DID YOU KNOW?

Delta Patrol-Traffic Safety

The Eaton County Sheriff's Office is committed to traffic safety in Delta Township. The sheriff's office wants to remind residents to not drive distracted. Distracted driving is dangerous and can be fatal. Distracted driving is the cause of many preventable car crashes. Remind your family and friends to not drive distracted, put the cell phone down, and keep your hands on the wheel and eyes on the road.

What Is Distracted Driving?

Distracted driving is any activity that diverts attention from driving, including talking or texting on your phone, eating and drinking, talking to people in your vehicle, fiddling with the radio, entertainment or navigation system, anything that takes your attention away from the task of safe driving. Texting is the most alarming distraction. Sending or reading a text takes your eyes off the road for 5 seconds. At 55 mph, that's like driving the length of an entire football field with your eyes closed. You cannot drive safely unless the task of driving has your full attention. Any non-driving activity you engage in is a potential distraction and increases your risk of crashing.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA)

- In 2016, 3,450 people were killed nationwide in traffic crashes involving distracted driving.
- 9.2 percent of all fatal crashes in the United States in 2016 involved distracted driving.
- In 2015, 3,477 people were killed nationwide in traffic crashes involving distracted driving.
- 9.9 percent of all fatal crashes in the United States in
 2015 involved distracted driving.

According to the Michigan State Police Criminal Justice Information Center (CJIC)

- In 2016, there were 12,788 crashes in Michigan involving distracted driving, resulting in 43 fatalities and 5,103 injuries.
- In 2016, cell phones were involved in 1,912 crashes in Michigan, which is 15 percent of all distracted driving-involved crashes.
- Of the 1,912 crashes in Michigan involving cell phone use, 1,893 (99 percent) involved usage by a motor vehicle driver, 18 involved use by a bicyclist and 7 involved use by a pedestrian.
- Drivers 20 years of age or younger accounted for 347 (18.3 percent) of the 2016 motor vehicle crashes involving cell phone use.

Fats, Oils & Greases

The Delta Township Utility Department would like to remind everyone, when grease washes down the sink, it sticks to the insides of the pipes that connect your home or business to the sanitary sewer system. At some point, these fats, oils and greases may build up enough in the pipes to create a blockage. These blockages, when they occur, can be difficult and expensive to correct for both the Township and the property owner. Garbage disposals do not keep grease out of the sewer lines. Products that claim to dissolve grease may only be creating more problems by moving these substances further down the sewer line where they become even larger blockages.

Residents and businesses can help

Residents can help by:

- Not pouring grease down sink drains or toilets.
- Scraping grease and food into the trash.
- Pouring grease into a suitable container and allowing it to cool before placing in the trash.
- Try to minimize the use of your garbage disposal.

Restaurants/Businesses can help by:

- Recycling their oil and grease.
- Not pouring fats, oils and greases into sinks or floor drains
- Properly maintaining grease traps/interceptors and cleaning them at the appropriate frequency.

Fats, oils and greases that collect in sewer lines potentially lead to big problems, but there are other things that should never enter the sanitary sewer system. The following is a list of "what not to flush" that will help in minimizing mechanical problems at pump stations and the wastewater treatment plant.

They are:

- Flushable wipes, or cleaning wipes of any kind
- Paper towels
- Disposable diapers
- Feminine personal hygiene products
- Condoms
- Cotton balls and swabs
- Razor blades, needles and syringes

Remember, the only thing that should ever be flushed down a toilet is human waste and toilet paper.

Water Service Line Valves are IMPORTANT!

All water service lines have valves. The first valve is buried out by the street and is called a curb stop. This is owned and operated by the utility department. It is used



for discontinuation of service, maintenance and repair. Next, there is a valve by the water meter on the upstream or street side of the meter. This valve is typically owned by the utility department and can be operated by the homeowner and/or utility department for maintenance. Next, there is a valve on the downstream or homeowner's side of the meter. Maintenance of this valve is the responsibility of the property owner and should be used by the homeowner and/or their contracted plumber for maintenance and repair of the meter and plumbing inside the home.

It is very important that the homeowner locate and identify the valves inside the home before an emergency arises. Should a pipe break or begin to leak, these valves can be used to stop the water flow before contacting a plumber or the utility department for assistance. The sooner the water can be turned off, the less water damage there will be to the home and its contents.

Vending and License Requirement

Spring and summer is the time of year when there is an increase in vending. Please be aware a valid pictured Vendor License is required by the Township Clerk for vending activity in the township either door-to-door or from a fixed commercial site. Vending licenses are NOT required for groups representing a school, religious organization or charitable organization which is classified non-profit for federal internal revenue purposes. A license is also not required if vendor leaves a brochure at a resident's home and does not knock or engage the resident.

Residents should ask to see a license if they are approached by a vendor if the license is not visible. If a vendor does not have a Township issued license, residents should contact the Sheriff's Department at 372-8217 ext. 2. Remember, it ALL Drains to our Lakes and Rivers

You might not be able to see the stream or lake from your house, but it's there! It might be a small stream or ditch or even a storm drain in the street. All of these lead directly to our lakes and streams. What we do at home affects our water. So, any oil, pet waste, leaves or dirty water from washing your car that enters a storm drain gets into our lakes and rivers without being treated. We all need to be aware of what goes into our storm drains.

What Can You Do?

You can help keep our lakes, rivers, streams, wetlands, and groundwater clean by applying the following tips.

- Sweep it. Do you have extra fertilizer, grass clippings, or dirt on your driveway or sidewalk? Sweep it back onto your lawn. Hosing your driveway sends these pollutants into storm drains that lead directly to our lakes and rivers.
- Keep it clean. Whether in the street or in your yard, remember to keep leaves, grass clippings, trash, and fertilizers away from storm drains.
- Only rain in the drain. Never dump motor oil, chemicals, pet waste, dirty or soapy water, or anything else down the storm drain. All of these materials pollute our lakes and rivers!
- Clean it. Clean up after your pet to reduce pet waste traveling to local waterways.
- Dispose of it properly. Take household hazardous waste (paint, motor oil, etc.) to a local collection event.

Having a clean environment is of primary importance for our health and economy. Clean waterways provide recreation, commercial opportunities, fish habitat, and add beauty to our landscape. All of us benefit from clean water - and all of us have a role in getting and keeping our lakes, rivers, wetlands, and groundwater clean. Sidewalks

Just a reminder that per Delta Township Code of Ordinances Sec. 34-23 (c), it shall be the responsibility of the owner of every lot or parcel of land to maintain the sidewalks adjacent to their lot or parcel. Sidewalks must be maintained free from encroaching obstructions including, but not limited to, overhanging tree limbs, bushes, vines, fences, walls, and structures.

Old Lansing Road Bike Lanes

This project will resurface approximately 2.5 miles of Old Lansing Road between Lansing Rd and Waverly Rd in Delta Township. Work will include widening the existing pavement to provide 5' wide bicycle lanes on each side of the road and new asphalt surfacing.

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) awarded the project to the low bid of \$711,664 from Rieth-Riley Construction Co., Inc.

Federal Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) funds and Federal Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) funds will pay a combined \$520,000 of the contracted construction costs on the project. The local matching costs not covered by grant funds plus design and construction engineering will be shared by the Road Commission and Delta Township.

The project will be constructed in two phases:

Phase One between Waverly Road and Mt. Hope Highway is scheduled to be complete on May 15, 2019 barring delays due to weather. During this phase, traffic will be maintained southbound only between Waverly Road and Mt. Hope Highway. Old Lansing Road will be closed to northbound thru traffic.

Phase Two between Lansing Road and Mt. Hope Highway is scheduled to begin immediately following Phase One. Old Lansing Road will be closed to thru traffic during this phase. Local traffic will be maintained for residents and businesses.

During the project, the contractor intends to maintain mailboxes in their current locations, providing access to the mail carrier.

A rain garden is a depressed area in the landscape that collects water from roof downspouts, paved areas or sump pump discharge and allows it to soak into the ground rather than enter the storm sewer system. Less runoff from your home means less channel erosion and fewer suspended solids and pollution in the waterways. When planted with native grasses and flowering perennials, rain gardens can be a cost effective, low maintenance and beautiful way to reduce and filter runoff from your property. 2019 Voter Registration

2019 Election

The only election scheduled in Delta Township in 2019 is the Lansing School District Special Election on May 7, 2019. The only Delta Township residents impacted by this election will be those within the Lansing School District. If any other election becomes available during 2019, information will be posted on the Township website when it becomes available at www.deltami.gov.

Election Workers

Delta Township depends on residents to help in the election process. The Clerk's Office is always looking for dependable citizens for our precinct polling locations and absent voter counting board, especially those with STRONG computer skills. Residents are paid for working Election Day. Anyone interested should contact the Delta Township Clerk's Office. Applications to be an election inspector are available at the Delta Township Clerk's Office or at the Township website at www.deltami. gov under Government and Elections and Voter Registration.

Voting By Absentee Ballot

All qualified registered voters are allowed to vote by absentee ballot if an application or written request has been filed with the Clerk's Office with the following information: name, residential address, where to mail the ballot,

date of election and signature of voter. An application for absentee ballot can be found on the Delta Township website at www.deltami.gov.

The Convenience Of Voting Absentee Ballot

The Delta Township Clerk's Office maintains a Permanent Absent Voter List, which is a list of voters who regularly choose to vote by absentee ballot. From this list, Applications for an Absentee Ballot are mailed out for every election as required by Michigan Election Law. If you would like to be placed on our Permanent Absent Voter List, please contact the Clerk's Office Monday-Friday 8 a.m.-5 p.m. at 323-8500.

Frequently asked questions and answers are provided below. However, should you have additional inquiries about voting procedures please contact the Clerk's Office at 323-8500 during normal business hours, Monday-Friday from 8 a.m.-5 p.m.

Q. What steps do I have to take to receive an Application?

A. You may request to be placed on the Permanent Absentee Voter List. From that list, Applications are automatically mailed each election. If you choose to not be placed on the permanent list, you may call the Clerk's Office and request an Application be sent for any particular election.

Q. How to complete the Application?

A. The Application will either be for one or two upcoming elections. The date(s) will be printed at the top of the Application. Please verify your residential and mailing addresses, making any changes necessary. If you wish the Ballot be sent to an alternate address other than your current residence,

make sure to provide the alternate address where indicated on the Application. Sign, date and return the Application in the envelope provided.

Q. Do I qualify to receive an Absentee Ballot?

A. Under Proposal 3, a constitutional amendment passed by Michigan voters in November, 2018, EVERY Michigan voter has the right to vote by absentee ballot, no reason is required. However, you MUST return the absent voter application each election in order to receive a ballot.

Q. What happens next?

A. All applications are reviewed for completeness and signatures are compared to those in our database. Your ballot will be mailed to you at the address you indicate as soon as the ballots are available for mailing. Typically this is four to five weeks in advance of the election.

Q. What is your next step?

A. In the privacy of your home, vote the candidates and issues of your choice. Place the Ballot back in the secrecy sleeve and envelope provided. Sign the outside of the envelope where indicated. You may return the ballot via US Mail, place in the Delta Township drop box on the north drive, or hand deliver the ballot to the Clerk's Office.

Q. What if I want to vote at the precinct?

A. Simply do not fill out the absentee application and go to your precinct on Election Day to vote. Or, if you have received your Absentee Ballot, simply surrender the Ballot at your precinct on Election Day and vote in the precinct.

Q. Which elections will I receive absentee ballot applications for?

A. An application will be mailed to all voters on the Permanent AV List for any election scheduled in Delta Township.
