Canal Bicentennial Celebrations

This year, the Village of Fairport, the New York State Canal Corporation, along with other community organizations will be celebrating the bicentennial anniversary of the Erie Canal construction.

On Friday May 20th, 2022 there will be a celebration of the opening day of canal season, completion of multiple canal related projects in the village and the 200th anniversary of the canal coming to Fairport in 1822. Stop by in the Village and check out the sights and sounds of Fairport on the Erie Canal.

Liftbridge Lights

On December 21,2021 the Village of Fairport in conjunction with Reimagine the Canals, the NYS Power Authority, and NYS Canal Corporation revealed the special lighting package, installed during the lift bridge rehabilitation project. Nightly, the lights illuminate the historic lift bridge architecture.

As of 2022, the Fairport Liftbridge is now part of the Governor's lighting program for setting monuments aglow with special colors to commemorate specific dates and activities across the state.



Collectively Composting Update: The Village of Fairport launched a voluntary composting program in October 2021. Residents may drop off compostable organics at two locations: **22 Railroad St. and Potter Park parking lot.** food scraps, meat, fish, poultry scraps, coffee ground filters, pizza boxes and bio-degradable bags may be loaded in the totes. Fairport Adopted Budget - Fiscal Year 2022-2023

The Village of Fairport is pleased to present the 2022-2023 Adopted Budget to our residents. In an effort to be transparent and provide a more accessible and understandable budget document, we have implemented a new online web-based budget portal called ClearGov. You may access the budget by visiting our website at <u>www.fairportny.com</u>. The adopted budget has a zero percent increase in the tax levy thereby no increase in your tax bill. This budget is fiscally conservative while continuing to increase capacity and investment within our Village. You will see the implementation of new public restrooms placed on Liftbridge Lane W. this year as well as infrastructure improvements implemented on Liftbridge Lane E. We also will be conducting over \$300k in street resurfacing and sidewalk replacement this year alone. We are pleased to adopt a budget that is representative of the services and expectations that our community deserves while providing a competent budget that promotes integrity and fiscal restraint. Tax Collection Season 2022-2023

Tax Bills will be mailed out on June 1, 2022. Full payment is due by July 1, 2022 and **no** partial payments are allowed.

The Village Clerk's office will accept payment as follows:

- By E-Check, Credit or Debit Card thru the online portal on the Clerk-Treasurer's page of the Village Website
- By Check via mail to Village Hall (receipt date determined by U.S. postmark)
- By Check <u>only</u> in the Village Drop Box located in front or back of Village Hall
- By Check via mail to our Bank's lockbox, **Binghamton**, NY
- By Check, Cash, Credit or Debit Card at the Village Office (Monday-Friday 8:30AM-3:30PM)

On July 2, 2022, a 5% penalty will be applied, with an additional 1% for each month beginning August 1, 2022.

Fairport Alerts

As Village residents and/or Fairport Electric customers, you can sign up to receive alerts from the Village through the Fairport Alerts System called Everbridge. Choose which alerts you would like to receive and how you would

like to receive them whether by phone, text, e-mail, or through the Everbridge App.

Fairport Electric uses these alerts to help notify customers of any outages affecting their homes along with maintenance work by Fairport Electric Crews. We also notify our customers when tree trimming, and

other contractors may be working in your neighborhood.

Take Heed of Pollutants in Storm Drains

Storm drains lead directly to nearby water-bodies, so keeping lawn and yard care byproducts and pool, fountain and spa discharges out of storm drains will reduce the amount of pollutants entering our local waters. As you perform your household chores, follow the guide below to improve and protect our local water quality.

Lawn and Yard Care

- Mulch your leaves. Mulching returns nutrients to the soil and saves the time and work needed to rake and dispose of leaves.
- Sweep up lawnmower clippings from your driveway and adjacent roadway to prevent them from entering storm drains.
- - and debris will help reduce localized flooding during rainfalls.



- State law requires fertilizer landing on impervious surfaces, such as driveways, roadways and sidewalks be immediately cleaned up and applied to the lawn or containerized.
- State law prohibits the application of fertilizer on lawns between December 1 & April 1.

Household Hazardous Waste

• Dispose of old or unwanted fertilizers, pesticides, pool chemicals and other household hazardous waste properly, such as at Monroe County's Ecopark. Call (585) 753-7600 (option 3), or go to **monroecounty.gov/hhw**

Fairport Office of Community + Economic Development (OCED) Grant Programs

SENIOR/DISABLED HOME IMPROVEMENT GRANT: Grants are offered to incomeeligible seniors and disabled homeowners for emergency, essential or safety-related home improvements or repairs. Eligible improvements or repairs include heating, plumbing, electric, roofing, windows, doors, and insulation.

FRONT PORCH GRANT: This incentive program provides a matching grant for front porch preservation, restoration, or rehabilitation projects. To be eligible for consideration, the project must not yet be permitted or under construction. Routine maintenance is not eligible.

Thanksgiving: Thursday residential refuse collection scheduled for November 24th and Friday commercial refuse and recycling scheduled for November 25th will be collected Wednesday, November 23rd.

Bulk Refuse and Yard Waste Collection: From April to November bulk waste is collected every week. From December to March, bulk waste is collected as weather and operations allow. No contractor debris will be collected and bulk waste piles should not exceed 4 ft. high by 4 ft. wide by 8 ft. long.
