**PORT OF EVERETT COMMISSION AUTHORIZES CEO TO FINALIZE AND EXECUTE OPTION AGREEMENT FOR DEVELOPMENT OF THE 10-ACRE MILLWRIGHT DISTRICT AT WATERFRONT PLACE**

On Dec. 12, the Port of Everett Commission approved an Option Agreement with LPC West for the development of the 10-acre Millwright District at Waterfront Place.

This action provides the framework for LPC West to develop the second, and largest, mixed-use phase of the Waterfront Place project. This district, situated in the uplands between the Port's Central and North Marinas, will feature up to 60,000 square feet (sf) of destination retail, 200,000 sf of commercial space, and more than 200 multi-family housing units.

"We are so pleased to have reached terms with LPC West to be a part of our waterfront's future for decades to come," Port of Everett CEO Lisa Lefeber said. "LPC West has proven experience in delivering quality mixed-use projects that honor the vision and history of the communities they are developing in."

The Millwright District represents the second phase of public/private development within the Port's 65-acre, 1.5 million sf mixed-use Waterfront Place project. It builds on the momentum and the more than \$150 million in investment into the project to date with new developments at Fisherman's Harbor, including the new 266-unit Waterfront Place

Apartments, the new 142-unit Hotel Indigo, restaurant row in Fisherman's Harbor, new destination retail, public gathering spaces and more.

"LPC West is incredibly excited to reach this milestone and transition into creating plans for a vibrant hub for new residents and businesses at this exceptional waterfront location," said J.P. Harlow, Senior Vice President of LPC West. "We are honored to be working with the Port of Everett and look forward to a long and successful partnership bringing their vision on the waterfront to life."

LPC West is the West Coast arm of Lincoln Property Company — one of the largest diversified real estate services firms in the United States. The company represents projects throughout Washington, Oregon, California and Idaho, and are responsible for a portfolio of more than 33 million sf of commercially developed, managed and/or leased properties. #2597

LPC West expects to start construction on their first option in late 2023 or early 2024. This portion of the Millwright District will include the new Timberman Trail that will create an attractive and accessible connection from the North Marina to the Central Marina. **PORT'S MILLWRIGHT LOOP ROADS PROJECT IN MILLWRIGHT DISTRICT UNDERWAY**

This past fall, the Port expanded construction activity into the Millwright District to prepare for future site development. A \$3 million contract with Strider Construction includes the preparation work necessary to build the next portion of the Millwright Loop Roads, including importing large mounds of clean fill dirt known as preload onto the site for proper compaction, which is now underway. Work scope also includes widening a section of a waterfront trail, temporary realignment of

marina and visitor parking lots, and building temporary roads. This work is expected to wrap up next spring. A following project will complete the remaining portion of the roads, utility and stormwater improvements, the Central Marina esplanade, and rebuilding the Central Marina parking lots. **As a reminder, traffic modifications will be ongoing to support construction. Please be mindful of new detours, signage, cones, barriers, etc. in the construction zone.**

## Corps River Dredging Thru Mid-Feb

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps), in partnership with Port of Everett as the local sponsor, began maintenance dredging of the lower settling basin of the Snohomish River Federal Navigation Channel on Dec. 18.

The Corps' Seattle District awarded the contract to Tacoma-based American Construction Company to remove up to 190,000 cubic yards — equivalent to about 19,000 dump truck loads — of material from the lower settling basin with a clam-shell dredge.



**Boaters in the area should slow down, pay attention to rig markings, avoid and be cautious around the dredging operations.**

## Reminder: 2023 Marina Rates in Effect

Please note: As part of our annual 60-day notice period, updated moorage rates for 2023 were posted Nov. 1, 2022 and went into effect Jan. 1, 2023.

The adjustments are based on competitive market value rather than a blanket percentage adjustment. They remain below our competitors'.

For example, the 2023 rate for open moorage of a 68-foot vessel at the Port of Everett is \$11.25 per foot. In comparison, the 2022 rate in Anacortes was \$11.35 and in Edmonds it was \$12.58.

## PORT COMMISSION ADOPTS \$67 MILLION 2023 BUDGET

On Nov. 18, the Port Commission adopted a \$67 million 2023 operating and capital budget that continues to implement the vision of a vibrant and balanced working waterfront.

Projects that advance the Port's Strategic Plan include investing in maritime infrastructure to modernize the seaport, continued mixed-use development at Waterfront Place, upgrades to marina infrastructure, exploring new economic development opportunities and the cleanup of legacy contamination along the waterfront.

### What was funded this year for upgrades and maintenance at the marina?

A total of \$4.3 million in investment in the Marina was funded in the 2023 budget. The following is a list of high-level projects on the docket this year.

- ✓ South Marina West Restroom Exterior Remodel: \$60,000
- ✓ Boat Launch Connector Channel Dredging Permitting: \$6,000

## BOATING SAFETY | A Message From:



Brrrrr ... It is cold! It's definitely winter now, as we're seeing snow, cold rain and many shades of gray. With the colder temperatures, the water in Puget Sound has gotten even colder.

Boaters should take these extra safety precautions this winter:

**Keep your life jacket on.** It not only keeps your head above the water, but helps keep in body heat.

**Wear protective clothing.** This includes neoprene undergarments, gloves and a hat. #42919

**Review rescue procedures.** Before leaving the dock, ensure that every crew member knows where the rescue equipment is located and how to use it. Review the HELP position (Heat Escape Lessening Posture), which is important to adopt if you go overboard.

**Be careful on the docks.** Docks are often icy at this time. Falling into the water after slipping off the dock could result in injury and sudden exposure to cold water.

## Winter Boating Reminders & Tips

Don't forget! In freezing temperatures, water will be shut off at most Port of Everett docks — the North Marina, Central I-Dock and the Fuel Dock's will stay on. As always, vessel movement is prohibited when ice is present.

The following are some winter maintenance recommendations for your vessel:

- ✓ Assure that the heat source is secured, in a safe location, and that electrical lines are clear of any hazards.
- ✓ Check that lines and gear are tightly fixed to handle strong winds.
- ✓ Cover your vessel with a high-quality, breathable cover.
- ✓ Remove the propeller and get it serviced.
- ✓ Install a dehumidifier in the cabin.
- ✓ Confirm that bilges are clean and dry.
- ✓ Inspect and repair all electrical wiring and connections.
