

Youth Golf Lessons

DID You Know?

Blight Ordinance, Permits, and City Income Taxes

Delta Township Blight Ordinance

Delta Township places considerable resources into upholding high-standards of properties within the Township. This ordinance provides for both a safe and beautiful community. Section 14-85 of the Code of Ordinances prohibits outdoor storage of "junk." Junk is defined as, but not limited to, vehicles that are unlicensed and/or inoperable for any reason, unless stored in an enclosed building. Further, dismantled motor vehicles, or parts of motor vehicles; dismantled machinery or parts of machinery, unlicensed or inoperable trailers, discarded stoves, refrigerators, water heaters or other appliances; scrap metal; building materials, unless there is in force a valid building permit issued by the township for construction upon such property and such materials are intended for use in connection with such construction, garbage, trash or other miscellaneous cast-off items; organic refuse, exterior display or shelving units; racks; food wastes, food containers or wrappings, cans, bottles, jars, or crockery; discarded furniture; cartons, boxes, or crates; rags; discarded clothing, bedding, floor covering or wallpaper; sweepings; waste paper, newspapers or magazines; excrement; rot; yard debris or rubbish (including, but not limited to, grass clippings, clippings from hedges or shrubs, or detached tree branches); industrial waste; unclean or nauseous fluids or gases; and other junk, trash or refuse of any kind, except domestic refuse stored in such a manner as not to create a nuisance. As the snow melts, we would like to remind you to please make sure your properties are free of blight. Complaints or concerns can be forwarded

to Code Enforcement Officer, Kelly Figueiredo, *kelly@deltami.gov* or by calling 816-8267.

ing the necessity of permits for various types of projects. The following are the most common questions: Re-Roofing: yes, permits are required for all roofing projects. This applies to contractors, and homeowners doing the work themselves. Generators & Air Conditioners: yes, back-up generators are becoming more common each year. Permits are required for the installation of generators and air-conditioning units. Decks: yes, permits are required for the construction of most decks. You are required to submit plans and obtain a permit prior to any construction. Pools: yes, due to safety reasons, permits are required for most temporary, and permanent pools. Please call for a permit prior to installation.

Expired Permits

During your construction project, you are required to call for the required inspections. This applies to all inspection types, including building, electrical, mechanical, and plumbing permits. If you, or your contractor, do not call for inspections the permit will become void after 180 days.

Should You be Paying City Income Tax?

With income tax time rapidly approaching, Delta Township wants to eliminate some of the confusion residents have regarding the issue of City of Lansing income tax. Delta Township does not have an income tax. Some Delta residents with a Lansing address may believe they owe income tax; or, more

frequently, their employer may have withheld city income tax over the year.

Many times an employer will automatically withhold taxes when the address is Lansing. A Lansing address relates only to the United States Postal authorities for delivering mail. A Lansing address may mean that a person lives in Delta Township and therefore is not subject to city tax.

- City of Lansing residents pay a one percent tax, no matter where they work.
- Delta residents who work in the City of Lansing, pay one-half percent income tax.
- The following businesses located in Delta are subject to city income tax: GM-Delta Manufacturing Complex, located on Millett Highway, JCIM (Johnson Control Interior Manufacturing), Bridgewater Interiors, L.L.C., and Android.
- Delta residents who do not work in the City of Lansing do not owe city income tax.

Residents who are registered to vote in Delta Township or pay their water and sewer bill to Delta Township are Delta residents.

If residents discover that their employer withheld City of Lansing taxes in error, simply contact the clerk's office and they will provide the employer with proper identification.

SAFETY

Burning Permits

Delta Township residents must obtain a burning permit for any burning within the township. Burning permits may be obtained at the Central Fire Station located at 811 North Canal Road, Monday-Friday, 8 a.m.-5 p.m. or online at www.deltami.gov. The Delta Township Burning Ordinance is strictly enforced.

Tornado and Thunderstorm Safety

Preparing for a tornado or thunderstorm:

- -Plan ahead. Be sure everyone in your household knows where to go and what to do in case of a tornado or thunderstorm warning.
- -Know the safest location for shelter in your home, workplace, and school. Load-bearing walls near the center of the basement or lowest level generally provide the greatest protection.
- -Know the location of designated shelter areas in local public facilities, such as schools, shopping centers, and other public buildings.
- -Have emergency supplies on hand, including a battery-operated NOAA weather radio, flashlight, and a supply of fresh batteries, first-aid kit, water, and cell phone.
- -Keep a three-day supply of food on hand. Keep some food in your supply kit that doesn't require refrigeration. -Sign up to receive text or email alerts from your local media or download the American Red Cross Tornado Application.

What to do when a thunderstorm approaches your area:

-Stay tuned to your weather radio or local news station for the latest updates from the National Weather Service or go to the National Weather Service website, *www.weather.gov*.

- -Seek safe shelter when you first hear thunder or when you see dark threatening clouds developing overhead or see lightning. Remember, lightning can strike more than 10 miles away from any rainfall.
- -When you hear thunder, run to the nearest large building or a fully enclosed vehicle (soft-topped convertibles are not safe). It is not safe anywhere outside.
- -If you are boating or swimming, get to land and seek shelter immediately.
 -Telephone lines and metal pipes can conduct electricity. Any item plugged into an electrical outlet may cause a hazard during a tornado or thunderstorm. Do not use corded (plug-in) telephones except in an emergency.

What to do when a tornado warning is issued for your area:

- -Quickly move to shelter in the basement or lowest floor of a permanent structure.
- -In homes and small buildings, go to the basement and get under something sturdy, like a workbench or stairwell. If a basement is not available, go to an interior part of the home on the lowest level. A good rule of thumb is to put as many walls between you and the tornado as possible.
- -In schools, hospitals, and public places, move to the designated shelter areas. Interior hallways on the lowest floors are generally best.
- -Stay away from windows, doors, and outside walls. Broken glass and windblown projectiles cause more injuries and deaths than collapsed buildings. Protect your head with a pillow, blanket, or mattress.
- -If you are caught outdoors, a sturdy

shelter is the only safe location in a tornado.

-If you are boating or swimming, get to land and seek shelter immediately.

Lightning Safety

Lightning can provide a spectacular display of light on a dark night, but this awesome show of nature can also cause death and destruction. Lightning is the visible discharge of electrical energy. It is often accompanied by thunder, which is a sonic boom created by the same discharge. If you hear thunder, lightning is a threat, even if the storm seems miles away and the sky is blue. The electrical energy from lightning seeks a path to the ground – your home, the trees in your yard, or even you can be the chosen path.

Safety Tips

- -Plan your evacuation and safety measures. At the first sign of lightning or thunder, activate your emergency plan. Lightning often precedes rain, so do not wait for the rain to begin before suspending activities. No place is absolutely safe from lightning; however, some places are much safer than others. The safest location during lightning activity is a large enclosed building. The second safest location is an enclosed metal topped vehicle, but NOT a convertible, bike, or other topless or soft-top vehicle.
- -If outdoors, get inside a suitable shelter IMMEDIATELY. Your only safe choice is to get to a protected building or vehicle. Avoid seeking shelter under a tree as a tree can attract lightning. In the event you are outdoors without a safe vehicle or shelter, follow outdoor safety tips at www.lightningsafety. noaa.gov/outdoors.shtml. Although these tips will not prevent you from

being hit, they can help lessen the odds.

- -If indoors, avoid water, doors, windows, and using the telephone and headsets. Lightning could strike exterior wires, inducing shocks to inside equipment. Any item plugged into an electrical outlet may cause a hazard.
- -Do not resume activities until 30 minutes following the last observed lightning or thunder.

Injured persons do not carry an electrical charge and can be handled safely. If you are qualified to do so, apply first aid procedures to a lightning victim. Call 911 or send for help immediately.

Spring Safety Tips

When spring fever hits, it usually means lots of grilling, entertaining, and cleaning. During this time it is also important to take a few safety precautions for you and your family.

Daylight Savings Time

When daylight savings time begins, setting your clock forward means it's time for a seasonal safety check. As you go around the house setting clocks ahead, take the time to make these safety checks:

Change the batteries in your home smoke alarms. Get in the habit of changing your batteries in smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors every fall and spring when you are changing your clocks. If you don't have a smoke alarm in every bedroom and every level of your home, get some.

Check your first aid kit and/or emergency preparedness kit. Check batteries, expiration dates, and supply levels of the items that you keep in your kits. For ideas on how to build your kit visit www.dolthing.com.

Change or clean air filters. Dirty air filters make your heating system less efficient and can also cause a breakdown in your system causing a fire.

Practice Spring Safety While Spring Cleaning

As you make your way from room to room completing your spring cleaning, pay special attention to the following:

Dryer Vents - If clothes are still damp at the end of a typical drying cycle or requires longer times than normal, this may be a sign that the lint screen or the exhaust duct is blocked. Pay particular attention to lint build-up in clothes dryer vents and in the exhaust ducts. Correct by cleaning the lint screen/filter before or after drying each load of clothes. Clean the dryer vent and exhaust duct periodically. Clean behind the dryer, where lint can build up. Keep the area around the dryer clean and free of clutter.

Electrical Wiring and Outlets Overloaded circuits and extension
cords pose a real fire threat. Misusing
electrical cords (such as running them
under rugs, or putting them in high
traffic areas) can result in electrical
fires, which account for thousands of
fires each year. Correct by replacing
frayed wires or cords immediately.
If you see overloaded wall sockets,
remove some of the items and find
a new outlet for them. Remove any
cords running under carpeting or
rugs. Do a quick scout of all rooms in
your home to make sure no cords are

trapped against walls (where heat can build up.)

Kids and Matches/Lighters - Children playing with matches or lighters are responsible for more than 35,000 fires annually in the United States. You may learn of your children's curiosity with fire while you're spring cleaning. Look under all beds, and in "secret places" such as closets or basements, where your children may leave evidence that they have played with matches or lighters. Lock up all lighters or matches and reiterate to your children that fire is absolutely not a toy. The Delta Township Fire Department also has a Youth Fire Prevention and Intervention Program to help your family.

Cleaning Safety - Make sure gasoline and cleaning fluids are well marked and stored in a cool, dry place away from the house and out of the reach of children and pets. Use only approved containers for gasoline storage and store away from your house. Never use gasoline to clean skin, clothes, auto parts, or floors. Check your barbecue grill for leaks and cracks, and be sure to store any propane tanks away from your house and garage. REMEMBER: Charcoal grills are not allowed on the balconies of apartments and LP grills must be small camping grills using 21/2 lb. tanks (adapters are not allowed).

Remove all fire hazards, including stacks of rags, newspaper, and magazines. Pay special attention to the spaces around your furnace, hot water tank, fireplace, space heaters, and dryer, as well as under the stairs.

Election Information and Passport Drives

2015 Scheduled Election

The legislature has called a special election for May 5, 2015 for a constitutional amendment to increase sales tax from 6% to 7%. Absentee ballots will be available from approximately March 21-May 4 for those who will be out of town or cannot make it to the polls on Election Day.

May 5, 2015 – State Special Election Voter Registration Deadline – Monday, April 6, 2015

Voter Registration

A person may register to vote at either a Secretary of State office or at the Clerk's Office in the township in which they reside. Updates can be made at any Secretary of State Office throughout Michigan. If you submit a driver's license address change, it will also be applied to your voter registration.

All first time voters in Michigan who registered to vote by mail are required to vote in person the first time voting to have identity confirmed.

Election Workers

Delta Township depends on residents to help in the election process. The Clerk's Office is always looking for dependable citizens for our precinct polling locations and absent voter counting board. Anyone interested should contact the Delta Township Clerk's Office.

Permanent Absent Voter List

Citizens over 60, physically challenged, or frequently out of the community, can be placed on the permanent absent voter list. Permanent absent voters will automatically receive an application for all elections. By Michigan Election Law,

Acceptable Recycling Items

Delta Township's recycling center accepts the following products/materials to be recycled year-round: American flags, bikes, compact florescent light bulbs, cooking oil, household electronics, polystyrene foam, household battery and cellular phone collection, ink cartridges, plastics with #1-7 symbol on bottom are accepted (any empty plastic containers that held oil, antifreeze, herbicides or pesticides are not permitted for recycling), metals, clear and brown glass (no green, blue, or frosted), paper, boxboard, and phone books to name a few. The

Recycling Center no longer accepts CRT's (cathoder ray tube) televisions and computer monitors. CRT's are the "old style" televisions and computer desk monitors. Look for future information through Delta Township, Eaton County, or Metro Lansing area for alternative events to recycle CRT's. Pop or beer box containers, box containers designed to go in the freezer or refrigerator, or plastic containers that hazardous waste comes in such as motor oil or anti-freeze for example, are not accepted. Please remove all lids and caps from plastic containers prior to recycling.
