Delta Energy Plant

On August 23, the Delta Township Board, along with the entire Lansing Region celebrated the grand opening of the Lansing Board of Water & Light's (BWL) Delta Energy Plant. The new natural gas-fired plant replaces outdated coal-powered plants and can generate 250 megawatts. The new facility is also significantly cleaner, more reliable, and more efficient to run. Delta Township

is proud to be the home of Mid-Michigan's newest clean energy source, making our community and the surrounding areas more attractive and cost-efficient options for substantial economic development now and into the future.

Amazon Warehouse

Progress continues at Amazon's onemillion sqft warehouse facility located near Creyts Rd. and I-496. The building is expected to be completed in 2023 and fully operational in 2024.

Ultium Cells Plant

Ground clearing and footing placements are underway at the future site of the

Ultium Cells Battery plant located West of GM's Delta Plant. Delta Township staff and consultant continue to work with Ultium on infrastructure needs for 2.8 million sqft facility, which is estimated to be completed by 2025.

Delta Township Public Safety Millage Proposals




Delta residents will be asked to consider two ballot proposals in November that if approved by the voters would aid the Township in maintaining and enhancing public safety for its citizens and provide an adequate facility for deputies and the community.



Proposal 1: Operating Millage

The operating millage will levy a tax of up to 1 mill (\$1.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) on all taxable property in the Township, over a period of ten years for the purpose of providing funds for police, fire, and public safety operating expenses, services, and contract services.




Proposal 2: New Sheriff's Substation Bond

The bond proposal will levy a tax of approximately 1 mill (\$1.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) on all taxable property in the Township, over a period of ten years, to pay for the issuance of up to \$15 million in bonds for the purpose of building a new Sheriff's Substation to replace the current facility.

If Approved, These Proposals Would Allow Delta Township To:






Maintain response times

Increase energy efficiency and provide for upgraded technology

How Would This Affect Taxpayers?

If both millages pass, the average property owner in Delta Township can expect to pay an additional \$200 in taxes per year (equivalent of \$16.67 per month) based on an average home market value of \$200,000 and a taxable value of \$100,000.

Approximate Market Value	Taxable Value	Cost Per Year for 2 Mills	Cost Per Month

To calculate the exact amount, divide your taxable value by 1,000 and multiply by two.

Over the past several months, the Delta Township Saginaw Highway Corridor Improvement Authority (CIA) has held panel discussions with various stakeholders as they begin the process of putting together a corridor improvement plan.

To kickoff these panel discussion the CIA Board heard from Transportation entities including MDOT, Eaton County Road Commission (ECRC), CATA, EATRAN, the Capital Area Disability Network, Tri-County Regional Planning Commission, and the Tri-County Bicycle Association to share their thoughts on the overall traffic history and characteristics, the future of the corridor, and the opportunities and challenges of public and multi-modal transportation options.

They have also hosted members of other area CIA boards to discuss their challenges and insights to possible opportunities for our CIA.

Waverly Pool Closed for Much Needed Renovations

Recently, the Delta Aquatics center, located at Waverly East Middle School was closed as the school district moves forward with significant renovations to the pool and surrounding facilities.

These major renovations will provide Delta Township residents with sub-

stantial upgrades to the pool area, entrance, and locker rooms including new family-friendly bathrooms.

Delta Breaks Ground on the New Water Resource Recovery Facility

On June 7, Delta Township broke ground on Phase 1 of the new Water Resource Recovery Facility (WRRF).

This major capital improvements project has been in the planning and preparation phase for nearly four years and the Township is extremely excited to get the construction phase underway.

Additionally, the project will not only replace nearly 40-year-old equipment and structures but will help to expand plant capacity for current and future growth, as well as help to meet stricter



water discharge standards improving the water quality in the Grand River and surrounding water tables.

Delta Achieves Gold Status as Green Community

In May, Delta Township was recognized with a Gold Status for environmental leadership by the statewide Michigan



Green Communities program. As part of the 2021 Michigan Green Communities (MGC) Challenge, participating communities were awarded gold, silver, or bronze seals of achievement reflecting environmental leadership. Delta Township was reconized for its Coordination between regional partners to increase non-motorized transportation elements into new infrastructure (Waverly Pathway); Collaboration between Delta staff, the community, and Michigan State University to remove invasive plant species from parks; Investment of water bottle filling stations to divert plastic water bottles from landfills; and past installation of public EV charging stations.


Delta Hosts Grand Re-opening for Pickleball Courts
