can replace a light inside of their homes, or exterior porch lights, with a blue light bulb that signifies their support of law enforcement. Blue light bulbs are available at the Buffalo Grove Police Department, 46 Raupp Boulevard in Buffalo Grove, free of charge.


