#### SAW GRANT UPDATE

The Stormwater, Asset Management, and Wastewater (SAW) program is a three-year evaluation process that will guide the City Council in making decisions to update our aging sanitary sewer and storm sewer systems. Terra Contracting Services has been cleaning and televising all of the sanitary sewer and storm sewer mains throughout the city as the first step in the planning process to evaluate these systems. We are now in the second year of this process. Within the next few months smoke testing of the wastewater lines will be conducted. This testing helps determine where stormwater is getting into the wastewater system. Identifying these locations will help devise a plan to correct the problems. Residents will be given advance notice of when this testing will occur.

# **New Positions, Same Faces**

With the retirement of Ron Leslie from the City Manager position, there have been some changes in the staff at City Hall. Blinda Baker, who served as Clerk/Treasurer for almost 30 years, was promoted to City Manager. Julie Potts, who has worked for the City since 2004 and served as Deputy Clerk/Treasurer since 2011, was promoted to Clerk/Treasurer. Stephanie Loew, who has served as Water and Sewer Administrative Clerk since 2011, was promoted to Deputy Clerk/Treasurer. Brenda Allen continues as a part-time Administrative Assistant. These public servants are dedicated to meeting the needs of our citizens. Please look for their smiling faces when you stop by City Hall.



#### **CLEAR SNOW FOR READING**

During the winter months, the Department of Public Works would like to remind all homeowners and landlords to maintain a path to your meter pad for monthly meter readings. If your meter pad becomes buried with snow or ice, an estimate reading will be taken.

#### **UPDATE ON NEW LIBRARY**

We're still planning to build a new library adjacent to the City Hall/Community Center but the project has been temporarily delayed. The project was put out for bids in June and bids were opened in July. Unfortunately fewer bids than expected were received and the majority of bids that were received were much higher than anticipated. The City's Construction Manager felt that contractors were very busy and perhaps were too busy to even bid on the project. Some modifications to the building design were made and the project was put out for bids again in September. Bids were opened on Tuesday, October 13th and are currently being reviewed. Once the Library Committee meets, they will make a recommendation to the City Council and hopefully we'll be on our way to building a new library!

Donations for the furniture and fixtures are still needed. As of Wednesday, October 14, 2015 \$49,127 has been donated toward the \$250,000 needed for furniture for the new library. #### TAWAS BACKPACK PROGRAM

The Tawas Backpack program is a community effort to make sure that less fortunate children have something to eat on the weekend. Backpacks are sent home with approximately 100 children each week.

City employees are once again helping this program by collecting items for the Christmas break backpack that will be sent home with eligible students just before Christmas vacation starts. The Tawas Backpack program organizers are requesting plastic 16-18 oz. jars of peanut butter and 20-22 oz. plastic containers of jelly. Because the children take the backpacks home with them and many ride the bus, no glass jars are allowed. Donations can be brought to the East Tawas City Hall or Community Center any time the building is open. Our goal is 100 16-18 oz. plastic containers of peanut butter and 100 20-22 oz. plastic bottles of jelly so that each child can be given one container of peanut butter and one bottle of jelly. All donations will be greatly appreciated and must be received by December 10, 2015.

#### WATER METER MAINTENANCE

We are asking for the cooperation of residents in maintaining water meters in the upcoming winter months. The Department of Public Works has been hard at work this summer updating water meters. The initial meter is free of charge to the home owner, but a replacement meter due to any damages will be at the cost of the homeowner. The cost of a new meter is a minimum of \$150.00.

Our main concern is keeping meters and water lines from freezing and breaking. The first step would be to locate your water meter. (Water meters are normally located in a crawl space or basement.)

#### Suggestions for homeowners are listed below:

- ➤ Make sure that there are no drafts of cold air hitting the meter. Meters that are located in a crawl space can sometimes be located in direct relation to the crawl space access door. If there is any air leaking through the access it could result in freezing the meter.
  - Insulate around the meter or around the access door to keep the cold draft away.
  - Make sure to shut any crawl space vents around the house.
- Summer homes and cottages that aren't in use during the winter, or not used as often:
  - If the home is not in use during winter months have it properly winterized.
  - o If only used on occasion, make sure you take the proper steps to keep the meter clear of cold drafts. Keeping your heat up, keeping it insulated, or, during extreme temperatures keeping a pencil lead size stream of water running at one faucet will help prevent meters and lines

from freezing.

# UPDATES TO WATER AND SEWER METERS

On January 4, 2011, President Obama revised the definition for "lead free" within the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA). This act pertains to "pipe, pipe fittings, plumbing fittings, and fixtures" and is designed to protect the quality of drinking water in the U.S. With these new regulations in place, any meters replaced after January 4, 2014 MUST be lead free. In August 2010 our Department of Public Works began replacing existing meters with plans to have all meters updated by 2018. Because we do not have outside access to all meters, arrangements with the home owners may need to be made.
