from the township board

Dear Residents:

2020 has certainly been a year we will never forget. The pandemic has affected all our daily lives and routines. Sadly it has affected the programming we can offer in the short-term. Fortunately, throughout the pandemic, Delta residents have many beautiful parks to enjoy and utilize while other recreational opportunities are temporarily restricted.

The Township invests into its parks utilizing grant programs through the Michigan Department of Natural Resources. Recent examples include the new Mount Hope Park, Old River Trail Pathway connecting Delta Mills and Hunters Orchard, Willow Canoe Launch, and the redesigned Delta Mills Canoe launch.

The Delta Park system provides amenities for everyone of all age groups. We have additional improvements on the way slated for next year including:

- 1. Delta Mills Restroom Renovation Renovate an old wellhouse into restroom building on east side of park near Webster.
- 2. Hunter's Orchard Park Pathway Complete a 10 foot wide pathway to create a fully accessible nature trail within the park.
- 3. Mount Hope North Baseball Fields two additional ballfields to complete a quad of diamonds.
- 4. Mount Hope Park Perimeter Pathway A 10 foot wide pedestrian pathway along the north and west boundaries of Mount Hope Park creating a large loop to connect in with existing pathways.
- 5. Hawk Meadow Pathway Paving Pave existing pathways on the western boundary of Hawk Meadow.

In the absence of our full compliment of youth, adult, and senior programs, these grants and parks investments are critical to providing recreational opportunities close to home.

Election News:

The primary election on August 4 had a record number of voters for a primary. It was the first primary election in which any registered voter could vote by absentee ballot for no reason. The Clerk's office issued 10,590 ballots absentee ballots. Of those, 8,191 were returned for a return rate of 77%. In addition, 2,073 cast ballots at the polls on August 4.

We will need election workers for precinct polling locations in November. If you are interested, please contact the Delta Township Clerk's office at 323-8500.

aquatics & events

The Delta Enrichment Center (4538 Elizabeth Road) is home to the Aquatics Office. The pool is located at Waverly East Intermediate School (3131 W. Michigan Ave.) Enter Through Door # 14.

In the event that the Waverly Schools are closed due to inclement weather, all pool activities will be cancelled that day. Information on possible closings can be obtained by calling 484-9322. No street shoes are allowed on the pool deck. Swimmers must shower before use. Infants must wear a swim diaper (not a regular diaper) in the pool. All participants are expected to wear appropriate swimming attire, which must respect the comfort and modesty of others. No persons over the age of 5 are allowed in opposite gender locker rooms.

The pool will be closed on the following dates:

September 5-7, 2020 November 26-29, 2012 December 23, 2020-January 3, 2021

You may purchase punch cards: 1- At the Delta Aquatics Office, located inside the Delta Enrichment Center. Office hours are Monday-Friday, 10 a.m.-3 p.m. Cash, Check and Debit/Credit Cards are accepted. 2- On the pool deck with a check (made payable to: Delta Township); sorry no cash or credit cards are accepted on the pool deck. 3- Over the phone at 484-5600. Visa, MasterCard, American Express, and Discover are accepted. Phone orders will be delivered to the pool twice a week. Refunds will not be issued for new or partially used punch cards.

Covid-19 Information

Due to the Covid -19 pandemic all the dates and times are tentative and dependent on the state of Michigan and Waverly schools reopening the indoor pool.

Delta Township will be doing everything they can to hold activities safely after the pool does reopen. We will be following all national, state and local guidelines to help combat the spread of the corona virus. A few of the things we will be doing are to: clean the locker rooms and pool areas at least once a day.

All staff will be wearing masks when not in the water. Capacity for classes may be limited in order to comply with accepted social distancing guidelines.

Delta Township is also asking for your help to limit the spread of the virus.

This includes asking patrons to not come to the pool if experiencing any signs or symptoms of the Covid-19 virus.

To not attend the pool if you come in contact with anyone with the virus.

Patrons will be required to wear a mask upon entering the building and leave it on until the exit except for while they are in the pool or showering.

If you are in the higher risk category for the Covid -19 virus we recommend that you do not attend any aquatics activities until it is considered safe to do so by medical personal.

Additional requirements may become necessary and will be communicated as soon as they are determined to be needed.

To Flush or not to Flush?

During the coronavirus or COVID-19 pandemic, many local stores are finding it harder if not altogether impossible to keep toilet paper in stock. People began hoarding it shortly after the first cases of coronavirus appeared in the United States. Many customers may have already found themselves in the position of having to use alternatives to toilet paper. Utility workers across the country understand the challenges that people face because of the shortage of toilet paper, but customers need to understand the consequences of flushing alternatives down their toilets.

Many customers have the mindset that they want to flush wipes and other paper/cloth items to get the germs out of the house, but these items are not designed to break up in the wastewater. By design, toilet paper is made to break down when it's flushed. By the time it reaches the treatment plant, it has completely disintegrated into very fine parts that do not affect pumps and other operations at the treatment facility. Now is not the time to flush anything other than toilet paper, even if the package says it's flushable, please do not flush. Even these "so-called" flushable wipes or disinfectant cleaning cloths can bind with fats, oils and grease and wreak havoc at a nearby lift-station or even your own home's plumbing.

If a backup occurs inside the homeowner's house or in pipes on private property, it is the owner's responsibility for fixing and paying for any cleaning or damages. Also, from a community and public health perspective, it is critical that wastewater treatment plants continue to operate properly so they can disinfect sewage and avoid untreated discharges.

Utilities across the country are trying to stress to their customers the message of the "3 Ps" meaning only flush pee, poop, and toilet paper. The wastewater industry has long considered toilet paper as the benchmark for any product that is labeled as "flushable", since toilet paper

is flushed constantly and utilities do not see it causing problems.

Please remember: just because you CAN, doesn't mean you SHOULD!

These items should not be flushed:

- Paper Towels
- All-purpose cleaning wipes (even if packaging says flushable)
- Facial Tissues
- Baby or personal hygiene wipes
- Disposable diaper liners
- Cotton Swabs
- Feminine Hygiene Products
- Napkins
- Cat Litter
- Fats, Oils, and Grease
- Food Scraps

So, the next time you go to do the convenient thing and flush that product, help out your sewer utility and ask yourself, is this really "flushable"? Is it only one of the three Ps? If the answer is no, please don't flush it. Find another way to properly dispose the items or product.

Mercury A Persistent Problem

Persistent: Existing for a long or longer than usual time or continuously; continuing to exist despite interference or treatment; degraded only slowly by the environment [Merriam Webster]. Mercury is a persistent pollutant! Once it reaches the environment it can remain in sediment and be released into the water for a long time. The Delta Township Utility Department remains persistent in our efforts to make sure that less mercury is being discharged; however, we are finding that despite efforts at "interference or treatment" mercury is a persistently difficult pollutant to reduce or eliminate. We have made some progress but continue to need the support of our residents.



The good news in the ongoing battle is that we are beginning to see a consistent reduction in amount of mercury received at the treatment facility which results in lower levels remaining following treatment and less going into the environment.

There is a large component to controlling mercury that the Utility Department has no control over, however, and that is the mercury that could potentially be discharged from homes. If you have never completed an inventory of your home to identify sources of mercury it would be beneficial to do so. Items that could potentially have mercury include: thermometers, thermostats, fluorescent lamps, mercurochrome, button-cell batteries, some older paints, chemistry sets and weights/counterweight in grandfather clocks. If you feel you have been exposed to mercury and have questions about potential health affects you can call your local poison control center at 1-800-222-1222.

Most importantly, NEVER DISPOSE OF MERCURY BY FLUSHING DOWN A DRAIN OR TOILET! This includes any residual powder that might result from breaking one of the new high efficiency light bulbs. These bulbs contain low levels of mercury so handle with care!

2020 Scheduled Elections

November 3, 2020 – General Election

Voter Registration Deadline – Election Day - Tuesday, November 3, 2020

The General Election, scheduled both state and nationally, will be electing the President of the United States on November 3, 2020, along with many more partisan, and non-partisan offices. In a General Election all parties (Republican and Democrat and minor parties; Green, Libertarian, Natural Law, U.S. Taxpayers and Working Class) that are represented in Michigan will be on the ballot. In General Elections voters have the choice of voting; "Straight Ticket" Vote the party of your choice. Nothing further needs to be done in the partisan section of the ballot. "Split Ticket" Voters may vote a straight ticket AND vote for individual candidates of your choice or "Mixed Ticket" Vote for the individual candidates of your choice in each office. The Nonpartisan and Proposal Sections of ballot must be voted separately. When voters choose to vote each office individually the only restriction is, voters must only vote for the number of candidates allowed to be elected as identified under the office heading for each office on the ballot. If the voter votes for more candidates than is allowed the votes within that office will not count. In a precinct, if voter does over-vote or makes any other mistake, the voter should let an Election Inspector know so the ballot can be spoiled and replaced to vote correctly. If you are voting by absent voter ballot, please contact the Clerk's Office at 323-8500 for

instructions on how to spoil, return the spoiled ballot, and get a new ballot issued. If residents will be out of the community on Election Day or need any information regarding the upcoming election, contact the Township Clerk's Office at 323-8500.

The Delta Township Clerk's Office will be open for extended hours on the following dates to process voter registration applications and absent voter applications for the November 3, 2020, General Election.:

New Rights for Michigan Voters - Registering to Vote through Election Day

Proposal 3 "Promote the Vote" was a Constitutional Amendment that was passed overwhelmingly by Michigan voters in the General Election in November of 2018 by a margin of 66.8% Yes and 33.2% No. This constitutional amendment brought about the following changes for Michigan Voters for voter registration:

Registering to Vote up to 15 days prior to Election:

Register to vote at:

- Any Secretary of State branch office
- Your township, city or county clerk's office
- A designated state agency
- By Mail
- Online through Secretary of State Office (will be available by end of 2019).

Register to Vote – 14 days before election and including Election Day (Same Day Registration):

Register to vote at:

- Voter must appear in person at the Delta Township Clerk's Office during regular business hours and up until 8 p.m. on Election Day. Residency and identification verification will be required. Documents must have the voters name and current Delta Township address. Digital copies are acceptable.
- Additional weekend hours will be available the weekends prior to each scheduled election. Contact the Delta Township Clerk's Office at 323-8500 for additional information.

Can I register to vote at my polling precinct on Election Day?

NO, if you are not registered before Election Day, you must register in person to at the Delta Township Clerk's Office. A voter registering Election Day has choice to either vote by absentee ballot at the Clerk's Office, or to take their registration receipt to their precinct and vote, the close of polls is 8 p.m.

New Rights for Michigan Voters – Voting by Absentee Ballot

All REGISTERED VOTERS are eligible to receive an absentee ballot once a written request or application has been received. A "reason" is no longer required under the Michigan Constitution.

Absent Voter Automatic Application List

Delta Township maintains a list of voters who automatically are mailed an application for an absentee ballot for all elections scheduled in Delta Township. A voter can request to be placed on the "automatic application list". Once an application is returned and ballots are available, the ballot will be mailed to voter. A Voter can vote the ballot in comfort of their home and then return ballot by mail, in person to the Delta Township Clerk's office or drop off at gray drive up night deposit box located on north side of Delta Township Administration Building.

To be placed on our Automatic Absent Voter Application List please call the Clerk's Office Monday-Friday 8 a.m.-5 p.m. at 323-8500. If you would like to sign up electronically go to the Delta Township website at www.deltami.gov. Select the Government heading at top and from drop down list click on Election and Voter Registration. Select the Absent Voter Information tab and go to "Automatic Absent Voter List Request" and complete form online. An application for an absent voter ballot will be sent for all scheduled elections in Delta Township.

Picture ID Requirement When Voting in Michigan

Michigan voters who vote at the polls and in person absent voter requests must comply with the requirement of showing picture identification. The most common sources of picture identification are your driver's license or a state ID card. The following forms of picture identification may also be used if they are current:

• Federal or state governmentissued photo identification (Driver's license or state identification card from any state).

- U.S. passport
- Military ID card with photo
- Student ID card with photo from high school or an accredited institution of higher education
- Tribal ID card with photo.

Voters without picture identification: Michigan election law anticipates that not all voters will have picture identification. Voters who do not bring picture identification to the polls or do not possess picture identification can vote by signing an affidavit of voter not in possession of identification.

Election Worker Recruitment

Delta Township is seeking election workers for the following positions: electronic pollbook inspectors, help desk inspectors, general inspectors, absent voter counting board inspector, precinct chairpersons, absent voter counting board chairperson and chairs in training to work elections. November 3 is the remaining Election Day for 2020. All positions are paid positions. Chairpersons are paid \$18/hour, Chairs in Training are paid \$15/hour, and Help Desk Inspector, Electronic Poll Book Inspector, and General Inspectors are paid \$12/hr. All required training is paid at the hourly rate applicable for the position you are hired for. To qualify to work in Delta Township, an individual must be a registered voter within state of Michigan, have no felony convictions, complete an application, and attend mandatory training prior to every election. The positions require applicants to be available for long hours on Election Day.
