After much anticipation, the Everett Yacht Club plans to move into its new clubhouse near the South Docks and adjacent to Anthony's Woodfire Grill this spring.

The new three-story clubhouse at 1720 West Marine View Drive has indoor and outdoor spaces for member meetings, classes and events. The building features a "crow's nest," kitchen and bar, an elevator, plus convenient access to the Port's nearby Commodore Plaza and South Marina facilities. #23036

This is the fourth clubhouse for the Everett Yacht Club, formed in 1907, whose history predates the Port's. The club was originally located on an offshore float at Camp No. 1 south of Weyerhauser Mill A. That float was moved between Pier 1 and Pier 2 at the Port of Everett Seaport in 1927.


A clubhouse was built in 1931 west of the Great Northern Railway Depot. The Black Prince was annexed to the building in 1936. An Everett Yacht Club addition replaced the decommissioned vessel in 1956.

In 1968, the club relocated to a new two-story building on 14th Street. That previous space, just south of the Port's Boxcar Park, is in a state of disrepair. It is programmed for demolition to make way for a new hospitality/restaurant concept in Phase 3 of the Port's Waterfront Place development.

Tom Stiger Sworn in to Fourth Term

On Jan. 9, Port of Everett Commissioner-elect Tom Stiger was officially sworn into service, marking the continuation in his post representing citizens in the Port District 2 seat for another six-year term. Stiger was re-elected in November 2023 to serve the citizens in what he shares will be his fourth and final term on the Port Commission. A U.S. Army veteran and retired Everett School District principal, Stiger has served on the Port of Everett Commission for nearly 20 years. This includes his two most recent terms from 2012-2023 serving District 2 and his earlier service representing District 3 from 1964-1971. Stiger brings to the Port a range of maritime experience from the shipping to commercial fishing industries. He is an avid boater and slipholder at the Port of Everett Marina, seeing the value of the marina as both a recreational hub and economic asset.

Central Dock Fire Cleanup Slated

Plans are now underway to clean up damages from a Jan. 14 fire that broke out on Central I-Dock. The Everett Fire Department responded to calls about a fire at the Port of Everett Marina Central Docks around 2:45 a.m. The fire was quickly contained; however, two boathouses were total losses. Adjacent infrastructure also sustained damaged due to the fire. Thankfully, no injuries were reported. Marysville Fire District and Tulalip Bay Fire provided mutual aid. We appreciate the slipholder and Port staff who acted fast in calling 911, and the quick and professional work of the first responders.

Next Restaurant Row Groundbreaking Targeting Spring

The Port of Everett is on pace to break ground on the next two buildings along Waterfront Place's "Restaurant Row" in Fisherman's Harbor this spring, adding six more dining experiences to the waterfront by mid-2025.

A two-story building will be constructed south of the new Asian-fusion Fisherman Jack's restaurant and South Fork Baking Co. that opened last summer. The nearly 12,000-square-foot building will be home to Tapped Public House, Rustic Cork Wine Bar, Hamilton Cellars and Menchie's @ the Marina.

Another building will be situated at the corner of Seiner and West Marine View drives near the Grand Avenue Park Bridge. This 6,000 sq. ft. building overlooking Seiner Wharf and the commericial fishing dock will house The Net Sheds Fish Market and Lazy Boy Brewing.

Site development also includes construction of a visitor parking lot. Meanwhile, designs for mixed-use development at the Millwright District — the second and largest phase of the Port's Waterfront Place project — have hit 30% design. #25913

The Millwright District, situated in the uplands between the Central and South Marinas, will feature 60,000+ sq. ft. of new retail/restaurants, 200,000+ sq. ft. of commercial/office space, along with 313 residential units and wrapping structured parking to serve that site.

The Port's development partner on this phase of work, LPC West, is preparing to break ground this winter starting with residential. Retail and office will follow.

The work to prepare the 10-acre district for private development continues today, including construction of roadways, utilities, parking lots, trails, sidewalks and more.

Slipholders Moor in Everett for Over 50 Years

Marilyn and Jack Courrier are what we like to call "legacy boaters" they have moored their boats at the Port of Everett Marina for 53 years.

Since 1971, the Everett couple has docked their powerboat in the Central Docks, though it hasn't been the same boat all this time. Two of their boats in five decades have been named *White Frog*.



The Courriers might visit Poulsbo and Port Ludlow with the boat for the weekend or take a trip to British Columbia and Alaska for months at a time. Over the years, they've gone fishing, crabbing, waterskiing, swimming and beachcombing, but most times they're just happy to anchor out in a bay.

Boating has become a family affair! Their son and daughter have been boating all their lives. In fact, their son, Jim, has moored his boat at the Port since 1998. Now the Courriers' grandkids are enjoying their time on the water too.

Why stay at the Port of Everett for more than 50 years? Not only do the Courriers enjoy the amenities, they also appreciate the customer service and friendships built over the years with Marina Office and Operations staff.

"The Port of Everett staff has enjoyed seeing Jack and Marilyn down here at the Marina," said Jeff Lindhout, Chief of Marina Operations for the Port of Everett. "I always smile when Jack reminds me of his monthly moorage rate 53 years ago. Thank you, Jack and Marilyn, for your many years of moorage with us."
