EAST LINCOLN STREET PROJECT

The City received a Rural Task Force Grant from the Michigan Department of Transportation and East Lincoln Street from Robert Elliott Boulevard to Cemetery Road will be reconstructed sometime between mid-July and mid-September. The exact time line is not available at this time. Bolen Asphalt Paving, Inc. was awarded the contract for this project. In conjunction with this project, the City will be extending the sidewalk on East Lincoln Street. The sidewalk will be constructed on the south side of East Lincoln Street and will extend the sidewalk all the way to Cemetery Road.

OTHER CITY PROJECTS

A 10" water line will be installed on Huron Street from West Westover Street to West Lincoln Street and the street will be resurfaced. Depending on funding, resurfacing of other streets will occur this Spring and/or Fall.

GARBAGE PICKUP FOR PART TIME RESIDENTS

During the summer months, many part-time residents visit their summer homes in East Tawas. If you happen to leave before regular garbage pick up (Thursday), please contact City Hall at 760 Newman Street or 362-6161, so other arrangements can be made.



The Primary Election will take place on Tuesday, August 2, 2016 in the East Tawas Community Center gymnasium. Polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. Please remember to bring your valid Driver's License or other valid Michigan identification in order to receive your ballot. Absentee ballots will be available 45 days prior to the election. You must complete an absentee ballot application before receiving a ballot. You may also complete a dual application which will cover both the August primary and November general elections for 2016. Voters requesting an absentee ballot in person at City Hall must present a valid Driver's License or other valid Michigan identification in order to receive a ballot. City Hall will be open from 8:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, July 30th and the deadline for requesting a ballot by mail is 2:00 p.m. on that day. All absentee ballots must be received by the City Clerk by 8:00 p.m. on election night. Voters eligible for an absentee ballot may vote in person at City Hall until 4:00 p.m. on Monday, August 1st.

The last day to register to vote for the August primary is July 5, 2016.

PROPERTY INSPECTIONS FOR ASSESSING PURPOSES

In early 2014 the State Tax Commission sent a bulletin that gave assessing offices guidelines for property inspections. These recommendations, when implemented, preserve the property owner's rights. The East Tawas assessing office sends post-cards to owners of those properties that are scheduled for a property visit for the current year. This year's cards were included with the annual Change of Assessment Notice that was mailed in February. The post-card explains what happens during a visit for a Record Card Review. It also gives the property owner an option to contact the assessing office if they do not want an interior inspection or do not wish to grant access to their property.

If the property owner doesn't want to grant access to the property or an interior inspection, it is still important that the information used to assess a property is current and accurate. The property owner is then asked to complete a record card questionnaire that will give the assessor vital information that is needed to value the property. This questionnaire is available on-line at www.easttawas.com. A copy can be mailed by request or the questions can be answered by phone by simply calling the assessing office.

ZONING PERMITS

Please remember that the City of East Tawas is a zoned community and you need a zoning permit for any construction (including decks, pools, fences, sheds, garages, additions, houses, etc.) or tearing down any structures. Permits and guidelines are available at City Hall. Incomplete permits will delay approval, so please be sure to allow yourself enough time to get all the necessary information and for the Zoning Administrator to review and approve the application.

Any commercial permits must be approved by the Planning Commission which meets at City Hall on the second Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. Plans must be submitted by 3:00 p.m. on the Thursday preceding the meeting to be included on the agenda.



Spring Cleaning


This is the time of year when many people begin Spring cleaning. Please keep in mind that our contract with Waste Management allows for up to 5 bags of regular household garbage and one large item per house. If you have any items beyond your limited amount to dispose of, you can make arrangements with Waste Management to have them picked up separately. They also have a transfer station located at 685 Aulerich Road (one mile off US-23) where items can be taken. For more information on either option, please contact Waste Management at 362-9562.

GARAGE SALES

Garage sales are a big activity beginning this time of year. The City of East Tawas does not require you to obtain a permit for a garage sale, however, our City Ordinance states that a garage sale may last no longer than three days at one time and you are allowed only two garage sales in a calendar year.

The City also has an ordinance prohibiting signs attached to meter posts, trees or along any street right-of-way (City property), as well as on any building, wall or fence without first obtaining consent from the owner. State Law also prohibits attaching signs to utility poles. Signs in these locations will be removed. To advertise your event, the City has provided a kiosk in the Tawas Bay Players parking lot, located at 401 Newman Street.





PARK BOARD SEEKS BATHHOUSE GRANT

The East Tawas Park Board has submitted a grant application to the Michigan Department of Natural Resources Trust Fund for development of a public bathhouse. The bathhouse would provide free restrooms and showers to the general public and will be located on the 601 W Bay Street and 609 W Bay Street properties.

The project calls for the expansion of the current Day Use parking lot onto the subject properties. The expansion would create an additional 50 parking spaces which would increase the total number of available spaces to 113. In addition to providing public bathrooms and showers, the facility would also include an outside shower and foot wash station so that beach goers can rinse off before going into the building. There will also be a dish washing station so picnickers can rinse off and clean their dishes before leaving.

The Park Board is hoping that the location for the project will benefit the application. The Governor's new Iron Belle Trail system will be utilizing the City's bike path and will be located on the north end of the project. The Huron Shores Coastal Water Trail is on the north side. Being situated between these two trail systems, it is hoped that the Trust Fund will look favorably on the application. Thirty-three letters of support for the project were received from local businesses, residents and organizations and were included in the grant application.

TAWAS BAY PLAYERS TO HOST CTAM SPRING CONFERENCE

The Tawas Bay Players are hosting the CTAM (Community Theater Association of Michigan) Spring Theater Conference, to be held in East Tawas May 13-15. The spring conference venue floats around the State, hosted by different theater groups. In agreeing to host this spring's event, TBP expects to bring many new faces to the Tawas area in hopes they return and enjoy our beautiful community on the bay. Various Newman Street businesses are hosting the workshop sessions and the Saturday evening banquet will be held at the Knights of Columbus Hall.

On the agenda for the conference are ten workshops that give insight and new ideas in helping current community theaters. They are aimed at helping directors, actors, and backstage personnel. We are targeting youth involvement and benefits, auditioning, make-up, vocalizing/projection, musical stage movement, live and canned music for a musical, and PR for your theater, to name a few. During the workshop we will also be addressing our unique relationship with the City of East Tawas which has resulted in TBP having our own theater through the generosity of a long term lease with the City. As a bonus, the conference will be held on one of the weekends of our spring musical production, "The Marvelous Wonderettes".

This is a wonderful opportunity to showcase our community and businesses. Cost is \$60 to attend, so if you have even the smallest inclination to help out (we can use volunteers) or want to be involved in a production, this is a great way to jump in without having to travel!

COMMUNITY CENTER IS STILL A BARGAIN FOR AREA RESIDENTS

The East Tawas Community Center continues to provide recreational opportunities for area residents at very reasonable rates. With a full size gymnasium, the Center is ideally suited for basketball, volleyball and a myriad of other recreational activities. If walking is your exercise of choice, then the facility's elevated synthetic walking track is for you. Many residents and visitors use the track on a daily basis to keep in shape, especially during our cold and inclement winter season.

All that is required to take advantage of the opportunities offered by the Community Center is a City of East Tawas recreation pass. Recreation passes are good for the City of East Tawas fiscal year (October 1 through September 30) annually. But they are still a bargain. An annual pass for an individual resident is still only \$12.50. A two member family can purchase an annual pass for \$20.00 while a pass for an entire family is only \$25.00. Non-residents of the City of East Tawas can purchase annual passes as well. The rates for non-residents are double the price listed for an East Tawas resident. Daily passes are available for \$3.00 each.

CITY PARK & AUSABLE VALLEY AUDUBON PROVIDE BIRD HIDE

East Tawas City Park staff and members of AuSable Valley Audubon have been working together the past two weeks to construct a "bird hide". A bird hide is a structure from which people can view birds and waterfowl along Tawas Bay. The East Tawas Bird Hide is 6' wide by 10' long and includes a "bump out" to allow wheelchair bound wildlife enthusiasts to be able to utilize the structure. The "camouflage" painting on the hide was donated and painted by Pam Frank and Erica and Chase Earl from the Iosco County 4-H "We Love to Craft" craft club. The bird hide will be placed on the concrete slab on the former Genii's restaurant property in early April.



CITY PAVILIONS AVAILABLE FOR RENTAL

Are you having a graduation party, family reunion, etc. but aren't looking forward to having guests track through your house? Then you may want to consider renting one of the East Tawas City Park Pavilions for your event.

The pavilions are located in Durant, Bolen and Dillon Parks in East Tawas. Each pavilion comes with a covered picnic area, picnic tables, two gas grills, and a kitchen with stove, refrigerator and Bunn Coffee Maker. Rental rates for all three pavilions for residents of the Tawas Area School District is \$50.00 Mondays through Fridays and \$75.00 for weekends and Holidays. A \$50.00 security deposit is also required which will be refunded if everything is cleaned up and no damage is done.

The park begins taking requests for reservations on January 1 annually. The park offers the local Little League and Softball organizations until April 30 each year to submit their schedules for games and tournaments. On or around May 1, park staff will call to confirm your reservation at which time, you will have two weeks to come in and make your payments. That's all there is to it. To reserve one of the facilities, contact the Park Office at 989-362-5562.

If you prefer to be on the beach for your event, you may want to consider the Day-Use Area gazebo. Located in the East Tawas City Park Day-Use Area adjacent to the Museum, this facility rents for \$50.00 per day. The gazebo comes with a minimum of six picnic tables and there are charcoal grills located throughout the Day-Use Area. You can also bring your own gas grills if you prefer.

Hours for all of the park facilities are from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. daily.

Employees of the Department of Public Works will begin their compost (yard waste pick up) on Monday, May 2, 2016 through November 14, 2016. UPDATES TO WATER AND SEWER METERS

On January 4, 2011, President Obama revised the definition for "lead free" within the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA). This act pertains to "pipe, pipe fittings, plumbing fittings, and fixtures" and is designed to protect the quality of drinking water in the U.S. The changes went into effect on January 4, 2014. With these new regulations in place, any meters replaced after January 4, 2014, MUST be lead free. In August 2010 our Department of Public Works began replacing existing meters, with plans to have all meters updated by 2018. Because we do not have outside access to all meters, arrangements with the home owners may need to be made.

▶ NEW!! You can drop off your recyclables on weekdays now, too; Monday through Friday, 9a-4p at the Waste Management Transfer Station at 685 Aulerich Road, East Tawas, MI 48730! We've made it easy! The containers are set up as self-serve. Simply drive up to the containers, put your items in the correct container and drive away.

 \rightarrow When you pull through the front gate at the Transfer Station, the recycling containers will be located to your right. If you have questions about recycling, there will be flyers located in the mailbox next to the containers.



VALVE TURNING Hydrant Flushing

The Department of Public Works will be turning valves and flushing fire hydrants again starting May 2nd-May 6th, 2016. You may experience rusty water or low water pressure during this flushing period. Valve turning and flushing of the hydrants is necessary to provide better water quality.
