STANDING ORDER FOR SIGNING OF ORDERS & SUBMISSION TO THE COURT

Pursuant to the inherent powers of the Court and pursuant to the authority granted under § 21.001 of the Texas Government Code, in a Suit Affecting the Parent-Child Relationship (hereinafter "SAPCR") in which the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services is the Petitioner in the suit, or otherwise designated as a managing conservator of the child(ren) the subject of the suit, the Court finds that it is in the best interest of the child(ren) to require the expeditious signing, entry, and filing of a written order or judgment. The Court further finds that the prompt entry and signing of orders enables the Court to monitor compliance with the timelines for such cases, which is also in the best interests of the child(ren).

It is **THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED** that in all SAPCRs in which the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services is the Petitioner in the suit, or otherwise designated as a managing conservator of the child(ren) the subject of the suit, all attorneys and parties shall have until the end (5:00 p.m.) of the fifth calendar day from the rendering of the order to review, sign, and return their executed order or judgment to the circulating party. On the sixth calendar day, or thereafter, the circulating party shall submit the order or judgment, along with any signatures received, to the Court for review, signature, and filing.

If any attorney or party shall raise, in good faith, an objection to the form or substance of the order or judgment prior to the end of the third calendar day from the rendering of the order, the objecting party and the circulating party shall confer prior to the end of the fifth calendar day from the rendering of the order and attempt to resolve the matter by agreement.

If after conferencing, the objecting party and the circulating party do not resolve the matter by agreement, the circulating party shall set the matter for entry of the order or judgment with the Court.
