Marina Metrics

- Moorage average occupancy was up 6%; Reached 100% occupancy with waitlists in all slip sizes for the first time since 2008
- Had almost 100 more boats in storage
- Supported about 80 more vessels in Work Yard
- Almost 1% increase in guest moorage stays
- An 11.8% increase in TravelLift hauls
- First year with LAZ supporting transactions; had just over 17K launches in 2021 – not apples to apples with 2020 data that shows 28,580 transactions including both Jetty Landing parking and launch transactions)

- Partnered with City and County to bring back Jetty Island Days
- Saw the return of events with Everett Half Marathon, Rock the Fourth, Fresh Paint, Wheels on the Waterfront, Music at the Marina and more
- Added new events including Pon-tunes Floating Concert and Pacific Ice Community Ice Rink
- Relocated Holiday on the Bay to Pacific Rim
 Plaza and installed new Frozen Fountain Tree;
 Added Second Holiday Boat Parade
- 2022 Events Schedule set; Attended Seattle Boat Show in person

Dredging

- Maintenance dredging at the Jetty Landing Boat Launch is now COMPLETE
- Removed a total of 33,000 cubic yards of river sediment — equivalent to about 3,000 dump trucks
- The Port was granted emergency authorization to expand dredging footprint to create a connector channel through sandbar that has formed between the launch and the river channel to ensure emergency access
- Partner assistance with funding



South Waterlines


- Continuation of project started in 2020 to replace the old waterlines at the entrance to the gatehouses in the south
- Phase 2 of multi-phase project
- Completed south I, J, E,F
- Locations A&B, G&H, and K,L&M in 2022 In progress
- Complete by Summer 2022



South Gatehouses

Project to upgrade each gate at eight locations

- Construct glass gates with aluminum frames
- Upgrade with lights and ADA accessible door openers
- Coordinate with access control project
- Project design underway
- BCI Construction



Access Controls

- Upgrade access control system throughout the entire Marina
- Use modern non-proprietary hardware and allow for future upgrades
- More secure/stand-alone security network
- Upgrade to Genetec software control system
- Upgrade to be completed by summer and will be seamless for Marina users




Access Ramp To Ameron


- Remove portions of fence and construct asphalt ramp into Ameron area
- Will allow for use of Ameron areas for boat storage and impounded boats
- Complete by summer 2022



Maintenance Shop

- Construction project in two phases
- Enclose approximately 5,200 SF of existing canopy at north end of Waterfront Center
- Construct new walls on east, north, and south
- Provide for future mezzanine expansion
- Preliminary design complete
- Construction starting in fall with completion in early 2023





Jetty Landing Restroom

- Grant for \$734K from State RCO, with contributions of \$139K each from City and County
- Precast concrete restroom furnished by CXT
- Demolition and preliminary electrical completed by BCI/JOC in January 2022
- Foundation, utilities, and site work by FORMA/JOC
- Building install and hookups prior to start of summer 2022



Fuel Dock Project

- \$5.3M Federal grant from the Department of Defense's Office of Local Defense Community Cooperation
- Design for Fuel Tank replacement underway, seeking Commission authorization to bid next week
- Commission awarded in-water design work contract last month
- Schedule: Design for the in-water work occurring throughout 2022, with float procurement in early 2023, construction in fall 2023, and completion in spring 2024
 - Working with affected slipholders on relocations
