SAFER Grant Awarded to Delta Township to Improve and Expand Fire and EMS Capacity

We are pleased to announce that in July Delta Township was awarded a federal Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) grant to add six (6) full-time paramedic/firefighters in July 2017. The grant will pay 75% of the salaries for year one and two, and 35% in year three. Given the increasing demand for ambulance calls and fire department runs, it was necessary to add additional capacity in order to keep service delivery to our residents at a high level. Delta Township was fortunate to receive the grant in the first year of eligibility.

Delta Township Fire Department covers 108 square miles including Delta Township and the Looking Glass Regional Fire Authority (Eagle and Watertown Townships) and has nearly 7,000 runs annually. A recruitment period will commence shortly and new paramedic/firefighters should be on board in December or January. The additional staffing helps accomplish the Delta Township Board's goal of continuing to support the delivery of excellent public safety services.

Township Updating Its Non-Motorized Transportation Plan

The Township enlisted the assistance of Rowe Professional Services Company to perform the 2017 update of the Delta Township Non-Motorized Transportation Plan which began earlier this summer. Through the course of preparing the update, there will be a number of opportunities for interested persons to provide their input.

While engaging in an update to the Non-Motorized Plan, the Township has pursued grant opportunities to expand our non-motorized system and provide for various safe transportation options for pedestrians, bikers, runners, etc. In 2017 the Township:

- Added bike lanes on Willow Hwy. from Waverly Rd. to Elmwood Rd. providing a connection from Lansing Township for bikers.
- Added a sidewalk from Elmwood to Grand Woods Park allowing safe pedestrian routes to the school.
- Applied for and received funding for bicycle lanes on Old Lansing Road. This project will likely take place in 2018/2019.
- Applied for funding from the MDOT Transportations Alternatives Program for a pathway on Old River Trail connecting Hunters Orchard and Delta Mills Park.

Grants are never a guarantee, but the Township continues to work to leverage our own tax dollars with state and federal funds to benefit our residents when opportunities arise. Safety Rules for Safe Bus Riding

School will be starting before long and in order to keep children safe while on and around buses the following rules should be followed: • Be at the bus stop early. The bus driver may not see you running for the bus if you are late; you could slip and fall under the wheels.

• Wait for the bus in a safe place away from the road and the cars that are driving by. Stay back from the curb until the bus has come to a complete stop.

• Sit down as soon as possible. There may be other people waiting to get on and if it takes too long for everyone to get on the bus other drivers may get impatient and go around the bus. Someone could get hit if this happens.

 Stay seated at all times, "back to back" and "bottom to bottom." Take off your backpack and put it in your lap.

• Keep your hands, arms, and head inside the bus at all times. A bus is wider than a car; it gets very close to trees and poles and you could be seriously injured if you have any body parts outside the bus.

Please don't eat or drink on the bus.
 You could choke on the food and the driver may not see you.

• Listen to the bus driver and follow directions. The bus driver's instructions are for your safety.

• Leave the bus carefully using the handrail so you won't fall. Take 10 giant steps past the front of the bus before crossing in front of it. You should be able to see the driver's face. Remember, if you can't see his face he can't see you.

• Wait for the bus driver's signal telling you it is safe to cross the road.

 Look LEFT, RIGHT, LEFT yourself before crossing the road. The driver may not see everything.

• Stay away from the bus if you drop or forget something. NEVER go back to pick up something in the road; get an adult to get it for you. If you forgot something on the bus, you can always get it later. The bus driver can't see you if you are too close to the bus.

Burning Permits

Delta Township residents must obtain a burning permit for any open burning (bon fires, burn barrels, etc.) within the township. Burning permits are available at no charge and may be obtained at the Central Fire Station located at 811 N. Canal Rd. during normal business hours, or via the Township's website at *www.deltami.gov*. Please call 321-6622 or visit the website for a complete list of Delta Township's burning regulations. The Delta Township Burning Ordinance is strictly enforced.

DID YOU KNOW?

Willow Highway Road and Sidewalk Construction

The Eaton County Road Commission (ECRC) has begun the resurfacing project on Willow Highway between Elmwood and Waverly Road. The scheduled completion date is the end of August 2017. The project includes: constructing new curb and gutter along both sides of Willow Highway, cold milling the existing asphalt, new asphalt surfacing, drainage improvements, realignment of the Grand Woods Drive approach, and bicycle lanes. The project is being constructed in three phases: Arden to Waverly; Arden to Grand Woods Drive; and Grand Woods Drive to Elmwood. Each phase will close that section of the road and be open to local traffic that only has access from Willow Highway. The project will be phased from east to west to limit the duration of complete road closure in each section. Questions related to road closures, detours and construction schedule should be referred to the ECRC at (877) 883-2866. Or you can visit ECRC website at http://www.eatoncountyroad.com/ projects/willow-elmwood-to-waverly.

Additionally, around July 10, a contractor hired by Delta Township, Isabella Corporation, began installation of approximately 2,800 feet of 5-foot wide concrete sidewalk on Willow Highway between Elmwood and Grand Woods Park to fill an existing "gap" in the sidewalks along Willow Highway. Delta Township staff is coordinating with homeowners in the area and will continue to coordinate construction in the summer of 2017 with the Road Commission's road project. Questions related to the sidewalk should be referred to Delta Township Engineering Department at 323-8540.

Saginaw Highway (M-43) Water Main Crossings

The Delta Township Board approved a contract with RJT Construction Company for the Saginaw Highway (M-43) Water Main Crossings. The project replaces two sections of six inch water main, approximately 100 feet in length each, crossing underneath Saginaw at Thomas L Parkway and Stone Ridge. These two locations experienced a break in the water main during the winter of 2015/2016 and were subsequently cut, capped ,and turned off while a permanent solution could be designed and bid. The designed solution involves directionally drilling a new eight inch diameter high density polyethylene water line under Saginaw at each location and connecting on the north and south sides of Saginaw to re-establish these two crossings and the water main grid reliability in the area.

Mt. Hope Park Development

Delta Township is currently working with a design professional on the design of the initial phase of development for Mount Hope Park. The first phase of the project will develop approximately 30 acres of the site for youth soccer, youth baseball, children's playground, restrooms, pavilion, non-motorized pathway, parking, and infrastructure for the park. Schematic Design is wrapping up, with confirmation of project scope and budget forthcoming. The design phase of the project is on schedule and should be completed by the end of 2017, allowing bids to be received in early 2018. It is hoped that construction can begin in early summer of 2018 with fields open for use in 2019. Stay tuned for additional updates and images as the design progresses.

Noxious Weed Ordinance

The Noxious Weeds Ordinance is in effect from **May 1 through October 31** each year. You can now submit a Noxious Weeds Ordinance Complaint online through the Delta Township website. Complaints are taken and inspected normally within a day or two. While there are many rules that determine if a lot is in violation, the main items a complainant should keep in mind are that the grass must be at most **eight inches high on average** across the lot, and the lot may not be over two acres in size. If you would like to make a complaint about a property please call 323-8540.

Two payments will be required: (1) Payable to U.S. Department of State for processing of your passport, and must be a personal check or money order as the payment is attached to the passport application and mailed to U.S. Department of State and (2) Payable to Delta Township for the acceptance fee and picture, if picture is purchased through Delta Township. What Does "Flushable" Really Mean?

Sewer utilities across the country are having a huge problem, and the problem is "flushable" products. Pre-moistened personal wipes labeled as "flushable" as well as other products like flushable toilet cleaning sponges and some women feminine products are creating an enormous problem. While these products may swirl down the toilet with ease, most don't disintegrate, creating serious problems as they work their way through aging sewage systems on their way to the treatment facility. These so-called "flushable" products cause pumps to jam, equipment to break or simply use more energy to operate. This can lead to sewage backups and potentially sewage backing up into a customer's basement. Industry experts estimate these issues cost U.S. utilities between \$500 million and \$1 billion annually to clear clogs, unjam pumps, or replace equipment altogether. The number of manpower hours to alleviate these issues is also becoming extremely burdensome to sewer utilities. Other items, such as disinfectant wipes and facial cloths not meant to be flushed are also contributing to these problems.

Utilities across the country are trying to stress to their customers the message of the "3 Ps" meaning only flush pee, poop, and toilet paper. The wastewater industry has long considered toilet paper as the benchmark for any product that is labeled as "flushable", since toilet paper is flushed constantly and utilities do not see it causing problems. Why is toilet paper ok to flush while other so-called "flushables" are not? It rapidly loses strength when it gets wet. It breaks into pieces during the flushing action of a toilet and continues to break apart simply by moving through the sanitary collection system. It does not require the force of a mechanical device to break into pieces. It has short fiber lengths that are unlikely to re-rope or entangle with other materials. It is biodegradable and will not reduce the quality of biosolids. These qualitative properties of toilet paper should apply to any product that calls itself "flushable".

So, the next time you go to do the convenient thing and flush that product, help out your sewer utility and ask yourself, is this really "flushable"? Does it appear to have the same properties as toilet paper? If the answer is no, please don't flush it. Find another way to properly dispose the items or product. Who knows, you may just be saving yourself the burden of a plugged pipe or sanitary sewer backup into your basement.

Election Workers

Delta Township depends on residents to help in the election process. The Clerk's Office is always looking for dependable citizens for our precinct polling locations and absent voter counting board, especially those with STRONG computer skills. Residents are paid for working Election Day. Anyone interested should contact the Delta Township Clerk's Office. Applications to be an election inspector are available at the Delta Township Clerk's Office or at the Township website at *www.deltami. gov* under Government and Elections and Voter Registration.

Voter Registration

For questions regarding voter registration, please contact the Clerk's Office at 323-8500. Please visit the Secretary of State website for additional voter registration information at *www.michigan.gov/sos* or the Delta Township website at *www. deltami.gov*. A person may register to vote at either a Secretary of State office or at the Clerk's Office in the township in which they reside. Updates can be made at any Secretary of State Office throughout Michigan. If you submit a driver's license address change, it will also be applied to your voter registration.

Change of Address

If you move you are required by law to update your address. This can be handled by the Clerk's Office, or at any Secretary of State Branch office. Whenever you move to a new city or township or move within your current city or township, even if the change is as minor as moving to a different apartment within the same complex, you must update your voter registration or re-register to vote. Permanent Absent Voter List Request

If you are over 60, physically challenged, or frequently out of the community, you can be placed on our permanent absent voter list to vote by absentee ballot for future elections. Our permanent absent voters will automatically receive an application for all elections that are scheduled in Delta Township. *However, the application for an absentee ballot must be completed and returned to Clerk's Office for every election,* as required by Michigan Election Law, before a ballot can be sent to the voter. Registered to Vote by Mail and First Time Voter

If you are a first time voter or first time voter in Michigan and you registered to vote by mail, you are required by law to appear in person to vote the first time voting. This is very important for those college students away at school. When you register to vote at the Secretary of State's Office or local Clerk's Office, your identity is required to be verified by showing a piece of picture identification. If you registered to vote by mail your identity was never verified therefore, you must vote in person the first time voting or appear in person at the SOS office or the Township Clerk's office to have your ID verified prior to Election Day. College bound students, especially those students leaving the community, should check with the Delta Township Clerk's Office to verify their voter registration is up to date and they qualify to apply for an absentee ballot before leaving for school. If students register to vote at the college they are attending at a voter registration drive this will change their voter registration and driver's license and the student will no longer be eligible to vote in Delta Township. It is recommended for college students to keep their home address as their voter registration address and apply for an absent ballot as they will be out of the area on Election Day. Applications for absentee ballots are available approximately three months prior to elections and ballots are available approximately six weeks prior to every election.

Acceptable Recycling Items

Delta Township's Recycling Center accepts the following products or materials to be recycled: cooking oil, polystyrene foam, household batteries (please tape the circuits on lithium, 9-volt and larger batteries), cellular phones, ink cartridges, plastics with #1-7 symbol on bottom, metals, clear and brown glass (no green, blue or frosted), paper, boxboard, CFL bulbs, and phone books. Please remove all lids and caps from plastic containers prior to recycling. Pop or beer box containers, containers designed to go in the freezer or refrigerator, or plastic containers that hazardous waste comes in, such as motor oil or anti-freeze, are not accepted. 
