WHEREAS, the Community Welfare Fund, now known as the Capital Area United Way, was organized in 1919 by Ray Potter, W. H. Prudden, Frank N. Arbaugh, C.E. Bement, Donald E. Bates, and Charles W. Nichols as a community process for dealing with the large number of charitable solicitations being made in the area; and


WHEREAS, for one-hundred years, the Capital Area United Way has provided local employers, employees and other donors a cost-effective system to address community health and human service needs through charitable gifts of time, money, and goods; and


WHEREAS, the organization's mission is to unite people and resources to solve defined problems and improve the quality of life for individuals and families in the capital area region; and






