Permits, Vending Licenses, Water Report, and More!

Creating and Maintaining Beautiful Neighborhoods

Delta Township places considerable resources into upholding high-standards of properties within the Township. The "Blight Ordinance" provides for both a safe and beautiful community. We would like to remind you to please make sure your properties are free of blight. Complaints or concerns can be forwarded to Code Enforcement Officer, Kelly Figueiredo, at kfigueiredo@deltami.gov or by calling 816-8267.

Permit Requirements

The Building Division receives several calls each year regarding the necessity of permits for various types of projects. The most common questions are regarding:

Fencing: Yes, permits are required for all fences higher than 6 feet tall. Sheds: Yes, permits in residential areas are required if the structure is 200 square feet, or larger.

Re-Roofing: Yes, permits are required for all roofing projects. This applies to contractors, and homeowners doing this work themselves.

Generators & Air Conditioners: Yes, back-up generators are becoming more common each year. Permits are required for the installation of generators and air-conditioning units. Decks: Yes, permits are required for the construction of most decks. You are required to submit plans and obtain a permit prior to any construction.

Pools: Yes, due to safety reasons, permits are required for most temporary, and permanent pools. Please call for information prior to installation. Contacting us for Inspections:

During your construction project, you are required to call for the required

inspections. This applies to all inspection types, including building, electrical, mechanical, and plumbing permits. If you, or your contractor, do not call for inspections the permit will become void after 180 days and a violation will be attached to the property. You can schedule inspections by calling 323-8530 or visiting www.deltami. gov and clicking on the services tab at the top of the page.

Vending and License Requirement

Spring and summer is the time of year when there is an increase in vending. Please be aware a valid pictured vendor license is required by the Township Clerk for vending activity in the township either door-to-door or from a fixed commercial site. Vending licenses are NOT required for groups representing a school, religious organization, or charitable organization which is classified non-profit for federal internal revenue purposes. A license is also not required if a vendor leaves a brochure at a resident's home and does not knock or engage the resident.

Residents should ask to see a license if they are approached by a vendor if license is not visible. Registered vendors are listed on the website at www.deltami.gov/ordinances. If a vendor does not have a township issued license, residents should contact the Sheriff's Department at 372-8217 extension 2. All other questions regarding this ordinance should be directed to the Delta Township Clerk's Office at 323-8500.

Greetings from the Office of the Eaton County 56A District Court Magistrate

If you are wondering what a magistrate is and does, let me take this opportunity to explain my position. I am appointed by the Chief Judge of Eaton County and I am primarily tasked with listening to and deciding traffic violation cases. My other responsibilities include arraigning people on criminal warrants, signing search warrants, and performing marriages. Since I am not an attorney I don't resolve civil cases such as small claims or landlord tenant disputes.

One thing that I have learned since being in this position is that the general public is very unfamiliar with our court system and how to properly resolve many of the issues that occur when a person becomes involved in the court process. In the next few articles I hope to make you aware of the different procedures required of someone when they receive a simple traffic ticket (civil infraction) to more complex issues involving an arrest for a potential criminal violation (misdemeanor violation). Most individuals will have contact with the court due to a traffic violation or civil infraction they received. The officer who issues the violation will usually tell you to contact the court within a specified period of time. The appearance or contact information is on the lower portion of the traffic ticket that was given to you. It is extremely important that you contact the court within the specified time. Failure to do so can cause you to lose your option to contest the violation or have additional fees assessed to the total amount of fines and costs.

When you contact the court you will be asked how you intend to plead on the ticket. Information regarding your plea is on the reverse side of the traffic ticket. You have three choices. You can admit responsibility. This basically will allow you to pay the fine/cost associated with the ticket without coming to court. You can admit responsibility with an explanation. This allows you to write to the court explaining the circumstances you were involved in and letting the court/magistrate determine if you should be held responsible to pay the fine/cost. If the court/magistrate finds the need for further explanation, you will be scheduled for an informal hearing before the magistrate. This hearing will involve you, the police officer and the magistrate.

Finally, you can deny responsibility. This will allow you to have one of two types of hearings. You can request an informal hearing as described above or a formal hearing in which you could be represented by an attorney. Questions regarding the type of hearing you may request will be addressed by the court clerk when you call. The 56A District Court has a website at *eatoncounty.org*. Please use this website as it will explain in greater detail many of the aspects of the District Court procedures to follow regarding traffic tickets. If you have additional questions please contact the District Court at (517) 543-4026.

Traffic Tip: Did you know that a center lane divided by two yellow lines is for left turns only? It is not a merge into traffic lane. If you stop within the lane between the yellow lines to continue traveling in the left lane you could receive a traffic ticket for improper lane use. This most common violation occurs on Saginaw Hwy from Waverly Road to M-100 in Grand Ledge.

The Township's Weed Ordinance requires: the occupant of every premises and the owner of unoccupied premises within the Township, to cut and remove or destroy by lawful means all such noxious weeds and grass, as often as may be necessary throughout the growing season, which shall be **April 15 through October 31** of each year, to remain in compliance with the provisions herein.

Grasses and weeds not cut, removed or destroyed by April 15, 2015, and further maintained as often as necessary to remain in compliance through October 31, 2015, may be cut by the Parks, Recreation, and Cemeteries Department of Delta Township. The owner of the property will be charged with the cost of \$68.34 investigation charge, \$77.65 per hour mowing charge, and any other expense that may be incurred due to the violation, plus 10% overhead, with a minimum charge of \$189.05. Charges not paid before September 1, 2015, are deemed delinquent, and the cost is assessed against the property of the taxpayers as shown on the tax roll.

Tornado and Thunderstorm Safety

Preparing for a Tornado or Thunderstorm

Plan ahead. Be sure everyone in your household knows where to go and what to do in case of a tornado or thunderstorm warning.

Know the safest location for shelter in your home, workplace, and school. Load-bearing walls near the center of the basement or lowest level generally provide the greatest protection.

Know the location of designated shelter areas in local public facilities, such as schools, shopping centers, and other public buildings.

Have emergency supplies on hand, including a battery-operated NOAA Weather Radio, flashlight, and a supply of fresh batteries, first-aid kit, water, and cell phone.

Keep a three-day supply of food on hand. Keep some food in your supply kit that doesn't require refrigeration.

Make an inventory of household furnishings and other possessions. Supplement it with photographs of each room and keep it in a safe place.

Sign up to receive text or email alerts from your local media or download the American Red Cross Tornado App.

What to do when a thunderstorm approaches your area

Stay tuned to your weather radio or local news station for the latest updates from the National Weather Service or go to the National Weather Service website, www.weather.gov.

Seek safe shelter when you first hear thunder or when you see dark threatening clouds developing overhead or see lightning. To determine the proximity of the severe weather, count the seconds between the time you see lightning and hear thunder. If the time between is less than 30 seconds, ensure you are in a safe location and stay inside until 30 minutes after you last hear thunder or see lightning. Remember, lightning can strike more than 10 miles away from any rainfall.

When you hear thunder, run to the nearest large building or a fully enclosed vehicle (soft-topped convertibles are not safe). It is not safe anywhere outside. If you are boating or swimming, get to land and seek shelter immediately.

Telephone lines and metal pipes can conduct electricity. Any item plugged into an electrical outlet may cause a hazard during a tornado or thunderstorm. Do not use corded (plugin) telephones except in an emergency.

What to do when a tornado warning is issued for your area Quickly move to shelter in the basement or lowest floor of a permanent structure.

In homes and small buildings, go to the basement and get under something sturdy, like a workbench or stairwell. If a basement is not available, go to an interior part of the home on the lowest level. A good rule of thumb is to put as many walls between you and the tornado as possible.

In schools, hospitals, and public places, move to the designated shelter areas. Interior hallways on the lowest floors are generally best.

Stay away from windows, doors, and outside walls. Broken glass and wind-blown projectiles cause more injuries and deaths than collapsed buildings. Protect your head with a pillow, blanket, or mattress.

If you are caught outdoors, a sturdy shelter is the only safe location in a tornado.

If you are boating or swimming, get to land and seek shelter immediately.

After a Tornado or Thunderstorm

Inspect your property and motor vehicles for damage. Write down the date and list the damages for insurance purposes. Check for electrical problems and gas leaks, and report them to the utility company at once.

Watch out for fallen power lines. Stay out of damaged buildings until you are sure they are safe and will not collapse. Secure your property from further damage or theft.

Use only chlorinated or bottled supplies of drinking water. Check on your food supply. Food stored in a refrigerator or freezer can spoil when the power goes out.

Lightning Safety

Lightning can provide a spectacular display of light on a dark night, but this awesome show of nature can also cause death and destruction. Lightning is the visible discharge of electrical energy. It is often accompanied by thunder, which is a sonic boom created by the same discharge. If you hear thunder, lightning is a threat, even if the storm seems miles away and the sky is blue. The electrical energy from lightning seeks a path to the ground – your home, the trees in your yard, or even you can be the chosen path.

Safety Tips

Plan your evacuation and safety measures. At the first sign of lightning or thunder, activate your emergency plan. Lightning often precedes rain, so do not wait for the rain to begin before suspending activities. No place is absolutely safe from lightning; however, some places are much safer than others. The safest location during lightning activity is a large enclosed building. The second safest location is an enclosed metal topped vehicle, but NOT a convertible, bike, or other topless or soft-top vehicle.

If outdoors, get inside a suitable shelter IMMEDIATELY. Your only safe choice is to get to a protected building or vehicle. Avoid seeking shelter under a tree as a tree can attract lightning. In the event you are outdoors without a safe vehicle or shelter, follow outdoor safety tips at www. lightningsafety.noaa.gov/outdoors.htm. Although these tips will not prevent you from being hit, they can help lessen the odds.

If indoors, avoid water, doors, windows, and using the telephone and headsets. Lightning could strike exterior wires, inducing shocks to inside equipment. Any item plugged into an electrical outlet may cause a hazard.

Do not resume activities until 30 minutes following the last observed lightning or thunder.

Injured persons do not carry an electrical charge and can be handled safely. If you are qualified to do so, apply first aid procedures to a lightning victim. Call 911 or send for help immediately.

Fireworks Safety

Fireworks on Independence Day are as American as apple pie, but did you know that in the United States more than twice the number of fires are reported on that day than on any other day of the year? The good news is you can enjoy your holiday and the fireworks with just a few simple safety tips:

- Read and follow all warning labels.
- Have a designated shooter to organize and shoot your family show.
- Alcohol and fireworks do not mix. Save your alcohol for after the show.
- Parents and caretakers should always closely supervise teens if they are using fireworks.
- Parents should not allow young children to handle or use fireworks. The tip of a sparkler burns at a temperature of more than 1,200 degrees Fahrenheit, which is hot enough to cause third-degree burns.
- Fireworks should only be used outdoors.
- Always have water ready if you are shooting fireworks.
- Obey local laws and never use illegal fireworks.
- Wear safety glasses whenever using fireworks.
- Never relight a "dud" firework. Wait 20 minutes and then soak it in a bucket of water.
- Soak spent fireworks with water before placing them in an outdoor garbage can.
- Never attempt to alter or modify consumer fireworks and use them only in the manner in which they were intended.
- Report illegal explosives, like M-80s and quarter-sticks, to the fire or police department.



Permanent Absent Voter List

Citizens over 60 years of age, physically challenged, or frequently out of the community, can be placed on the permanent absent voter list. Permanent absent voters will automatically receive an application for all elections. By Michigan Election Law, this application must be completed and returned every election in order to receive a ballot. Voter Registration

A person may register to vote at either a Secretary of State office or at the Clerk's Office in the township in which they reside. Updates can be made at any Secretary of State office throughout Michigan. If you submit a driver's license address change, it will automatically be applied to your voter registration.

Election Workers

Delta Township depends on residents to help in the election process. The Clerk's Office is always looking for dependable citizens for our precinct polling locations and absent voter counting board. Anyone interested should contact the Delta Township Clerk's Office.

The Presidential Election is in 2016. There will be three statewide elections scheduled; March 8, August 2, and November 8, 2016. Delta Township will be in need of between 150-200 election workers for each election. Election workers are paid positions and include training. Passport Drives
