







# Delta Township Renames Community Center to Honor Former Supervisor Joseph E. Drolett



On Monday, December 18, the Delta Township Board dedicated and renamed the Delta Township Community Center to the Joseph E. Drolett Community Center in honor of former Supervisor Joe Drolett.

The honorable Janice K. Cunningham, former Delta Township Board member and current Eaton County Circuit Court Judge, along with former Delta Fire Chief Vic Hilbert, and attorney and Chairperson for the Regional Blue Ribbon Panel for the retention of General Motors Jack Davis all spoke of the generosity and many contributions that Drolett made to the Township.

Supervisor Kenneth R. Fletcher read a resolution passed by the Delta Township Board and presented it to Drolett.

Additionally, Eaton County Sheriff Tom Reich presented Drolett with the Eaton County Sheriff's Department Arm Patch in honor of his dedication to citizens the of Delta and his support of the department.

Drolett served as a Trustee on the Township Board from 1972 to 1974, and honorably served as Delta Township Supervisor from 1974 to 1988, and again from 1992 to 2008, to date, the longest serving supervisor in Township history.

Drolett played a major role in establishing many firsts for the Township including drafting its first Master Plan, drafting and implementing the first zoning ordinance, passing the first capital improvements plan for the Township, and establishing the first long-term sidewalk, paths and trails plan.

In 1998, Drolett worked together with the City of Lansing to help secure and bring to the Township the \$1.2 Billon General Motors Delta Plant along with four tier-one auto parts suppliers. He also worked with Township staff and contractors to complete the development of the industrial park located on the south side of the Township, clearing the way for what is now one of the most robust industrial districts in the state. Throughout his tenure, Drolett oversaw the building of the Delta Township District Library facility, the addition to the Delta Township Administration Building, and the Central Fire Station. Under the leadership of Supervisor Drolett, Delta Township was the first in the state to approve a service contract with a County Sheriff's Department, and subsequently built a Delta-based Eaton County Sheriff's Department Substation, allowing for faster and more efficient law enforcement response times for Delta residents.

His leadership was not just limited to the Township, Drolett also aided in the development of the Lansing Economic Area Partnership (LEAP) organization, which has become a strong economic force throughout the mid-Michigan region.

# LBWL to Invest \$500 Million in New Delta Based **Power Plant**

The Lansing Board of Water and Light announced on Monday, December 18 that it will build a new. cleaner and efficient natural gas-fired power plant in Delta Township. According to LBWL, this \$500 million plant will complement the company's investment in renewable energy projects and efficiency programs, will generate 250 megawatts, and create 1,200 new jobs in construction.

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## Facade Improvement Grants Aid in Two New Saginaw Developments



Some incoming businesses along the east end of the Saginaw corridor (Waverly to Elmwood) recently took advantage of the Facade Improvement Grant program offered and funded by the Delta Township Economic Development Corporation (EDC) to aid in demolishing old buildings to make way for new businesses.

This program is part of an effort by the Township's EDC to improve the aesthetics of buildings along areas of the Saginaw corridor that have aged and/ or fallen into disrepair and encourage improvements of those properties. The Delta Township EDC meets quarterly and works to improve economic development in Delta. 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Cintas Corp. to Invest \$17 Million in to Expand in Delta Township

Delta Township, the Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC), and the Lansing Economic Area Partnership (LEAP) recently announced the expansion of Cintas Corporation in Delta Township. Cintas Corporation, founded in 1968, is a leading provider of corporate identity uniform programs, providing entrance and safety mats, restroom supplies, promotional products, first aid and fire production products, and industrial carpet and tile cleaning. Cintas currently has more than 40,000 employees at more than 500 locations worldwide, and has outgrown their existing space in Lansing due to continued growth. Cintas plans to purchase adjacent land in Delta Township and add a new commercial/industrial cleaning facility that will also include office space.

The project is expected to generate a total capital investment of \$17 million and create 70 new jobs. In conjunction with the project, Cintas has been awarded a \$350,000 Michigan Business Development Program performance-based grant by the Michigan Strategic Fund (MSF).

Cintas chose Michigan over competing sites in California, Florida, New Jersey, New York, Tennessee, and Wisconsin; and will receive expedited permitting in support of the project from Delta Township.

# New Development Underway at Saginaw and Canal



At the site of the former Days Inn Hotel at the southwest corner of Saginaw Hwy and Canal Rd, we are witnessing new development!

- At 633 N Canal, a new five story, 132 room Hilton Garden Inn hotel, with a 22,015 sf footprint is under construction.
- Last December, a new 6,502 sf Outback Steakhouse opened at 617 N Canal, and
- You will soon see a Starbucks coffee shop open in a 5,930 sf building at 609 N Canal, with additional space available for lease.

This new development is Delta Township's first brownfield project, and is a result of action taken by the Delta Township Board, at the recommendation of the Brownfield Redevelopment Authority (BRA).

A brownfield program uses tax increment financing (TIF) to reimburse brownfield related costs while redeveloping contaminated, functionally obsolete, blighted, or historic properties that are former industrial, commercial, residential, or public property. Use of a brownfield TIF makes redevelopment of an eligible property cost competitive with a greenfield site. In this situation, eligible brownfield activities were demolition and asbestos abatement.

Neighborhood Beautification Grants Assist Delta Residential Areas



Over the course of 2017, Delta neighborhoods took advantage of the new Neighborhood Beautification Grant program offered through the Township to help improve the aesthetics of their residential areas.

Delta Township is offering this grant program so residential neighborhoods and neighborhood organizations can apply for matching funds for improving their identification and welcome signs to their neighborhood. Matching funds will be on a first come/first serve basis and typical grant awards will be \$500. It is part of the Township's goal to help create community identity, neighborhood involvement, and encourage and maintain the character of residential neighborhoods. # Mount Hope Park Development Update

The development of Mount Hope Park continues with additional good news. On January 11, Delta Township was awarded a Land and Water Conservation grant from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) for a connector pathway that will connect the subdivisions of Ashford Manor and Point West to Mount Hope Park. That will allow residents to access the park by shared-use pathways without having to drive. The grant is the third received for Mount Hope Park resulting in more than \$500,000 in funds from the MDNR for the park.

On January 8, the Delta Township Board agreed to request bids for the development of Mount Hope Park in February. Mount Hope Park is located on Mount Hope east of Nixon. The first phase is a \$3.5 million investment that will include soccer fields, youth-based ball fields, playground equipment, restrooms, a pavilion, pathways and infrastructure improvements to the site including roads, parking lots, water, sewer, and storm drains.

# Non-Motorized Transportation Plan Update

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In its efforts to provide safe, efficient, and enjoyable transportation alternatives, Delta Township continues to expand its network of sidewalks, multi-use pathways, and bicycle lanes that connect residents to the Township's businesses, schools, parks, and other community activity centers. In order to develop these facilities in an orderly manner, the Township relies on its Non-Motorized Transportation Plan (NMTP) for guidance. The Township's first NMTP was in 2005 and was updated in 2012.

Since 2005, the Township has been successful in constructing several major segments of the projects identified in the aforementioned plans such as the East/West Pathway. In advancing



future projects, there are significantly more physical and administrative complexities that need to be addressed, which require more detailed engineering and cost analyses. To this end the Township engaged the services of Rowe Professional Services Company to perform the 2018 update of the Delta Township Non-Motorized Transportation Plan.

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Through the course of preparing the update, a number of opportunities for interested persons to provide their input were offered including focus groups, online public surveys, and a public open house. Rowe also met with various adjacent communities and agencies to identify opportunities for connections and coordination with non-motorized facilities in adjacent communities.

Rowe completed a draft of the 2018 Delta Township Non-Motorized Transportation Plan in January. After a review period for adjacent agencies, a public hearing will be held by the Delta Township Planning Commission in late March or early April of 2018. This public hearing will afford another opportunity for interested persons to comment on the proposed plan. Upon adoption, the plan will guide future development of non-motorized facilities.

# Parks & Rec. Master Plan Update

In September of 2017, Viridis Design Group was hired to complete the 2018-2022 Parks & Recreation Master Plan update. The Parks and Recreation Master Plan is updated every five years as required by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources in order to be eligible for state and federal park grants.

Throughout the process there has been multiple opportunities for the public to provide comments and input about the master plan update including a public survey, two focus group sessions in November, and a community open house discussion in December.

The plan was open for additional public comment for a month and will be presented to the Delta Township Board for their review. After the review and after all final revisions are made, the Parks & Recreation Department will request approval of the 2018-2022 Parks and Recreation Master Plan update in March.

At the December 18 Delta Township Board Meeting, six new full time firefighters and three part-time firefighters were sworn-in to the Delta Township Fire Department.

The firefighters were hired after the Township was awarded a \$916,115 grant from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Program. The SAFER Program is administered by the Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The purpose of the program is to ensure that fire departments nationwide are fully staffed and equipped to strengthen the nation's overall level of preparedness and ability to respond to fire and related hazards.



## How Are Your Taxes Spent?

The pie-chart *(right)* represents the distribution of property taxes that Delta Township collects on behalf of all Taxing Authorities. Delta Township was responsible for collecting approximately \$64,600,000 in property taxes and special assessments for the 2017 Tax year, however the majority of that money is passed along to other taxing entities. Delta Township retains approximately 14.7% of the funds collected for General Operating, Paramedic, and Library purposes. The majority of property taxes collected are allocated to schools for educational purposes.
