From the Township Board

Dear Residents:

The winter weather has arrived early to cap off a year in which we had extremely wet weather and regional flooding in the spring, a drought throughout the summer, and continuous rain in the fall. Michigan weather is becoming more unpredictable. The weather throughout the year did affect some of the many construction projects in Delta Township, but fortunately we have made tremendous progress on many of the improvements to amenities in Delta Township.

Some of the accomplishments of this past year are:

- Construction of Mount Hope Park – The first phase of the park is nearly complete with pathways to be added in the spring of 2019.
- Willow Canoe Launch is nearly complete. A floating accessible canoe launch will be added in the spring of 2019.
- Delta Mills Restrooms have been completed.
- Worked in conjunction with Eaton County Road Commission to install traffic light at Broadbent and Saginaw, and to pave Elmwood Rd. and St. Joe Highway.

We also had some very exciting economic development announcements in 2018 including:

- New 250,000 square feet expansion for Auto Owners.
- \$17 million new Cintas Development.
- Ribbon Cutting on the largest tracking solar array in the State.
- Announcement of a new \$500 million natural gas power plant to replace the Erickson Coal plant.
- Continued redevelopment along Saginaw.
- Delta Township recognized for the fifth straight year as a 5-star economic development community from UofM-Dearborn's iLabs' eCities research.

We hope you enjoy this news and the services provided by Delta Township. We are excited about what is to come in 2019. We will continue to focus on creating quality of life now and into the future, and continue to do so in a financially responsible way.

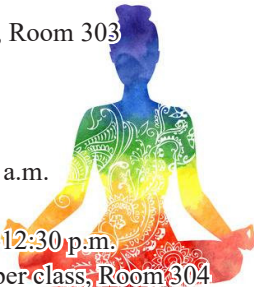

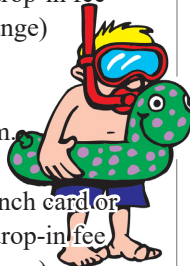

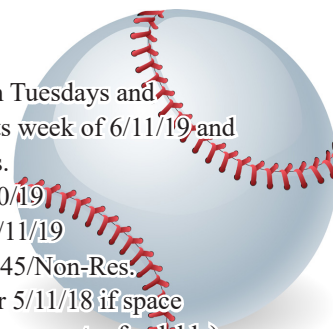

Awards Reception a Huge Success

Delta Township hosted the 13th Annual Delta Township Community Awards Event on October 25 at the Crowne Plaza Lansing West. Over 250 people gathered to celebrate the outstanding individuals, businesses, and organizations that were honored during the event.

The Township presented five awards this year including: Business of the Year, Community Organization of the Year, Young Person of the Year, Citizen of the Year, and the Township Legacy Award. The Young Person of the Year was also presented with a \$2,000 Scholarship sponsored by the Delta Side Business Association.

The 2018 Delta Township **Legacy Award** was presented to **Janicé A. Vedder**. Janicé A. Vedder served as the Delta Township Clerk for twenty-three years, where she oversaw the record keeping and election processes for the Township. She also served on several Township boards and committees including the Planning Commission, Zoning and Sign Board of Appeals, Election Committee, Library Committee, Utility Committee, and Environmental Committee. She was a leading advocate for street lights, sidewalks, and recycling, and was an early advocate of shared services.

Ms. Vedder became Delta Township's first Certified Municipal Clerk and obtained a Master Municipal Certified Clerk designation. She was recognized as an election authority and was sought out by state and federal elected officials for her expertise and was asked to serve on a number of committees including a Special Committee on Voter Registration, a Special Committee on

the Qualified Voter File, and for the Help America Vote Act Committee. Additionally, she was appointed to serve on the statewide non-partisan Election Committee, where she received a national award for her bar coding of elections, registration, and absentee applications, which served as the basis of the Qualified Voting File (QVF) program still used today.

Janicé Vedder was a statewide leader in advancing fair and efficient elections by supporting early voting, no reason absentee ballots, consolidated elections, bar coding of registration and ballots, recruiting the best election workers and providing effective training for staff and election workers. She was the co-founder and former president of the Capital Area Municipal Clerk's Association, as well as, one of the founding members of the statewide Council of Election Officials, and was its longest serving member.

Janicé Vedder's advanced strong fiscal policies helped to ensure that the Township maintained a balanced budget, was transparent, and was in a financial position to weather the recession without loss of services or employee layoffs.

Ms. Vedder was always focused on providing the best possible service to residents through selling bus passes, vendor licenses, deleafing bags, and passports. A wealth of knowledge, she easily answered residents' questions and explained how local government works to school children.

In addition to her role as a clerk, Ms. Vedder was a leading advocate for a viable and modern public library and

was instrumental in establishing the Delta Township District Library. She helped to establish the Delta Township Historical Society, aiding in saving and restoring important historical Township records.

Lastly, Ms. Vedder has a rich history of putting others first as was demonstrated by her devotion to the Delta Township community and to her husband and two sons.

The 2018 **Citizen of Year Award** was presented to **Xavier DeGroat**. Xavier DeGroat is an exceptional individual whose own struggles have inspired him to find a way to aid those in similar situations. As a young child Xavier was diagnosed with autism, but he has not let that stop him from defining his own identity. He has endured bullying, harassment and discrimination, but through it all, he has managed to overcome the social obstacles to become a global advocate for those with autism. DeGroat has traveled across America to meet with leaders in various areas; from politicians to celebrities, sports legends, journalists and influential activists, to educate them on issues that exist in their industry or community. The long and difficult path Xavier traveled to bring this information to others inspired him to truly make a difference. Earlier this year, with the support of some extraordinary and influential people, he founded The Xavier DeGroat Autism Foundation (XDAAF). The mission of the XDAAF is to provide support to individuals and families of those with autism by providing them with opportunities to become economically, socially and politically successful. The foundation is dedicated to advocating on behalf of those with autism, which could

mean pushing for equal treatment in employment and housing or combating other injustices against those with the diagnosis.

The 2018 **Young Person of the Year Award** was presented to **Scott Thomas**. Scott Thomas is a senior at Grand Ledge High School and was nominated for his dedication and excellence in academics, athletics, and volunteerism. He loves academics and is always striving to do his best, never shying away from a challenge. Scott is a top rated archer where he is a leader and inspiration to his teammates. Additionally, he is a true public servant through his volunteerism with Key Club where he has lead several community service initiatives including clothing drives for Homeless Angels and a Smoke Detector Installation Program. Even in the midst of his own personal struggles which include the recent loss of his

father to leukemia, Scott's positive attitude remains infectious and is a true inspiration to all that meet him.

The 2018 **Business of the Year** was presented to **Chick-fil-A Lansing**. Chick-fil-A Lansing opened in October 2016 as the first Chick-fil-A in Michigan! It is owned by U.S. Air Force Veteran and Michigan native, Kate McNerney. Her business's mission is to be a home away from home in the community, nourishing and flourishing together. Chick-fil-A's goal is to support educational programs, first responders, military, firefighters, and police through food and community enrichment donations. Since arriving in Delta, they have been avid supporters and sponsors of Delta Township events including Delta Rocks! Family Festival where they handed out 600 sandwiches to attendees, the Delta Township Fireworks Display, and the Delta Township Community Awards event.

The 2018 **Community Organization of the Year** was presented to **St. David's Episcopal Church**. Founded in 1962, St. David's Episcopal Church has been a dedicated member of the Delta Township Community. More specifically, St. David's has made a significant effort to help serve the senior community here in Delta. Their St. David's Senior World Luncheon Program got its start in 1996 when a small group of women from St. David's, residents of the Senior World Housing Complex (now called Lansing Manor) met for lunch and Bible Study. As the program grew larger, they held it at St. David's Church and it shifted its focus to include inspirational teaching, music, as well as prayer. From its small beginnings it has grown to host an average of 60 people. The church also provides free Eattran transportation to those who come from the various housing facilities. Congratulations to all of this year's honorees!

Should You be Paying City Income Tax?

With income tax time rapidly approaching, Delta Township wants to eliminate some of the confusion residents have regarding the issue of City of Lansing income tax. Delta Township does not have an income tax. Some Delta residents with a Lansing address may believe they owe city income tax; or, more frequently, their employer may have withheld city income tax over the year.

Many times an employer will automatically withhold taxes when the address is Lansing. A Lansing address relates only to the United States Postal authorities for delivering mail. A Lansing address may mean that a person lives in Delta Township and therefore is not subject to city tax.

- Persons living in the City of Lansing pay a one percent tax, no matter where they work.
- Delta residents that work in the City of Lansing, pay one-half percent income tax.
- The following businesses located in Delta are subject to city income tax: GM-Delta Manufacturing Complex, located on Millett Highway, YanFeng, Bridgewater Interiors, L.L.C., and Avancez (former name Android).
- Delta residents that do not work in the City of Lansing or at one of the above identified businesses, do not owe city income tax.

Delta residents that live and work in Delta Township do not pay income tax other than businesses listed above.

Residents that are registered to vote in Delta Township or pay their water and sewer bill to Delta Township are Delta Township residents.

If residents discover that their employer withheld City or Lansing taxes in error, simply contact the clerk's office and they will provide the employer with proper identification.

Park Shelter & Pavilion Rentals

Delta Township park shelters and pavilion are available for rental. Shelters can be rented at Sharp Park, Delta Mills, and Grand Woods. The pavilion at Grand Woods is available for rental as well. Most shelters include access to electricity, grills, restrooms, and playgrounds.

Community Center

The Community Center is located on the corner of Canal Road and Willow Highway and features a bi-level floor plan that seats up to 100 people on the upper floor and 70 people on the lower floor. The entire building is handicap accessible, air-conditioned, and non-smoking. Use of the kitchen, oven, stove, sink, electricity, tables, and chairs are included in the rental.



Enrichment Center

The Enrichment Center is located at 4538 Elizabeth Road and has an Activity Room and several classrooms that can be reserved. The entire building is handicap accessible, air-conditioned, and non-smoking. Activity Room rentals can accommodate up to 75 people and include use of the kitchen, sink, refrigerator, microwave, electricity, tables, and chairs. Classroom rentals can accommodate up to 40 people and include use of electricity, tables, and chairs.

ELECTIONS

2019 Voter Registration

For questions regarding voter registration or elections, please contact the Clerk's Office at 323-8500. Please visit the Secretary of State website for additional election information at www.michigan.gov/sos or the Delta Township website at www.deltami.gov.

A person may register to vote at either a Secretary of State office or at the Clerk's Office in the township in which they reside. Updates can be made at any Secretary of State Office throughout Michigan. If you submit a driver's license address change, it will also be applied to your voter registration. A voter registration form can be mailed to your local clerk.

2019 Elections

At this time there are no elections scheduled in 2019 for Delta Township. Election information will be updated if needed on Delta Township website (www.deltami.gov). Residents should refer to their voter identification card for proper precinct number and polling location. If your voter identification card has been lost, call the Clerk's office to have a replacement card to be mailed.

Election Workers

Delta Township depends on residents to help in the election process. The Clerk's Office is always looking for dependable citizens for our precinct polling locations and absent voter counting board, especially those with STRONG computer skills. Residents are paid for working Election Day. Anyone interested should contact the Delta Township Clerk's Office. Applications to be an election inspector are available at the Delta Township Clerk's Office or at the Township website at www.deltami.gov under Government and Elections and Voter Registration.

Military and Overseas Voter Empowerment Act ("MOVE Act")

The MOVE Act was signed into law in 2009 affording all active uniformed service, spouse, dependents, and merchant marine, stationed inside or outside the United States and civilians residing indefinitely or temporarily overseas the option of requesting an "electronic" transmitted, faxed or mailed absentee ballot. The voter must submit a written request or utilize the FPCA form requesting ballot every calendar year (January 1-December 31), and must be filled out in its entirety. The FPCA completed form can be utilized to register to vote and/or apply for absentee ballot and can be emailed to Delta-tw@miqvf.org or faxed to 323-8599 to the attention of the Clerk's Office. The FPCA form used for this request is available at our website at www.deltami.gov for your convenience. Additional information including contact information for Michigan's city and township clerks, sample ballots for you to view for upcoming election or candidate and proposal information can be viewed through the Michigan Voter Information Center (MVIC) Web site maintained by the Michigan Department of State at www.michigan.gov/vote.

Permanent Absent Voter List Request

Registered voters upon request can be placed on our permanent absent voter list to vote by absentee ballot for future elections. Our permanent absent voters will automatically receive an application for all elections that are scheduled in Delta Township. However, the application for an absentee ballot must be completed and returned to Clerk's Office for every election, as required by Michigan Election Law, before a ballot can be sent to voter. 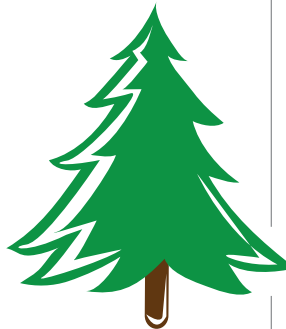

Acceptable Recycling Items

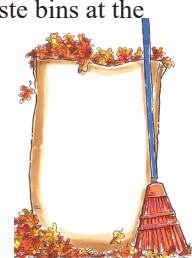
Delta Township's Recycling Center accepts the following products or materials to be recycled: cooking oil, polystyrene foam, household batteries (please tape the circuits on lithium, 9 volt and larger batteries), and cellular phones, ink cartridges, plastics with #1-7 symbol on bottom, metals, clear and colored glass, paper, boxboard, CFL bulbs, and phone books. Please remove all lids and caps from plastic containers prior to recycling. Pop or beer box containers, containers designed to go in the freezer or refrigerator, or plastic containers that hazardous waste comes in, such as motor oil or anti-freeze, are not accepted. For a complete listing of items accepted at the Delta Township Recycling Center and to obtain the monthly recycling newsletter visit www.deltami.gov.

Metals Accepted Year-Round

Below is a listing of metal items accepted year round at the Recycling Center. All items must be 80% metal or more to be accepted for recycling. The listing is not limited to the items below, but is a general listing. If you have a question regarding the acceptance of an item, please ask the recycling center attendant: appliances – washers, dryers, cook stoves, water heaters, water softeners, furnaces, steel dishwashers (no all plastic dishwashers), steel and aluminum lawn furniture or swing sets, lawn mowers, rototillers, weed whackers, spreaders (fluids must be drained), gas and charcoal grills, pots and pans, basketball poles (no cement), wire or metal fencing bundled, fence poles (no cement), metal cabinets and shelving, metal yard ornaments, steel doors and storm doors with glass removed, scrap metal, sheet metal, cast iron, metal sinks and metal burning barrels (must have open tops and be clean). **NO GAS OR OIL CANS ARE ACCEPTED.** Tin and aluminum cans (cleaned and flattened), as well as items mostly composed of metals will be accepted.

Yard Waste Not Accepted December – March

Yard waste is not accepted during the winter months of December through March. The yard waste bins at the recycling center are removed for the winter. **Yard Waste Recycling will be accepted starting April 3, 2019.**

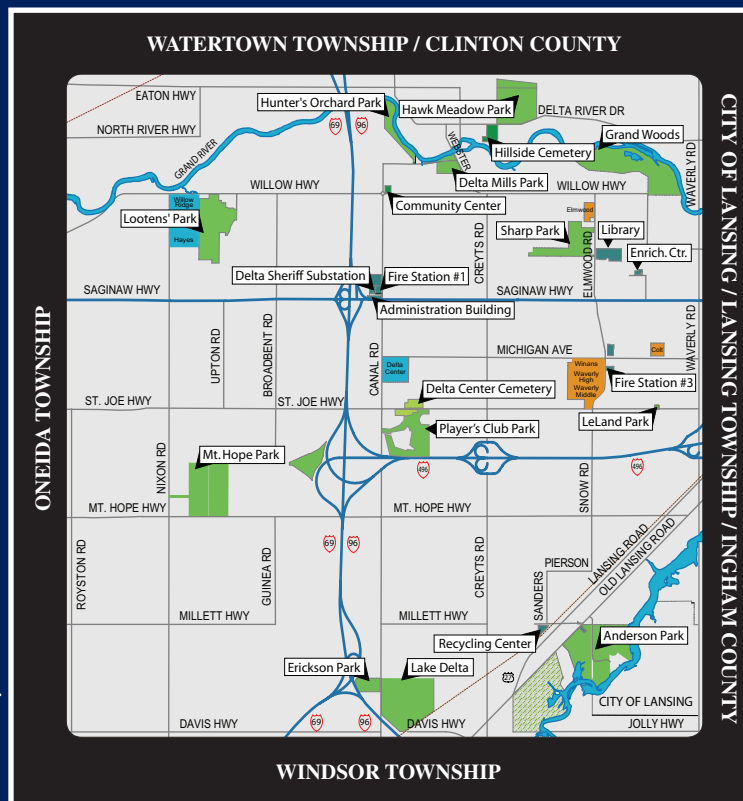
