Dear Residents:

Quality of life remains one of our foremost goals in Delta Township. Here are a few important updates regarding items that directly affect quality of life in Delta!

Keeping Neighborhoods Beautiful

One of the goals of the Delta Township Board is to encourage and maintain the character of residential neighborhoods. In Delta we have the good fortune of having excellent school districts, terrific parks, and quality neighborhoods where people enjoy living. This spring, the Township has developed a neighborhood beautification grant. Residential neighborhoods and neighborhood organizations can apply for matching funds for improving their identification and welcome signs to their neighborhood. Matching funds will be available on a first-come first-serve basis and typical grant awards will be \$500. This is part of the Township's goal to help create community identity, neighborhood involvement, and encourage and maintain the character of residential neighborhoods. Non-Motorized Planning

The Township has recently engaged ROWE Professional Services Company for the purposes of a Non-Motorized Transportation Plan update. Over the next six months, the Township will update and refine its current plan with a focus on developing non-motorized projects for the future. This planning process represents an important step towards prioritizing projects and developing concepts in order to apply for funding streams dedicated to non-motorized options. Citizen input, as with all planning exercises, will be an important component of the plan update. Construction Notes

Willow Highway – Will be resurfaced between Waverly and Elmwood. The project will include new asphalt, curb and gutter, and bicycle lanes. The Township will also install a sidewalk along Willow Highway from Elmwood to Grand Woods Park filling an important gap where there is not currently a sidewalk.

Broadbent/M43 Traffic signal – This project is under design and will go out for construction bids soon. Parts of Broadbent on both the north and south sides of M43 will be reconstructed and a traffic light will be installed. The project is expected to be completed by the end of summer.

Did You Know?

Remember, it ALL Drains to our Lakes and Rivers

You might not be able to see the stream or lake from your house, but it's there! It might be a small stream or ditch or even a storm drain in the street. All of these lead directly to our lakes and streams. What we do at home affects our water. So, any oil, pet waste, leaves, or dirty water from washing your car that enters a storm drain gets into our lakes and rivers without being treated. We all need to be aware of what goes into our storm drains.

What Can You Do?

You can help keep our lakes, rivers, streams, wetlands, and groundwater clean by applying the following tips.

- Sweep it. Do you have extra fertilizer, grass clippings, or dirt on your driveway or sidewalk? Sweep it back onto your lawn. Hosing your driveway sends these pollutants into storm drains that lead directly to our lakes and rivers.
- Keep it clean. Whether in the street or in your yard, remember to keep leaves, grass clippings, trash, and fertilizers away from storm drains.
- Only rain in the drain. Never dump motor oil, chemicals, pet waste, dirty or soapy water, or anything else down the storm drain. All of these materials pollute our lakes and rivers!
- Clean it. Clean up after your pet to reduce pet waste traveling to local waterways.
- Dispose of it properly. Take household hazardous waste (paint, motor oil, etc.) to a local collection event.

Having a clean environment is of primary importance for our health and economy. Clean waterways provide recreation, commercial opportunities, fish habitat, and add beauty to our landscape. All of us benefit from clean water - and all of us have a role in getting and keeping our lakes, rivers, wetlands, and groundwater clean. Vending and License Requirement

Please be aware a valid pictured vendor license is required by Township Ordinance for vending activity in the township either door-to-door or from a fixed commercial site. Vending licenses are NOT required for groups representing a school, religious organization, or charitable organization which is classified non-profit for federal internal revenue purposes. A license is also not required if vendor leaves a brochure at a resident's home and does not knock or engage the resident. Residents should ask to see a license if they are approached by a vendor if the license is not visible. If a vendor does not have a Township issued license, signed by the Township Clerk, they should contact the Sheriff's Department at 372-8217 x 2. All other questions regarding this ordinance should be directed to the Delta Township Clerk's Office at 323-8500.

Traffic Signal at Saginaw/ Broadbent Intersection

On March 6, the Delta Township Board approved a cost sharing agreement with the Eaton County Road Commission (ECRC) for the reconfiguration and widening of Broadbent approaches to Saginaw for the purposes of MDOT installing a traffic light at Broadbent and M-43. The work includes a center left turn lane, drainage work, curb and gutter, the installation of pavement for future bicycle lanes on Broadbent, sidewalk removal and replacement, and other related work. The road work at the intersection will likely require four weeks to complete, with closures necessary at the intersection on Broadbent for part of that time. This work is expected to take place this summer. The Township and ECRC were notified last year that MDOT had approved a traffic signal at that location, but intersection improvements would need to be made first. The project has been in the design phase and will soon go to bid. The ECRC will manage the project with the Township sharing in the cost.

Noxious Weeds

The Noxious Weeds Ordinance is in effect from May 1 through October 31 each year. You can now submit a Noxious Weeds Ordinance Complaint online through the Delta Township website. Complaints are taken and inspected normally within a day or two. While there are many rules that determine if a lot is in violation, the main points a complainant should keep in mind are that the grass must be at most eight inches high on average across the lot, and the lot may not be over two acres in size. If you would like to make a complaint about a property please call 323-8540.



Willow Highway Road and Sidewalk Construction

The Eaton County Road Commission will be completing a resurfacing project on Willow Highway between (Elmwood and Waverly Road) between June and August of 2017. The project will involve construction of curb and gutter, limited sidewalk ramp construction, limited storm sewer construction, and milling of 3" of asphalt and resurfacing.

The project will require road closure to through traffic during construction. The project will be phased from east to west to limit the duration of complete road closure in each section. Questions related to road closures, detours, and construction schedule should be referred to the Eaton County Road Commission at (877) 883-2866.

As part of the project, bicycle lanes will be included, completing the route between Waverly Road and Canal Road, which is a route identified by Delta Township's Non-Motorized Transportation Plan. Delta Township Staff worked with Eaton County Road Commission Staff to secure an MDOT Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) Improvement Grant of nearly \$73,000 to help fund the bicycle lane construction.

Additionally, Delta Township is finalizing the design of the sidewalk between Elmwood and Grand Woods Park, filling in a gap in sidewalk in this area. Delta Staff is coordinating with homeowners in the area and will coordinate construction in the summer of 2017 with the Road Commission's road project. Additional information will be provided when available.

Mount Hope Park Development

Delta Township recently completed an update to previously developed master plan(s) for Mount Hope Park and confirmed the project components and the anticipated level of funding needed for the initial phase of development of the park.

The site, located north of Mount Hope Highway and east of Nixon Road in Section 21 of Delta Township is 120 acres of undeveloped agricultural land acquired by Delta Township for the purposes of establishing a Township park on the western side of the Township.

The development of facilities in the western part of the township have been in discussion for nearly 20 years and the design and engineering represent the next step towards construction of the park and fulfilling that goal.

The first phase of the project will develop approximately 30 acres of the site for youth soccer, youth baseball, children's playground, restrooms, pavilion, nonmotorized pathway, parking, and infrastructure for the park.

In March, Delta Township solicited proposals from Professional Architecture and Engineering firms to design the first phase of development. Final selection of a firm is expected by early May 2017.

Delta Township desires to construct the first phase of the park during the 2018 construction season.

Do you plan to have new concrete or blacktop installed this summer?

If you plan to have blacktop or concrete laid for a sidewalk, driveway or parking lot, please call the Delta Township Utility Department at 323-8570 and let us know. Often, the covers to water shut off valves are located in these areas. We need to work with your contractor to ensure that the cover to these valves remain accessible and are not buried under new blacktop or concrete. Every water service has a shut off valve that sits under a curb box or a valve box. Curb box tops are primarily used for homes and

smaller businesses. The top of curb boxes are flat, round, made out of metal and are about 6 inches in diameter and have a



nut in the center. Valve boxes are used where a larger water pipe exists. These covers are flat, round, made of iron and approximately 10 inches in diameter. These covers sit on top of pipes that lead to shut off valves that are several

feet under the ground. It is important that covers over these valves remain accessible for a number of reasons. If the main shut off inside the building fails to work or begins to leak, we need to be able to shut the water off outside so the valve inside can be repaired. If for any reason your heat fails, the water could be shut off at the street before the plumbing freezes inside the home. In the event of fire, this is where the water is turned off to the dwelling. So, you can see that it is important for property owners as well as the Township to maintain access to these valves. Occasionally, residents need their water turned off at the street for several reasons. If the valve is not accessible, the repair cost could be quite high. Also, if the curb box on your property is too high, we can lower it for you to allow clearance for mowing.



Greetings from the Office of the Eaton County Magistrate

I recently returned from a vacation in the State of Maine and was surprised by cell phone enforcement efforts in the eastern states. Several states mandate no hand held phones while driving and the State of New York actually provides stop sites along the freeway for you to pull into to use your cell phone. I mention this to draw attention to the fact that Michigan law provides that you cannot text while driving. I find it ironic that several police agencies will propose "distracted driving" enforcement campaigns, when in fact driving while distracted is not a violation of the law. I am an advocate of being able to use a cell phone responsibly while driving however texting or anything else that focuses your attention on your phone while driving is problematic. I find it somewhat disingenuous that our lawmakers chose to enact legislation that only addresses texting while moving on a roadway while ignoring other potential hazardous situations.

Among the multitude of testimonies I hear from police officers investigating traffic crashes is that drivers were utilizing their cell phones for locating an address, returning a phone call, playing music, or performing other non-texting functions when they became involved in a traffic crash. It is apparent from my observations while driving in Delta Twp that cell phone use is prevalent. The problem for law enforcement is to determine which cell phones are being utilized for texting and which ones are not. Keep in mind, you can only be stopped if the officer believes you are texting and you are moving down the roadway. It would appear that there are two possible solutions to this problem. Self

regulation is the first. The passage of the current law making texting in motion a violation hasn't appeared to have curtailed the use of cell phones while driving. Public service announcements and enforcement efforts also have not appeared to diminish cell phone usage. Higher fines and no points added to your driving record seem to send contradictory messages. The second possible solution would be for legislation to address this issue. With the technological advances in equipment today, hands free or voice activation methods to more safely use a cell phone should be considered. Legislation should promote the driver's focus on driving while safely integrating technology to assist the driver. Legislation will not stop everyone from using a cell phone manually but the vagueness of the current law encourages cell phone use among drivers, decreases safety and diminishes the ability of police officers to enforce the law. I am not advocating a change to allow officers to take enforcement action, rather this is a driving safety issue that should be addressed. I would continue to discourage all drivers from using their cell phones while driving and if necessary pull off the roadway to place a call or send a message. Looking down at a cell phone for even a short period of time removes your attention from the roadway. At 60 MPH you are moving at approximately 90 feet per second. Try this test. Count off one second when you are driving and see how far down the roadway you have travelled. This is the distance you would have gone without seeing the road while looking at your phone. Please be safe in your travels this summer.

Grilling Safety

There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food. But, a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. They can be very hot, causing burn injuries.

Safety Tips

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings, and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

Charcoal Grills

- There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

Propane Grills

- Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year.
- If the flame goes out, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 5 minutes before re-lighting it.


