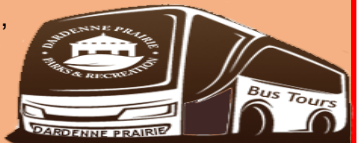
All About Herman \$75 Oct 16

### City Comprehensive Plan Update

This year the Planning and Zoning Board will begin the process of rezoning the Uptown Zoning District to either commercial or residential, potentially with existing structures grandfathered. There will be a new focus with attention on Technology Drive and Town Square.

### Easier Access to Dardenne Prairie

As of December of 2018, the City is saving and working towards potential highway improvements on MO-364 and I-64/40 to ease of the difficulties in accessing the Northwestern section of the city. Dardenne Prairie and O'Fallon cooperated to fund an engineering study the study is nearing completion. It will serve as a basis for more detailed engineering work and to gain support for county, state and potential federal funds to build the improvements.

### Help Us Manage Stormwater Pollution

When it rains, stormwater runoff flows over buildings, yards and streets. This rain water picks it debris, chemicals and other pollutants as it makes its way into the public storm sewers. Stormwater in the public storm sewer system does not receive any treatment before emptying into our local lakes and streams. You can help manage stormwater pollution by performing these simple steps:

- Properly dispose of hazardous substances such as oil, cleaning supplies, and paint. Never pour anything into a storm sewer.
- To prevent the accumulation of excess amounts of pollution in stormwater runoff, only apply pesticides and herbicides in the amounts and locations recommended by the manufacturer.
- Report any signs of soil or other debris dumping into the public storm sewer.
- Pick up after pets and dispose of their wastes in the toilet or trashcan.
- Report any unusual discharges from storm system outfalls during times of dry weather – a sign that there may be a problem.
