# HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION LOCAL HISTORIC DISTRICT NOMINATION INSTRUCTIONS

To be considered for designation by the City of Lake Forest Historic Preservation Commission, it is necessary for an applicant to complete the enclosed application form and return it to the Community Development Department. The application is designed so that it can be completed without professional assistance. The following instructions explain the most frequently misunderstood items. #### 1. NAME OF PROPERTY

#### Historic Name

This is ordinarily the first name given to the area. A name associated with the area at a later date may also be used if it can be demonstrated to have more historic validity than the name by which it was first known.

#### Common Name

This is usually the name by which the area is currently popularly identified. It may be the same as the historic name. The name of the district should reflect the area as a whole rather than specific resources within it.

#### 2. LOCATION

Either enter the inclusive street addresses, give the names for buildings and structures, or a rough description of the boundaries.

## 4. REPRESENTATION IN EXISTING SURVEYS

If you know of properties in the district nomination area that have been included in the City of Lake Forest Historic Resources Survey, the Illinois Historic Structures Survey, the Illinois Historic Landmarks Survey, or some other survey, or listed individually on the National Register of Historic Places, please indicate.

## 5. DESCRIPTION

Written Description

Provide a written description of the district including the following key elements. Use continuation sheets.

- A. Describe the general character of the district including architectural styles, scale, materials, and the general physical relationship of the buildings to each other. Include the general conditions of the buildings noting where significant alterations, additions, or restoration activities have taken place. Include in this description any outbuildings or secondary structures.
- B. Describe the natural features of the area including open spaces such as parks, wetlands, forests, and geographical and topographical features such as vistas, groves of trees, and bodies of water. Include the relationship of manmade features to the landscape including roads, fences, bridges, and vegetation.
- C. Describe the appearance of the district during the time when the district achieved significance and any changes or modifications since.
- D. Identify buildings, groups of buildings, or other resources that do and do not contribute to the district's significance. Provide a list of all resources that are contributing and non-contributing.

#### 6. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

List the predominant architectural styles of the area. If there is one or more architects, builders, or landscape architects to note in the area please list.

Written Statement of Significance

In order to designate a local Historic District, the area must be proven to possess historic significance and integrity. The significance of the district is based on compliance with one or more of the Historic Preservation Ordinance Criteria, labeled Applicable Criteria on page 2 of the nomination form.

In a brief opening paragraph, enumerate the area of significance and explain specifically why the nomination is important in each of these categories. In subsequent paragraphs, and on continuation sheets, if necessary, detail the history of the site and the people or events that have contributed to its significance. You may want to attach photocopies of documentation to support and further amplify your research.

## 7. PROPERTY DESCRIPTION

Describe the boundaries in a narrative using street names, property lines, geographical features, and other lines of convenience. Begin by defining a fixed reference point and proceed by describing the perimeter in an orderly sequence, incorporating both dimensions and direction. A map may be used in place of a verbal description.

## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

Submit the following items with the completed form:

Owners of Property: Please submit the names and addresses of the property owners within the proposed district boundaries.

*Photographs*: Representational Black and White photographs of all major facades and significant character defining details should be submitted with the nomination form. List the date and view on the back of all photos. If historic photographs are submitted please indicate the year the photograph was taken and the source of the photograph.

Additional Items: Additional visual materials may be submitted with the nomination form.
