Dear Residents: As you drive around Delta, you can't belo but notice the exciting

As you drive around Delta, you can't help but notice the exciting developments taking place including:

Michigan CAT - A 55,000 square foot facility is under construction at the corner of Canal and Millett that will house the company's sales and service operations for Caterpillar heavy construction equipment. Michigan CAT will invest \$12.7 million in the project, which is expected to create 50 new jobs.

Meijer - Earlier this year, Meijer acquired 48 acres at the southwest corner of Creyts Road and Mt. Hope Highway to expand their distribution center. A 500,000 square foot highly automated warehouse building is under construction, further confirming the Delta Township site as the "go to" distribution center in the Meijer network.

Munters Corporation – Relocating in Delta Township with a total investment of \$4.2 million and creating 16 new jobs and relocating 57 existing jobs to the new facility on Ena Drive.

 Magna/DexSys (Norplas) – Proposing a 70,000 square foot addition to their Delta Township facility estimated at \$7.2 million creating 192 new jobs and retaining 310 existing jobs.

- Township assembly plant. The expansion will add nearly 263,000 square feet to the facility that produces the Chevrolet Traverse, GMC Acadia, and Buick Enclave large crossovers. Opened in 2006, Lansing Delta Township Assembly is GM's newest plant in North America, blending best practices and the newest technology in one facility. It was the first automotive manufacturing facility in the world to be a Gold Certified Leader in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED). 3,300 people are employed at the 3.4 million square foot facility. GM also has plans for \$520 million in new investments in the Lansing Delta Plant in the near future.
- Days Inn The Township is working with a developer on the demolition and subsequent redevelopment to take place in 2016.
- To date we have had 30 new residential housing starts at a value of over \$5.6 million.
- In addition, we expect the site plan and construction of 162 new upscale apartments in 2016.

And there is more on the way. There is much to be excited about in Delta. This is a great time to honor and award all the great people and things happening in Delta. On Page 14 we have information on this year's Community Awards. Please nominate the exceptional examples you see in Delta!

Township Bond Rating Affirmed

In August, Delta Township had its "AAA" Bond Rating affirmed by Fitch Ratings. This is great news for Delta Residents as it illustrates a solid local economy and improving tax base. Delta Township was also recognized for its manageable debt burden and its prudent steps proactively funding long-term liabilities.

LBWL, Serving on a Board, and More

Lansing Board of Water and Light Representative

As of July 1, 2015 Delta Township has a representative on the Lansing Board of Water and Light (BWL). Delta Township resident Bill Long was appointed by the Township Board in March to represent Delta Township BWL customers. Lansing voters in November 2014 approved adding three non-voting members to the BWL board, one each from East Lansing and Delta Township for four year terms and a rotating member each year from Meridian, Delhi, DeWitt, and Lansing Townships. When appointed, Delta Township Supervisor Ken Fletcher said "among the reasons Bill was selected was his experience as Chairperson of the Michigan Public Service Commission, and a member of the Community Review Team that investigated and made recommendations following the 2013 ice storm." It is expected that Mr. Long, even though a nonvoting member, will be a voice to raise issues of importance to Delta Township BWL customers. "I hope to hear from Delta Township residents if they have questions or concerns involving BWL and will keep the Township Board and residents informed of issues the BWL is dealing with" Long said. Delta Township/Eaton County Partnership

The Delta Township Board of Trustees has been discussing the opportunity to partner with Eaton County to provide various County Services in Delta Township. Delta Township is home to 30% of the County population. Adding in areas of South Lansing, Grand Ledge, and Dimondale, the area represents over 45% of the population. Currently County Treasurer Bob Robinson and the County Clerk & Register of Deeds Diana Bosworth have proposed to provide services (listed below) out of the Delta Township offices at 7710 West Saginaw Highway approximately one day a week.

The Delta Board of Trustees, the County Treasurer, and the County Clerk/Register of Deeds are hopeful that an agreement can be reached to pilot this arrangement beginning in the Fall and assess it in the future to measure the benefits for Delta residents and if a long-term arrangement can work.

Greetings from the Office of the Eaton County 56A District Court Magistrate

Hard to believe summer has slipped along again and here we are facing the fall and the start of another school year. There are two issues that I would like to bring to your attention. Did you know that you may be able to pay for your traffic violation and not have any points put on your driving record? If you qualify, you may not have to appear in court to take advantage of this program offered by the Michigan Secretary of State. I would also like to remind you of when you are required to stop for a school bus.

Okay, you made a mistake and received a traffic violation. You have never been stopped by a police officer or it has been several years since you last received a traffic violation. Your biggest concern right now is how is this going to affect your insurance rates? Did you know the Secretary of State has developed a program for good drivers like yourself that allows the points and the violation to be waived from your driving record? The program is called **Basic Driver Improvement Course** and here is how it works:

After pleading or being found responsible for the traffic violation you will receive a letter from the Michigan Secretary of State (SOS). They will inform you that you qualify to take the Basic Driver Improvement Course. After successfully completing this course the violation will not appear on your driving record and the respective points will be waived. It would be as if the violation never occurred and your insurance company would not have access to the information. You would be able to inform your auto

insurance provider that you have no convictions as it relates to this ticket. You do not have to appear in court to take advantage of this program. You can pay your fine to the court and wait for the Secretary of State to send you the information. Now here are some answers to most of the questions that arise.

- 1. How do I know if I qualify? The Michigan SOS will automatically send you a letter. You do not need to do anything else.
- 2. What qualifies me for the letter? Basically, if you have 0-3 points currently on your driving record and the pending violation doesn't cause you to exceed 6 points, you will qualify.
- 3. Are there any restrictions to this program? Yes, you may only take this course one time to have points removed. You don't qualify if you hold a CDL or Commercial Drivers license regardless of your current point status. Out of state drivers are also not eligible.
- 4. Does this program apply to all traffic violations? No. If you are charged with careless driving or passing a school bus, you will not be eligible. Other more serious traffic offenses are not waived.
- 5. How and where do I take this course? When you are notified by SOS you have two options. You may either take the test online at the SOS website or at a local business location if it is offered in your area. The course lasts for several hours and requires you to answer traffic questions as defined by the Michigan Motor Vehicle Code.

- 6. Is there a cost to take the course? Yes the cost ranges from \$75-\$100 dollars. The SOS course is usually the least expensive.

Secondly, I would like to take the opportunity to remind you of the requirements for stopping for a school bus now that the school year is approaching. Michigan law requires that you come to a complete stop at least 50 feet away from any school bus that is stopped and displaying the alternating red flashing lights. Failure to do so can result in a traffic violation and a fine of \$370 in Eaton County.

The most frequent violation is on a highway such as Saginaw Highway in Delta Township where there is no physical barrier to the oncoming traffic. Typically, the bus is stopped on the opposite side and traffic continues moving in the other direction even if the red lights are flashing. Although unlikely, a child could run across the roadway to the opposite side and that is why you are required to stop. Unless a barrier divides the roadway, you are required to stop. Keep in mind many of the school buses that service the Grand Ledge school district are equipped with cameras that will record passing school bus violations. These videos are then submitted to the Eaton County Sheriff Department for investigation and subsequently traffic violations are issued to the driver of the vehicle.

Permanent Absent Voter List

Citizens frequently out of the community, physically challenged, or over 60 years of age, can be placed on the permanent absent voter list by completing a request at the Delta Township Clerk's Office. Permanent absent voters only will automatically receive an application for all elections. By Michigan Election Law, this application must be completed and returned EVERY election in order to receive a ballot. If you change your address a new request must be filed at the Clerk's Office under your new address. If you are not on the permanent absent voter list and will need an absent voter ballot, please call the Clerk's Office at 323-8500 and request an application be mailed. Once you have returned the application the ballot will be mailed. Ballots are available 45 day prior to Election and can be mailed out up to the Saturday prior to Election Day. Voter Registration

A person may register to vote at either a Secretary of State office or at the Clerk's Office in the township in which they reside. Updates can be made at any Secretary of State Office throughout Michigan. If you submit a driver's license address change, it will automatically be applied to your voter registration. If you change your address including an apartment number, please update your driver's license and voter registration as required by law. When you move this may change your jurisdiction, your precinct number, and location where you vote and possibly your school and county commissioner districts. It is important to update your voter registration with any move within 60 days. You must be registered at your address 30 days prior to Election Day to be eligible to vote on Election Day.

Election Workers

Delta Township depends on residents to help in the election process. The Clerk's Office is always looking for dependable citizens for our precinct polling locations and absent voter counting board. Anyone interested should contact the Delta Township Clerk's Office at 323-8500. Persons with solid computer skills are especially needed.

Passport Drive
