PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY ELECTION AND ABSENTEE BALLOTS

The 2020 Presidential Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, March 10, 2020. Absentee ballots will be available 45 days before the election on January 25, 2020 at East Tawas City Hall located at 760 Newman Street between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday and will also be available on Saturday, March 7, 2020 between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

DID YOU KNOW --- You can skip the line on Election Day and vote by mail? Voting is now easier than ever! Changes are available for Michigan voters with the passage of Proposal 18-3. ALL registered voters in Michigan are able to request an absent voter ballot without providing a reason. Due to this change, you can request to be placed on the City's permanent absentee voter list to automatically receive an absent voter application prior to each election. The City is unable to automatically mail an absentee ballot to any voter but will be able to mail the application form used to request an absentee ballot. If you would like to be placed on the permanent absentee voter list, please contact the Clerk's Office to obtain a "Permanent Absentee Voter List Request Form" or visit our website at www.easttawas.com for a fillable form. Applications will be mailed to those on the permanent absentee voter list approximately 60 days prior to an election.

Please note that voters placed on the permanent absentee voter list should be aware that the permanent absentee voter list is based on an address and a voter name, therefore, any address change made to a voters registration will removed the permanent absentee voter status and the voter must re-apply to be on the permanent absentee voter list.

(Note: Election law states that a ballot can only be given to the person requesting the ballot. Applications for an absentee ballot can be presented at City Hall but only those persons appearing in person will be given an absentee ballot. Ballots for those not appearing in person will be sent their ballot by mail or hand delivered by the Clerk. Please contact City Hall if you have any questions.)

CITY PARK HIRES NEW ASSITANT MANAGER

CITY PARK CAMPGROUND TO CLOSE FOR ELECTRIC UPGRADE

For the first time since 1965, the East Tawas City Park will be closed to camping beginning October 16, 2019. On that date, electrical contractors will begin upgrading the City Park's electrical system from 30 to 50 amps. Although campers will be allowed to leave their trailers in the park this winter for winter storage (they will have to have their trailers on a site by 5:00 p.m. October 15th), there will be little or no admittance to the campground itself during the construction period. Power to the campground and all buildings will be terminated shortly after October 16 and will remain off until the project is completed. The described construction period during which time the campground will remain closed runs from October 16, 2019 to January 15, 2020. However, the contractor (McKerchie Enterprises, Inc.) has informed Park Manager Keith Frank that he plans to be done with the project by November 15, 2019. Whenever the project is completed and electricity is re-established to the campsites and buildings, the campground will reopen for camping and business as usual.

CITY PARK BATHHOUSE PROJECT MOVES TOWARD COMPLETION

Despite some unanticipated delays due to the discovery of some underground storage tanks, the East Tawas City Park bathhouse project continues to move forward. Construction crews have been onsite and working weekends to try to get the project back on schedule and completed by the completion date of December 31, 2019. When completed, the project will provide free restrooms and showers to the general public, an additional 50 parking spaces which will increase the total number of available spaces to 113, an outside shower and foot wash station so that beach goers can rinse off before going into the building and a dish washing station for picnickers to rinse off and clean their dishes before going home.

WINTER TAX BILLS

Winter tax bills will be mailed on December 1st and will be due on February 14, 2020. A 3% penalty will be added to all taxes unpaid after February 14, 2020. Winter taxes may be paid at the East Tawas City Hall until March 2, 2020 after which all taxes remaining unpaid will be turned over as delinquent to the Iosco County Treasurer. Snow Plowing

With winter drawing near, we are asking for your cooperation in keeping the City streets and parking lots cleared of vehicles from 3:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. allowing our Department of Public Works to efficiently plow snow off the City streets and downtown parking spaces. Please refrain from blowing and pushing the snow from driveways into the City streets. Keeping it on your property could decrease the amount placed back into the end of your driveway during the plows second passing.

HYDRANT FLUSHING

The Department of Public Works will begin flushing fire hydrants October 7-11, 2019. You may experience rusty water or low water pressure during this flushing period. Flushing of the hydrants is necessary to provide better water quality. Please watch our website or the Iosco County News Herald for our flushing schedule.

Compost Facility

Thank you for your patience as we refine our City's composting program. An increase in commerical use has driven us to modify access to better manage our space and resources. Curbside pickup of compost will continue on Monday's starting May 1st through the second Monday in November with direct access options being defined for the spring.

Dog Licenses

Dog licenses may be purchased at City Hall from December 1st to March 1st. The fee is \$10.00 for male and female dogs, and \$5.00 for unsexed dogs. Proof of Rabies Vaccination is required. After March 1st dog licenses may be purchased at the County Treasurer's Office.

ZONING PERMITS

Please remember that the City of East Tawas is a zoned community and you are required to obtain a zoning permit for any construction (including decks, pools, fences, sheds, garages, additions, houses, etc.) or tearing down any structures. Permits and guidelines are available at City Hall. Incomplete permits will delay approval, so please be sure to allow yourself enough time to get all the necessary information and for the Zoning Administrator to review and approve the application.

Any commercial permits must be approved by the Planning Commission which meets at City Hall on the second Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. Plans must be submitted by 3:00 p.m. on the Thursday preceding the meeting to be included on the agenda.
