



# CHALLENGE COURT WHITEBOARD RULES



- 1. To play on the challenge court, you must have a partner. Write both your names in the first available square.**
- 2. If you do not have a partner, write your name in the first open square. Once someone has signed up to play with you, your team will be in the rotation. Until then, the team in the next completed square will go in.**
- 3. You cannot be playing on any other court while waiting for your turn on the challenge court.**
- 4. When a game ends, the winning team stays on and together, and the losing team writes their names in the next available open square if they want to play again.**
- 5. The team who is next on the board crosses out their names and goes out to challenge the winning team.**
- 6. If a team has won two consecutive games, they must exit the court and write their names in the first available square if they wish to play again.**
- 7. Court 6 is the designated challenge court. Depending on the total number of people waiting to play on the open play and challenge court sides, courts 4 and/or 5 may also be used, upon consensus among players.**

Please note: While the challenge court is intended for intermediate to advanced play, ANY team may elect to play on it, and no other player may discourage or restrict them from doing so. People electing to play on the challenge court should understand that the games will be challenging, and no players should be expected to "go easy" on anyone.

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
