



It's summer! Warmer temperatures feel great, but they can also create a false sense of security for boaters. It may be 75 degrees out, but our water temperatures stay between 50 to 65 degrees. Below is a review of safety steps to take if you find yourself suddenly in Puget Sound waters.

Always wear your life jacket. It will not only keep your head above the water, but it will provide insulation to conserve your body temperature.

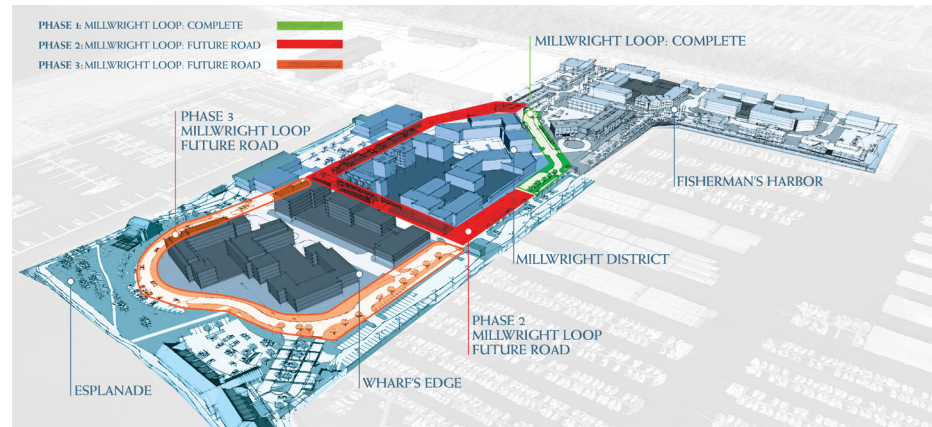
Stay calm. You want to be able to think clearly and signal for help. #53362

Control your breathing. Cold water immersion can trigger involuntary gasping, rapid breathing or hyperventilating.

Limit your body movement. Keep your head out of the water and tuck your body into the fetal position, which allows you to float and conserve body heat.

Prepare before you go. Remember to plan for your boating outing by checking the weather, having your boat in good running condition, all passengers wearing their personal flotation devices and your communication equipment available to ensure quick calls for help.

will be completed. Additionally, the south esplanade and the final Central Marina slipholder parking lots will be constructed.

This fall, the Port will primarily focus on demolishing hardscapes and building temporary access roads to support this work.

PARKING & ACCESS: Central Marina Permit Parking and Visitor Parking zones will be temporarily realigned during this time.

There will be no net loss of slipholder parking. Additional loading zones are being added near Central Marina gatehouses, and short-term permit spaces will be added at the Central restroom/laundry/shower facility. Slipholders at Central Docks A-F are encouraged to consider parking in the westernmost parking spaces so slipholders to the east aren't as impacted by the parking shift.

ON THE HORIZON: As the Millwright Loop Road project moves forward, the Port's selected development partner, LPC West, will begin build-out. This area will feature up to 60,000 square feet (sf) of new retail, up to 200,000 sf of commercial/office space, and 200 or more residential units. Planning and design are now underway, with private development slated for the 2023-2025 timeframe.

WHAT IS PRELOAD? Preload is the method of applying weight (such as dirt) to a site to help prevent future settlement. The Millwright District, like most Port property, is situated on historical fill. Preloading will remove groundwater from the roadway footprint so that adequate settlement can be achieved before construction. The preload will be piled in mounds 6-10 feet high, depending on location. You may have noticed these mounds in Fisherman's Harbor and parts of Central uplands.

WATERFRONT PLACE CONSTRUCTION MOVES INTO SECOND PHASE IN MILLWRIGHT DISTRICT

The Port of Everett is gearing up for its second phase of development at Waterfront Place, expanding construction activity into the Millwright District — a 10-acre parcel situated on the uplands between the Central and North Docks.

Work kicks off with the construction of Millwright Loop Road Phase 2 and associated public infrastructure projects, slated to begin this fall. Millwright Loop Road Phase 3 will follow to complete the vehicle and pedestrian connection around the district. Phase 1 of Millwright Loop Road was built in 2019.

Once all the phases are complete, the roadway will connect the Craftsman and Fisherman's Harbor districts to the West End. It also paves the way for private development to begin at the Millwright District — the largest mixed-use phase of Waterfront Place.

WHAT TO EXPECT: While you won't be seeing new asphalt for some time, piles of clean fill dirt — known as "preload" — will be imported

ed onto the site. About 120,000 cubic yards (or about 9,200 truckloads) of preload will be placed where the future roadway is to be built. The preload will compact the site and provide the additional material needed to mitigate for rising sea level.

After the preload settles (between 5-8 months), it will be graded to final site elevation and the remaining material will be repositioned into the future footprint of roadway construction for settlement (another 5-8 months). This will occur in both phases 2 and 3.

Prior to or in conjunction with this work, other key projects must be completed in this area. The upland boat and trailer storage will be removed, the Port's impound yard and Marina Operations will be moved to the former Ameron site in the Craftsman District, the Marina underground fuel tanks that supply the fuel dock will be relocated, and utility and stormwater improvements

If you're looking to rent a kayak or stand-up paddleboard on the Everett waterfront, KayakShare is now at Central A-Dock at the Port of Everett Marina.

Single and double kayaks, as well as stand-up paddleboards, are available to rent by the half-hour. Life jackets are provided to customers with each rental.

KayakShare's self-rental kiosk moved from next to the boat launch at Jetty Landing Park to its new location at Central A-Dock on June 1. The kiosk has been at the Marina for two years. Central A Dock is an ideal spot because it has a "kayak dock" so customers can come and go with ease.

Crabbing Season Opens July 1

Grab your crab pots! Crabbing season opens July 1 in many Puget Sound marina areas.

The daily limit is five Dungeness and six Red Rock. Dungeness must be at least 6 1/4 inches; Red Rock must be at least 5

inches. You must release all soft-shell and undersized crabs. Dungeness females must also be released.

Crabbing is allowed Thursdays thru Mondays only in the Strait of Juan de Fuca east of Bonilla-Tatoosh Island line off Neah Bay (Marine Area 4), Sekiu (Marine Area 5) and Port Angeles (Marine Area 6); the east side of Whidbey Island (Marine Areas 8-1 and 8-2); and northern Puget Sound (Marine Area 9).
