We just finished the annual Community Awards as you will see on pages 14 and 15 and it was a perfect time to celebrate all the great things going on in Delta Township.

The decline of the traditional newspaper makes it challenging for municipalities to find the best ways to communicate. In Delta Township we have made specific efforts to enhance our communications over the last several years. In addition to this magazine, we have a robust website, an active facebook page, Instagram, and twitter feed. We are working on additional mechanisms of communication as well. Last month, Delta Township was one of the first municipalities in the country to unveil a application for your smartphone. You can download the Delta Township app for free and it has a lot of good news about Delta Township. In addition, we will be starting an electronic newsletter to keep you informed of positive things happening in Delta Township. We welcome your feedback on what news you would like to hear more about.

We have very exciting news happening in our Parks and Recreation Department. We are working with the City of Lansing to complete the purchase of Grand Woods Park, to preserve this jewel of park space for Delta Township. We have also purchased 60 additional acres of property on Mount Hope Highway with the help of a Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund grant to add to an existing 60 acres for a future 120 acre park on the west side of the township. We are always working on sidewalk and pathway projects in order to make Delta Township as walkable as possible.

Delta Township has always been a leader in shared services and cooperative efforts with other municipalities. We have agreements in place with police, fire, assessing, parks and recreation and others. This fall the Township signed an agreement assisting Delhi Township with assessing. In addition, the township worked with the Eaton County Treasurer and Eaton County Clerk to open up the Township Administration building to county services. Currently, the Treasurer and Clerk will alternate Fridays to provide services in Delta Township saving residents a trip to Charlotte. Hopefully these efforts and services will continue to grow in the future as we work to improve service delivery to our residents.

We work hard to make Delta Township the best place to live, work, and play. We want to communicate all the substantial progress we are making in Delta Township!





Acceptable Recycling Items

Delta Township's Recycling Center accepts the following products or materials to be recycled: cooking oil, polystyrene foam, household battery, and cellular phone collection. Household electronics, as of January 1, 2015 Delta Township no longer accepts CRT's (Cathode Ray Tube) televisions and computer monitors. CRT's are the "old style" box televisions and computer desk monitors. Flat screen televisions and flat screen computer monitors, ink cartridges, plastics with #1-7 symbol on bottom, metals, clear and brown glass (no green, blue or frosted), paper, boxboard, CFL bulbs, and phone books are accepted. Please remove all lids and caps from plastic containers prior to recycling. Pop or beer box containers, containers designed to go in the freezer or refrigerator, or plastic containers that hazardous waste comes in, such as motor oil or anti-freeze, are not accepted. For a complete listing of items accepted at the Delta Township Recycling Center and to obtain the monthly recycling newsletter visit www.deltami.gov.

Metals Accepted Year-Round

Below is a listing of metal items accepted year round at the Recycling Center. All items must be 80% metal or more to be accepted for recycling. The listing is not limited to the items below, but is a general listing. If you have a question regarding the acceptance of an item, please ask the recycling center attendant. Appliances – washers, dryers, cook stoves, metal microwaves, water heaters, water softeners, furnaces, steel dishwashers (no all plastic dishwashers). Steel and aluminum lawn furniture or swing sets, lawn mowers, rototillers, weed whackers, spreaders (fluids must be drained), gas and charcoal grills, pots and pans, basketball poles (no cement), wire or metal fencing bundled, fence poles (no cement), metal cabinets and shelving, metal yard ornaments, steel doors and storm doors with glass removed, scrap metal, sheet metal, cast iron, metal sinks and metal burning barrels (must have open tops and be clean). **NO GAS OR OIL CANS ARE ACCEPTED.** Tin and aluminum cans (cleaned and flattened), as well as items mostly composed of metals.

Yard Waste Not Accepted December – March

Yard waste is not accepted during the winter months of December through March. The yard waste bins at the recycling center are removed for the winter. **Yard Waste Recycling will be accepted starting April 2, 2016.**



Christmas Tree Recycling

Delta Township residents may dispose of their natural Christmas trees **December 26 through January 31** at the Parks and Recreation Maintenance Building, which is located on Administration Drive. 2016 Elections

Three elections are scheduled in 2016. Election information will be posted on Delta Township's website www.deltami.gov. Voters should refer to their voter identification card for proper precinct number and polling location. If your voter identification card has been lost, call the Clerk's office to have a replacement card mailed.

2016 Scheduled Elections

March 8, 2016 – Presidential Primary Election – (CLOSED PRIMARY)

Voter Registration Deadline – Monday, February 8, 2016

Residents within the State of Michigan will have the opportunity to nominate a candidate for office of President of the United States at the closed primary. A closed primary requires a voter's casting a ballot to select a Republican or Democrat ballot when completing the application either at the precinct or if applying for an absentee ballot. A ballot cannot be issued to a voter until the selection of Republican or Democrat ballot has been made. If a Delta Township Resident voter will be out of the community on Election Day or need any information regarding the upcoming election, contact the Delta Township Clerk's Office at 323-8500.

August 2, 2016 – Primary Election – (OPEN PRIMARY)
Voter Registration Deadline – Tuesday, July 5, 2016

An open primary has both Republican and Democratic offices on the same ballot but a voter can only vote in one party during the August Primary Election. If a voter "cross-party votes" (votes for candidates in both the Republican and Democratic offices) the partisan section of the ballot will not count. Any non-partisan votes cast would be valid votes. If a voter is at a precinct and makes a mistake they may let an Election Inspector know so the ballot can be spoiled and replaced to vote correctly. If you are voting by absentee voter ballot please contact the Clerk's Office at 323-8500. The voter will be instructed to seal the ballot

in the ballot envelope and write SPOILED on the outside. The envelope is returned in person or by mail and a new ballot will be issued. The August Primary is to "reduce the number of candidates" for each office by party to be placed on the General Election ballot on November 8, 2016.

Voter Registration Deadline – Tuesday, October 11, 2016

The General Election on November 8, 2016 will include electing a new President of the United States, along with many more partisan, and non-partisan offices. In a General Election all parties: the two major parties (Republican and Democrat) and the minor parties (Green, Libertarian, Natural Law and U.S. Taxpayers) that are represented in Michigan will be on the ballot. In General Elections voters have the choice of voting for whichever candidate and party they choose under each office. The only restriction is, voters must only vote for the number of candidates allowed to be elected as identified under the office heading on the ballot. If the voter votes for more candidates than is allowed the votes within that office will not count. In a precinct, if a voter does over-vote or makes any other mistake, the voter should let an Election Inspector know so the ballot can be spoiled and replaced to vote correctly. If you are voting by absentee voter ballot please contact the Clerk's Office at 323-8500. The voter will be instructed to seal the ballot in an envelope and write SPOILED on the outside and return it in person or by mail and a new ballot will be issued. If residents will be out of the community on Election Day or need any information regarding the upcoming election, contact the Township Clerk's Office at 323-8500.

Permanent Absent Voter List Request

If you are over 60, physically challenged, or frequently out of the community, you can be placed on our permanent absent voter list to vote by absentee ballot for future elections. Our permanent absent voters will automatically receive an application for all elections that are scheduled in Delta Township. However, the application for an absentee ballot must be completed and returned to the Clerk's Office for every election, as required by Michigan Election Law, before a ballot can be sent to the voter. If you would like more information or the Permanent Absent Voter List Request Form call the Clerk's Office Monday-Friday between 8 a.m.-5 p.m. at 323-8500.

How to Request an Absentee Ballot

If you find that you will not be able to vote at the polls on Election Day all voters have the option of voting by absentee ballot. A request or application must be filed for each election when voting by absentee ballot. The process is the same as voting at precinct, the voter must fill out an application before receiving a ballot. To request an application the voter can appear in person at the Clerk's office or call the Clerk's Office at 323-8500. An application for absentee ballot can also be found at the Delta Township website at www.deltami.gov/elections. The Delta Township Clerks office will be open on **Saturday, March 5 from 8 a.m.-2 p.m** to accept absentee ballot applications, issue absentee ballots and/or receive voted absentee ballots for the March 8, 2016 Presidential Primary Election.

Ballots are available 45 days prior to any scheduled election and applications can be submitted 75 days prior to any election. If a voter will be out of town, the ballot can be mailed to an alternate address which must be indicated on their application when applying for a ballot. **BALLOTS CANNOT BE FORWARDED** so it is important that we have the correct "mailing address" to mail the ballot. If your address changes for any reason after you have submitted your application, which may happen with college students especially, contact the Clerk's Office with your updated mailing address so that your ballot will be delivered without any delay.

Voter Registration

A person may register to vote at either a Secretary of State office or at the Clerk's Office in the township in which they reside. Updates can be made at any Secretary of State Office throughout Michigan. If you submit a driver's license address change, it will also be applied to your voter registration. A voter registration form can be mailed to your local clerk.

Military and Overseas Voter Empowerment Act ("Move Act")

The MOVE Act was signed into law in 2009 affording all active uniformed service, spouse, dependents, and merchant marine, stationed inside or outside the United States and civilians residing indefinitely or temporarily overseas the option of requesting an "electronic" transmitted, faxed or mailed absentee ballot. The voter must submit a written request or utilize the FPCA form requesting a ballot every calendar year (January 1-December 31), and must be filled out in its entirety. The FPCA completed form can be utilized to register to vote and/or apply for absentee ballot and can be emailed to Delta-tw@miqvf.org or faxed to 323-8599 to the attention of the Clerk's Office. The FPCA form used for this request is available at our website at www.deltami.gov for your convenience. Additional information including contact information for Michigan's city and township clerks, sample ballots for you to view for upcoming election or candidate and proposal information can be viewed through the Michigan Voter Information Center (MVIC) Web site maintained by the Michigan Department of State at www.mchigan.gov/vote.

Registered to Vote by Mail and First Time Voters

If you are a first time voter or first time voter in Michigan and you registered to vote by mail, you are required by law to appear in person to vote the first time voting. Check with the Delta Township Clerk's Office to verify that your voter registration is up to date and that you qualify to apply for an absentee ballot. This is very important for college bound students who may have registered to vote by mail.

Student applications for absentee ballots are available approximately three months prior to elections and student absentee ballots are available approximately six weeks prior to every election. It is recommended for college students to keep their home address as their voter registration address and apply for an absentee ballot as they will be out of the area on Election Day. College students from Delta Township who register to vote at the college they are attending at a voter registration drive will no longer be eligible to vote in Delta Township. The voter registration address and driver's license address will change to the address given at the voter registration drive.

Election Workers

Delta Township depends on residents to help in the election process. The Clerk's Office is always looking for dependable citizens for our precinct polling locations and absent voter counting board. Residents are paid for working Election Day. Anyone interested should contact the Delta Township Clerk's Office. Applications to be an election inspector for 2016 are available at the Delta Township Clerk's Office or at the Township website at www.deltami.gov under Government and Elections and Election Worker Information.



DID YOU KNOW?

Greetings Again from the Office of the Eaton County District Court Magistrate

I am writing this several weeks prior to the publication date but I suspect that as you read this article the first sightings of snow will have occurred and some colder temperatures will have set in. Given this scenario, I would like to take this opportunity to express the concerns that arise with winter driving and traffic enforcement.

The two most common situations prevalent with winter roadway conditions are snow/ice covered roads and black ice. As the magistrate, I preside over numerous hearings where snow or ice has been a factor in an accident. Unfortunately, most individuals fail to adjust their normal driving habits to accommodate the changing roadway conditions that winter brings. Snowy or ice covered roadways don't allow for "normal" reaction times to stop or steer a vehicle to avoid a traffic crash.

The result is numerous traffic crashes which are investigated by police officers. As a policy of traffic enforcement, traffic citations are issued. The most common traffic violation issued is what is referred to as a "Basic Speed Violation". This violation could include the offenses of speed too fast for conditions, following too closely, and failure to use due care and caution.

This type of violation is usually issued after an officer has conducted an investigation regarding the vehicle or vehicles involved in a traffic crash. The officer has determined that one or more drivers is at fault and issues a citation. The violation doesn't mean that the driver was driving in a reckless manner rather it infers they were driving too fast for the conditions, or failed to properly control their vehicle, leading to a traffic crash.

After a traffic crash has occurred the investigating police officer must determine what occurred. Some drivers describe that they have become a passenger in a car that they were driving. What does this mean? When people are driving all of a sudden events occur that cause them to take evasive maneuvers with their vehicle, slamming on the brakes or trying to steer the vehicle doesn't work. Now they are no longer "driving" the vehicle but are sitting behind the steering wheel, waiting for the vehicle to stop moving. They have essentially become a passenger. The ice or snow has taken away the ability to operate their vehicle properly. I mention the snow or ice as the culprit but in reality you as the driver are responsible for operating your vehicle in such a manner as to anticipate and avoid these situations before they occur. Anticipation is probably your best ally while

driving. If that vehicle ahead of me stops, can I stop in time? If that vehicle fails to stop for the stop sign, can I control my vehicle to avoid striking it? If I go over the overpass, is the bridge likely to be covered with black ice? Just because the sun is out on a cold crisp morning, is the roadway clear of any black ice? These and many more situations can, and should, be considered when the driving conditions of winter present themselves. Winter also brings shorter daylight hours forcing people to drive in nighttime conditions. This can also be a factor leading to a traffic crash due to limited visibility.

The fact is a traffic crash is eventually going to occur somewhere. Your best defense is to adjust your driving habits accordingly. Speed on the freeway at 70 miles per hour in July is vastly different than 70 miles per hour in January. Consider leaving earlier for work to avoid having to drive fast to get there on time. Plan your functions later to give yourself enough time to arrive safely. Please avoid texting and calling on your phone. Both substantially limit your ability to react to driving situations and traffic crash avoidance.

If you do receive a traffic citation, you do have the right to contest the violation through a formal or informal hearing at the District Court.

Should You be Paying City Income Tax?

With income tax time rapidly approaching, Delta Township wants to eliminate some of the confusion residents have regarding the issue of City of Lansing income tax. Delta Township does not have an income tax. Some Delta residents with a Lansing address may believe they owe income tax; or, more frequently, their employer may have withheld city income tax over the year. Many times an employer will automatically withhold taxes when the address is Lansing. A Lansing address relates only to the United States Postal authorities for delivering mail. A Lansing address may mean that a person lives in Delta Township and therefore is not subject to city tax.

- Persons living in the City of Lansing pay a one percent tax, no matter where they work.
- Delta Township residents working in the City of Lansing pay one-half percent income tax.
- The following businesses located in Delta Township are subject to city income tax: GM-Delta Manufacturing Complex, located on Millett Highway, JCIM (Johnson Control Interior Manufacturing), Bridgewater Interiors, L.L.C., and Android Industries.
- Delta residents that do not work in the City of Lansing do not owe city income tax.

If residents discover that their employer withheld City of Lansing taxes in error, simply contact the Delta Township Clerk's Office and they will provide the employer with proper identification. If you have any questions regarding whether or not you are a Delta Township resident, please contact the clerk's office and they will be happy to assist you.



Sidewalk Snow Removal

Delta Township property owners are reminded that they need to make arrangements to clear the snow and ice from sidewalks adjacent to their property. Section 34-92 of the Delta Township Code of Ordinances requires that snow and ice be removed from the sidewalk within 24 hours of snowfall. The code applies even if the property is vacant or the building on the premises is unoccupied. The Township's Snow Removal Ordinance can be viewed on the Township's website at www.deltami.gov. Eaton County Winter Road Maintenance

The Eaton County Road Commission is responsible for winter road maintenance on over 1,170 miles of roads, which includes the roads in Delta Township. Priority is placed on plowing or salting the most heavily traveled roadways first; county primary roads and certain high-traffic local roads in urban areas. After these roads are passable, crews move on to clear local paved roads throughout Eaton County. Typically, local subdivision streets and rural gravel roads are cleared after all other higher-traffic roads. Although crews may begin plowing or salting several hours before the morning peak traffic and continue operations into the night, extended winter storms or continuing winds may require them to continually plow the main high-traffic roads, which prevents them from reaching subdivision streets and rural gravel roads for several days. Passport Drives

The Delta Township Clerk's Office will be offering five passport drives during 2016. One official passport quality photo is required when submitting a passport application (form DS-11 ONLY) and can be obtained at the Clerk's Office for a \$12 fee per applicant. Please visit the U.S. Department of State website for documentation requirements, fees, and an application at www.travel.state.gov. Two payments will be required: (1) Payable to U.S. Department of State for processing of your passport, and must be personal check or money order as the payment is attached to the passport application and (2) Payable to Delta Township for pictures and acceptance fee. The fee to Delta Township can be by cash, check or credit/debit card. For questions or further information please call the Delta Township Clerk's Office at 323-8500.


