PORT AWARDS \$13 MILLION CONTRACT FOR MILLWRIGHT LOOP ROAD CONSTRUCTION AT WATERFRONT PLACE

The Port of Everett Commission has awarded a \$13 million construction contract to Burlington-based Interwest Construction Inc. to build out the next phase of infrastructure at the Millwright District – the second and largest phase of the Port's Waterfront Place mixed-use development.

The project includes constructing the Millwright Loop Roads and connecting roadways and infrastructure starting with removal and relocation of existing preload material from the roadway footprint and placing it in future construction locations for the district.

Next will be the installation of utilities, paving of roadways, expansion of the Central Marina esplanade, including build-out of two new vistas overlooking the Port of Everett Marina, and construction of two Central Marina parking lots, new sidewalks, lighting and landscape features.

HUNDREDS VISIT WITH NAUTICAL ARCHEOLOGISTS AT EQUATOR OPEN HOUSE

More than 300 people visited the historic Equator – a schooner-turned-tugboat that has sat on display at the Port of Everett Marina since she was raised from a breakwater along Jetty Island in 1967 - to see her before she is dismantled later this summer.

The Port held an open house on June 15 at the vessel's shed at 10th Street and Craftsman Way to share the Texas A&M archaeologists' work to document the vessel and the Port's plans to memorialize her.

A Seattle-based nautical archaeologist, a pair of Texas A&M University professors and seven of their students documented the 78foot ship during a two-week survey in June.

The Millwright Loop Roads project is funded in part by the sale of a treasury note to the Snohomish County Treasurer's Office. This investment by the Treasurer's Office is the pilot for their new Community Investment Program, which sets out to invest locally while providing direct economic and community benefits back to the County.

As the Millwright Loop Roads project moves forward, the Port and selected development partner LPC West have executed an option agreement for the next phase of private development.

The 10-acre district will feature 60,000+ square feet of new retail/restaurants, 200,000+ sq. ft. of commercial/office space, and 300+ residential units.

Planning and design for the Millwright District, in coordination with Waterfront Place engineering firm PND Engineers, are now underway, with private development slated for the 2024-2027 timeframe.

Crabbing Season Opens July 1

Grab your crab pots! Crabbing season is open July 1-Sept. 4 in many Puget Sound marina areas.

The daily limit is five Dungeness, six Red Rock and six Tanner. Dungeness must be at least 6¹/₄ inches: Red Rock need to be at least 5 inches and Tanner must be 41/2 inches. You are required to release all soft-shell and undersized crabs. Dungeness females must also be released.

Crabbing is allowed Thursdays thru Mondays only in the Strait of Juan de Fuca east of Bonilla-Tatoosh Island line off Neah Bay (Marine Area 4), Sekiu (Marine Area 5) and Port Angeles (Marine Area 6); the east side of Whidbey Island (Marine Areas 8-1 and 8-2); and northern Puget Sound (Marine Area 9).

Hamilton Cellars Inks 'Wine Walk' Lease

Hamilton Cellars is the second lease to be announced for the Port's coming destination retail "wine walk" along the Port of Everett Marina – Covington Cellars | Two Vintners also has a lease. Hamilton Cellars has inked a new 10-year lease to add a wine tasting room at Waterfront Place.

This project offers up to 12 tasting suites in two to three new buildings to be added at water's edge between Port Gardner Landing and Marina Village. The buildings are in design now and will be built by the Port's private development partner The Schuster Group. The project is expected to break ground in 2024, with tasting rooms opening in the 2025-2026 timeframe.

BOATING SAFETY | A Message From:



Though temperatures will heat up this summer, it's important to remember that water temperatures will remain cold throughout the boating season.

According to SeaTemperatures.org, Puget Sound averages 49 degrees in June, 51 degrees in July, 54 degrees in August and 53 degrees in September. An unexpected submersion in waters at these temperatures without protective clothing such as a wet or dry suit could result in hypothermia.

Symptoms include shivering, confusion, slurred speech, clumsiness, lack of coordination and loss of consciousness. Hypothermia symptoms can show up in three minutes, which means having a rescue plan is critical. Anybody who falls into the water should be treated as though they have the life-threatening condition. Hypothermia is a medical emergency - make a MAYDAY call.

Help save lives by requiring everybody on your boat to wear a life jacket. Ensure that you have enough life jackets and that they are in good shape, fit properly and are a different color than the water. Pay special attention to life jackets for children. If your jackets autoinflate, ensure the cylinders have not been punctured or show signs of corrosion. #1188
