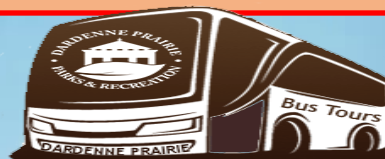

Controlling Stormwater Runoff:

Many people are unaware that a large part of water pollution in our community can be traced right back to their own backyards. Surface runoff, often called stormwater runoff, carries untreated sediments and toxins off lawns, gardens, and driveways directly into our local waterways.
