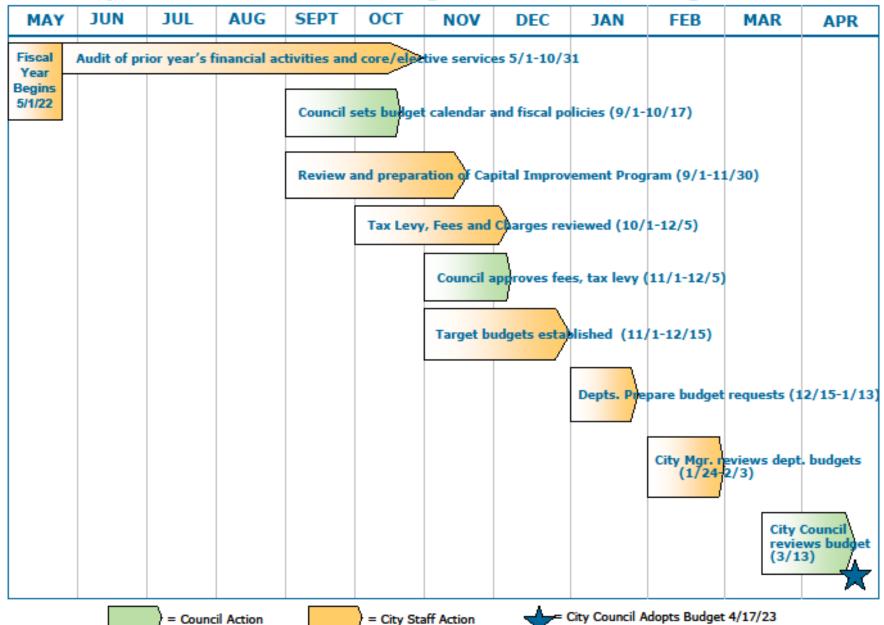

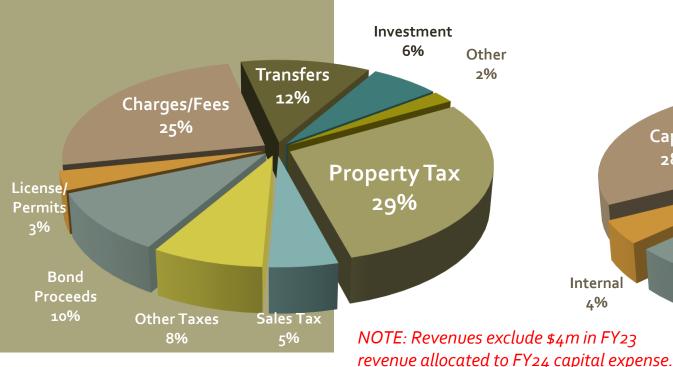

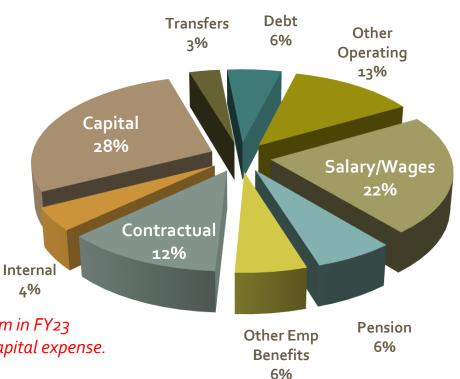
## FY24 BUDGET City Wide Budget – all Funds

Personnel costs account for 34.1% of City-wide Expenses

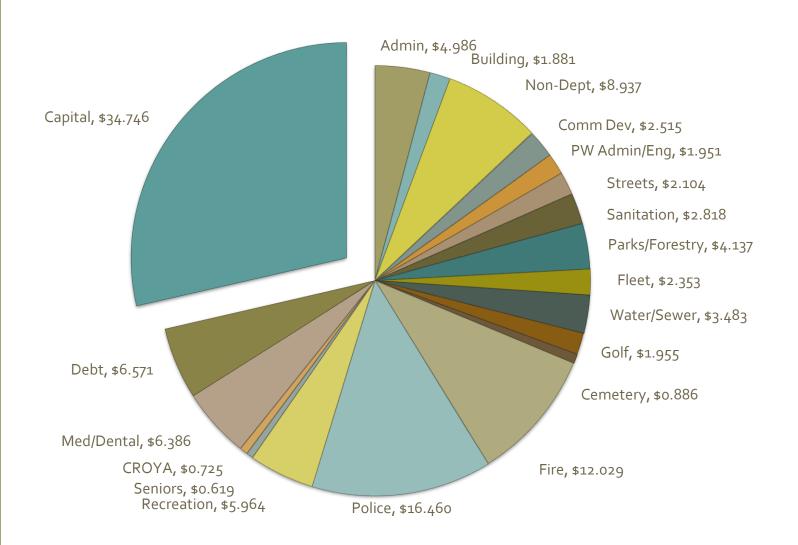


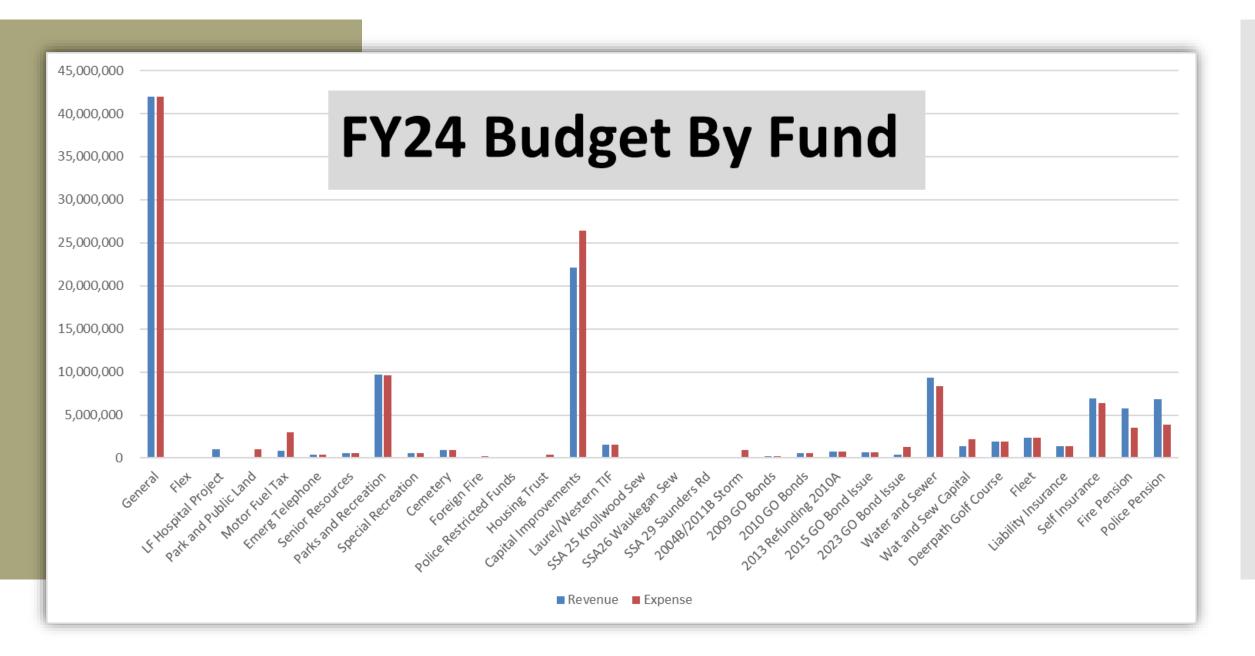

# City-Wide Expenses by Function (in Millions)

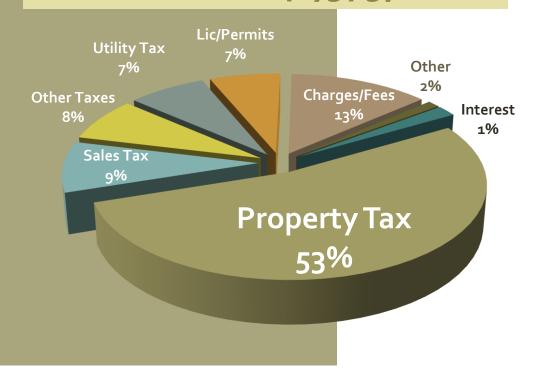




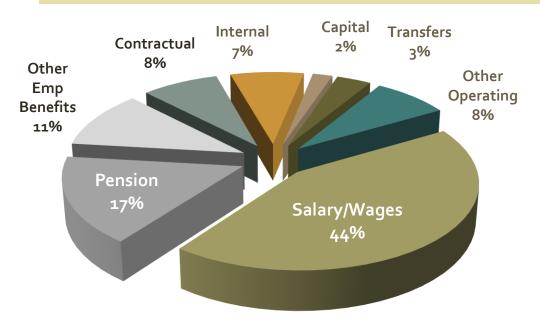
# FY24 BUDGET General Fund

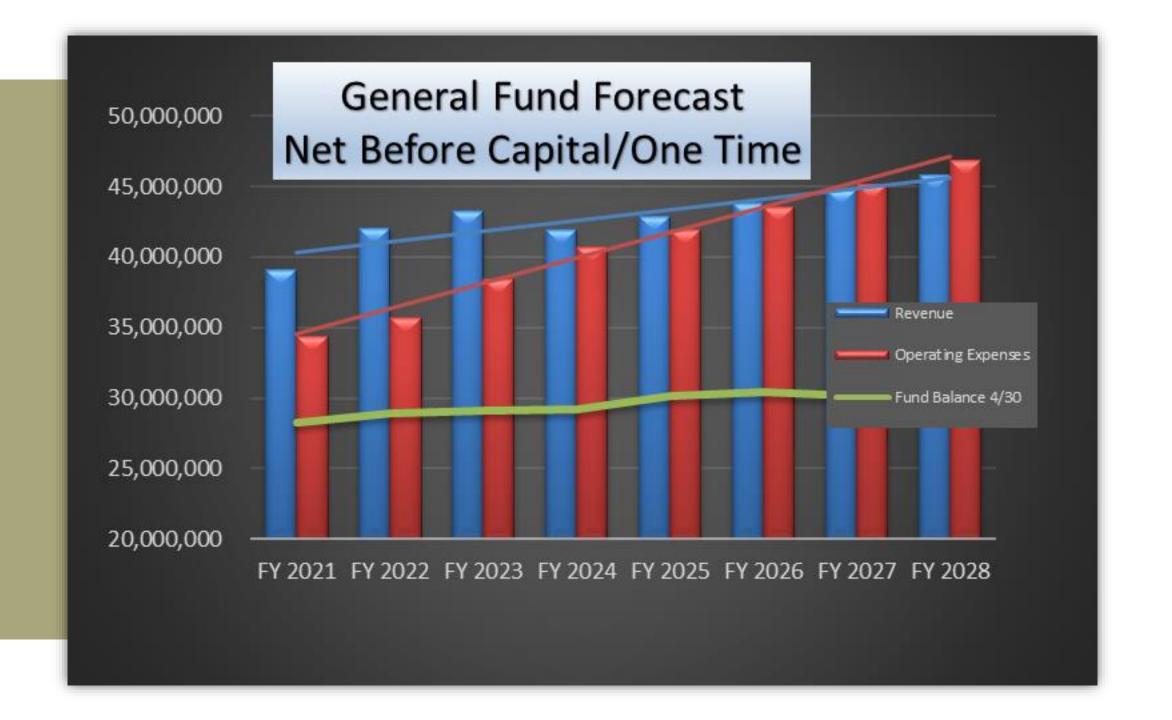
Personnel costs account for 71% of General Fund Expenses
