SAVE TIME WITH ELECTRONIC PERMITTING

East Hempfield Township now offers the opportunity to obtain building permits electronically for both Residential and Commercial projects. Our simple process is designed to save residents and contractors from making multiple trips to the Township Building. It also reduces the amount of paper generated through the traditional procedure.

Follow these easy steps to complete and receive an electronic permit:

- **1.** Go to our website at www.easthempfield.org. Residential and Commercial permit applications are found under the FORMS tab. Complete your application.
- **2.** Email your application along with the plans and specifications in PDF format to <u>building@easthempfield.org</u>.
- **3.** Once your application and plans have been reviewed and approved, we will notify you via email. This will include an invoice for the permit fees.
- **4.** Submit your payment by mailing a check to the Township Office or by credit card through the Township's website.
- **5.** Once payment is received we will email to you the building permit, stamped approved plans, and a receipt for the fees that were paid.

SNOW PLOWING & MAILBOXES

Please inspect the condition of vour mailbox. Plowed snow may knock over an unstable mailbox. The Township will not replace a mailbox that is not directly hit by our trucks.

Plow or shovel snow to the side of your driveway, away from the flow of traffic. Clearing snow for a distance prior to your driveway allows the plow to "unload" before reaching it. By piling snow away from the direction of oncoming snowplows, the bulk of the snow will not be pushed back onto your driveway.

GARDEN & FLOWER PLOTS

at the EHT Administration Building are on a first come, first served basis. Registration will be held on Monday, February 3, 2020 at 8:00 a.m. Each plot is approximately 20' x 40'. Watering facilities are available. The cost is \$20.00 per plot. No telephone reservations will be accepted.



ROAD PROJECT UPDATES

Centerville Road Interchange Improvements (Marietta-Columbia) - The Township is partnering with PennDOT on this multiyear project which continues to move through the preliminary design process. The bid date on this project is February/ 2021 and the widening/raising of the interchange bridge and Centerville Road will be a multi-construction season project.

Noll Drive at Running Pump Intersection (round-about) is scheduled to be completed by the beginning of September/ 2019. The Township thanks the business owners and residents for their patience as well as the Lime Spring developer for making this happen. We are hopeful that this will be a significant improvement to this intersection.

State Road Interchange Improvements – This PennDOT project is under construction. Completion continues to be anticipated for June/2021. Rt 722 will remain open during construction but delays could be expected during peak construction periods. The closed ramps on the east will eventually reopen and the same closure process will be followed on the western ramps.

Holland Street Bridge Removal Project -This is a project that will remove the Holland Street Bridge over the Amtrak line which has been closed to traffic for many years. The Township continues to await necessary review approvals with

December/2019 but it is doubtful we will be able to meet that deadline.

Old Rohrerstown Road Bridge Replacement Project - This Dairy Road project will improve the bridge beneath the Norfolk Southern rail line. The Township is awaiting design approvals from the Department of Environmental Protection and the Army Corp of Engineers. The anticipated bid date of November/2019 is not feasible so we are hopeful for a 2020 bid date.

Farmingdale Road Improvements - Permanent speed tables have been authorized for installation on Farmingdale, Barr and Barr Crest. The Township is moving through the permitting process with PennDOT for the long-term improvements. Long-term improvements include a forced right turn on to Oreville for Northbound Farmingdale traffic, a traffic signal at Oreville and Good and lane improvements at Marietta/Good.

You can learn more about the above projects or express any traffic concern during the monthly Traffic Commission meetings, which are held on the 3rd Wednesday beginning at 6:00 pm.

ou have a basin, swale or drain pipe in your yard...

If you have a basin, swale or drainage area on your property chances are that you or your Homeowners Association are responsible for maintenance which extends beyond regular mowing. A stormwater drainage easement most likely is listed on your property deed which outlines and protects this area from disturbance. The basin or possibly a swale was created as part of a neighborhood system and its maintenance and upkeep is crucial for the overall stormwater design to continue to function.


The existence of a drainage easement on a property restricts the use of that area of the property, such as the placement of sheds, additions, pools, or regrading. Any change could affect your neighbors so please be mindful of any change or new areas of erosion.

The Township is in the process of inspecting ALL basins, swales or drainage areas as part of our Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4s) obligations under state and federal mandates. The Township has been divided into sectors and inspections will be followed by letters to property owners listing our findings and maintenance recommendations.



How Do I Know Who Placed Flags / Marked My Property?

The utilities will be identified by painted marks or flags within twenty-four inches on either side of the utility line.



Preparing Makes Sense. Get Ready Now.

While we can't control or prevent all disasters and emergencies from happening, you can be prepared and you can protect yourself and your family. If a disaster occurs in Pennsylvania, you must be prepared to survive on your own for a minimum of three days. The likelihood that you and your family will survive a house fire depends as much on having a working smoke detector and an exit strategy, as on a well-trained fire department. The same is true for surviving a hazardous materials incident or a flood. You must have the tools and a plan in place to make it on your own, no matter where you are when disaster strikes. Get ready now.

Make a Plan.

Plan how your family members will contact one another and review what you will do in different situations. Consider a plan where each family member calls or emails the same friend or relative in another town in the event of an emergency. Keep a copy of important contact information in your emergency supply kit or another safe place where you can access it in the event of a disaster.

Assign a designated meeting place so members of your family will know where to meet each other. ReadyPA has created a Family Emergency Plan template that is available for download at www.readypa.org.

Get a Kit.

You should be prepared to make it on your own for at least three days. Although there are many things that might make you more comfortable, think about the essential things first, including food and water. You'll need a gallon of water per person per day for drinking and sanitation. Include a three-day supply of non-perishable foods that



are easy to store and prepare such as protein bars, dried fruit and canned goods. Also consider creating a smaller kit for your car. This kit should be similar to the home kit, but also include blankets and/ or warm clothing.

Your kits should be kept in an easy-to-carry container, such as a plastic storage bin, backpack or duffel bag. Knowing When to CALL 9-1-1 for a Medical Emergency Can Save Someone's Life

A medical emergency is a sudden injury or serious illness that, if not treated right away, could cause death or serious harm to you or someone you care for.

If you or someone you are with is experiencing chest pain, shortness of breath, a severe allergic reaction, bleeding that won't stop with pressure, obviously broken bones, severe pain, choking, poisoning or overdose, or if someone is threatening to hurt themselves or others, call 9-1-1 immediately.

If you are alone and experiencing a medical emergency, call 9-1-1. Do not attempt to drive yourself to the hospital. Paramedics and EMTs can deliver lifesaving care to you while in route to the hospital. They are trained to administer the medical treatment you need and communicate with physicians in the Emergency Department about your condition so the necessary hospital services will be ready when you arrive.

If you are not sure whether the situation is truly an emergency, call 9-1-1 and let the dispatcher decide whether you need emergency help. This is a better

choice than not getting help to someone who really needs it quickly.

DISPOSAL OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS

Drop off at the Police Department, during normal business hours. Or...dispose of in your regular household trash by removing the drugs from the original container and mix with an undesirable substance, such as coffee grounds or kitty litter, and place in a sealed bag or container.

Do NOT flush drugs down the toilet.

'RASH AND RECYCLING UPDATE

As residents are aware, we have a contract hauler system in place for all residential trash, recycling and yard waste. The program consists of weekly pick-up of trash, recycling, yard waste, curbside leaf removal and Christmas tree curbside pick-up. Residents pay the Township \$47.00/quarter or a discounted annual fee of \$173.00. A GREAT rate based on recent industry changes, just ask your non-resident friends or family.

Our three-year contract with Waste Industries (formerly Lebanon Farms Disposal) will be ending in December/2020 at which point the Township will be rebidding the waste contract and we are obligated to take the lowest responsible bid. We have not been without our difficulties during the term of our current contract, having dealt with the pains of a new owner and significant changes in what can be recycled.

On the backend the Township and the waste hauler have seen significant increases in the cost of recycling with per ton pricing increasing at a rapid rate. Additionally, the per ton tipping fee charged to the Township has seen an increase of \$5.00/ton. The Township and residents have been insulated from some of these increased costs due to the contract we are currently under but as noted above that contract will be ending at the end of 2020. While we do not know what the contract per housing unit cost will be, we do feel confident based on market trends that the unit cost will significantly increase which will mean an increase to resident quarterly rates.

> In case you were not aware the Township has had a healthy trash/recycling fund balance over the past few years and have passed on savings to the residents in the form of reductions in the trash/recycling fee. Unfortunately given the market changes this trend will not continue. I can tell you that rates will definitely be increasing in 2021 due to the new contract. We are currently working on the 2020 budget which will determine the trash/recycling rate for 2020.
