"LPC West is incredibly excited to partner with the Port of Everett on the continued revitalization of its exceptional waterfront location." said J.P. Harlow, Senior Vice President of LPC West. "We again look forward to working with RIOS, a best-in-class architect when it comes to designing a cohesive live/work/play community. The Millwright District will be a vibrant community on the waterfront, and a hub for new residents and businesses."

As the largest development site, the Millwright District is devoted to establishing a waterfront employment hub, supporting small-to-mid size office users with surrounding destination retail, residential and public spaces. #31530

Site elements will be designed in coordination with Waterfront Place engineering firm, PND Engineers. The site's long and cherished history will be infused into the District's design by way of architectural elements, street names and more. paying tribute to an area that long ago supported a booming lumber and shingle mill industry.

A focal point of the District is a "workman's clocktower" designed to resemble a smokestack and inspired by the Dev Time Register that mill workers of Vancouver's 365,000 sf Terminal used to punch in and out each day. Other features include the Timberman Trails, comprised of four connecting courtyards, and Champfer Woornerf, a "living street" to support events like festivals and pop-up markets.

A long-term ground lease is expected to be reached in early 2022, followed by design, permitting and construction beginning in 2023. The Port is currently building out the first phase of the project at Fisherman's Harbor restaurant row and destination retail. with some space still available.

This Everett-based project represents LPC West's first commercial project in Snohomish County. Their experience in waterfront development includes current efforts underway at the Port 1 development, and a 560,000-sf mixed-use development for the City of Vancouver's Washington Waterfront Gateway project.

On Dec. 6, 2021, the Port of Everett Commission selected LPC West as the private development partner to build out the next phase of commercial, retail and residential spaces at Waterfront Place, authorizing an exclusive negotiating agreement to establish a long-term ground lease to bring the nearly 10-acre Millwright District to life.

The announcement follows a nationwide search for a quality and experienced developer to take on the largest mixeduse phase of Waterfront Place, featuring up to 60,000 square feet (sf) of retail, 200,000 sf of commercial, and 200 multi-family housing units.

LPC West is the West Coast arm of Lincoln Property Company — one of the largest diversified real estate services firms in the United States – with headquarters based in Dallas, Texas and local offices throughout the region, including its Seattle location that the Port is working with. The company represents projects throughout Washington, Oregon, California and Idaho, and are responsible for a portfolio of more than 33 million

sf of commercially developed, managed and/or leased properties.

"LPC West comes with the highest of recommendations and has proven experience in delivering quality mixeduse projects that honor the vision and history of the communities they are developing in," Port of Everett CEO Lisa Lefeber said. "We are so excited to hit the ground running with our new partners to bring jobs and additional vibrancy to the waterfront."

The Millwright District represents the second phase of public-private development within the Port's 65-acre, 1.5 million sf mixed-use Waterfront Place project. It builds on the momentum and more than \$150 million in investment in the project to date with the new developments at Fisherman's Harbor. including the new 266-unit Waterfront Place Apartments, the new 142-room Hotel Indigo, the coming "restaurant row" and destination wine walk, public gathering spaces and more.

PORT COMMISSION ADOPTS \$89M 2022 BUDGET

On Nov. 16, 2021, the Port of Everett Commission adopted an \$89 million 2022 operating and capital budget that continues to implement the vision of a vibrant and balanced working waterfront. Projects that advance the Port's Strategic Plan include construction of the new Norton Terminal at the former Kimberly-Clark mill site, continued mixed-use development at Waterfront Place, restoration of the Blue Heron Slough salmon habitat, maintenance dredging of the boat launch and the addition of a new restroom at Jetty Landing & Boat Launch.

PORT COMMISSIONER DAVID SIMPSON RE-ELECTED

On Jan. 5, 2022, Port of Everett Commissioner-elect David Simpson will be sworn into service to continue to represent the citizens in the Port District 1 seat. Simpson was re-elected to complete a six-year term. #29204

Simpson was elected in 2019 to complete the two-year balance of former Port Commissioner Troy McClelland's six-year term. McClelland relocated to Massachusetts for a job.

2022 BOAT LAUNCH PASSES NOW AVAILABLE

Annual boat launch passes are now available for 2022. All pass options offer boat launch access seven days a week, 365 days a year during regular launching hours and are valid for the 12-month period following the date of purchase.

Passes can be purchased and are issued through an online portal at portofeverett.com/portpermit. The digital pass is managed by license plate; no

physical pass will be provided. Please note: free senior passes were dis-

continued in 2021, however, we do offer a \$100 senior discount.

- Annual Pass: \$225 (unless you are a senior or disabled veteran, see below)
- Annual Pass with Senior Discount: \$125 (must be 60 or older and reside in Snohomish County)
- Disabled Veterans Pass: FREE (must have Disabled Veteran's Lifetime Pass, military ID and reside in Snohomish County)



MAINTENANCE BOAT LAUNCH DREDGING TO TAKE PLACE JANUARY THROUGH MID-FEBRUARY 2022

Port of Everett contractor American Construction Company is set to begin maintenance dredging of the Jetty Landing Boat Launch in January 2022.

The \$1 million project will remove up to 41,000 cubic yards (cy) - equivalent to about 4,000 dump trucks loads - of river sediment that has settled in the launch basin and is impeding boaters at low tide. The Tacoma-based contractor is expected to work through mid-February.

The Port, in coordination with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, was granted emergency authorization to expand its dredging footprint to mitigate a growing sandbar that has formed in the river. The need has increased exponentially in recent years as extreme weather events and historical shifts in Snohomish River flow have caused major increases in siltation at and around the launch. #1260



The Port is authorized to dredge an additional 9,000 CY to create a connector channel through the sandbar.

While this work is underway, the Corps also is completing its annual maintenance dredging of the upper and lower channels of Everett Harbor and Snohomish River Navigation Channel.

PLEASE NOTE: This project includes nightwork. Lighting and noise to be mitigated as much as possible. Boaters in the area should slow down, pass on the marina side of the dredge to avoid traveling over the partially submerged pipeline, pay attention to rig markings, avoid and/or be cautious around the dredging operations.

WINTER REMINDERS

In freezing temperatures water will be shut off at all docks (except for the North Marina, Central I-Dock and the Fuel Dock). As always, vessel movement is prohibited when ice is present. Don't forget about the sand buckets at the top of each dock in case it is slippery.
