FPU Report:

Mr. Honey stated that the swimming pool filter system is blowing sand into the pool, it will take a week to get the parts then the pool would close the following week. Mr. Honey stated that he is recommending closing the pool, for the summer, rather than spending the money to fix the system for one (1) more week of operation. Ordinance No. 2011-16 – Naming a Portion of a City Street:

Ordinance 2011-16, an ordinance entitled “An Ordinance Naming A New City Street In Fayetteville, Tennessee”, was considered. Said Ordinance is as follows:

**ORDINANCE NO. 2011-16
CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE, TENNESSEE**

AN ORDINANCE NAMING A NEW CITY STREET IN FAYETTEVILLE, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Alderman have approved the construction of a new street that will connect to a portion of the existing Redstone Drive within the corporate limits of Fayetteville; and,

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated §7-86-127 grants local governments the power to name public roads located within their corporate limits; and,

WHEREAS, it is recognized that the new street is required to be named in order to facilitate orderly and efficient growth, postal and emergency service operation; and,

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the newly constructed street will become an extension of a portion of the existing Redstone Drive; and,


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMAN OF THE CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE, TENNESSEE, THAT:

SECTION 1. The City of Fayetteville hereby names the newly constructed street as Redstone Drive.

SECTION 2. The newly constructed and named street is shown on the attached map labeled Exhibit A and shall be incorporated herein by reference.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage, the public welfare requiring it.

AN ORDINANCE RE-NAMING A CITY STREET IN FAYETTEVILLE, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Alderman have approved the construction of a new street that will connect to a portion of the existing Redstone Drive within the corporate limits of Fayetteville; and,

WHEREAS, a portion of the former Redstone Drive is required to be renamed as a result of said construction; and,

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated §7-86-127 grants local governments the power to name public roads located within their corporate limits; and,

WHEREAS, it is recognized that a portion of the former Redstone Drive is required to be re-named in order to facilitate growth along with orderly and efficient postal and emergency service operation; and,



SECTION 1. The City of Fayetteville hereby re-names this street as Yearwood Drive with its beginning being found at its intersection with Huntsville Highway and its ending found at its intersection with Redstone Drive.

SECTION 2. The newly re-named street is shown on the attached map labeled Exhibit A and shall be incorporated herein by reference.

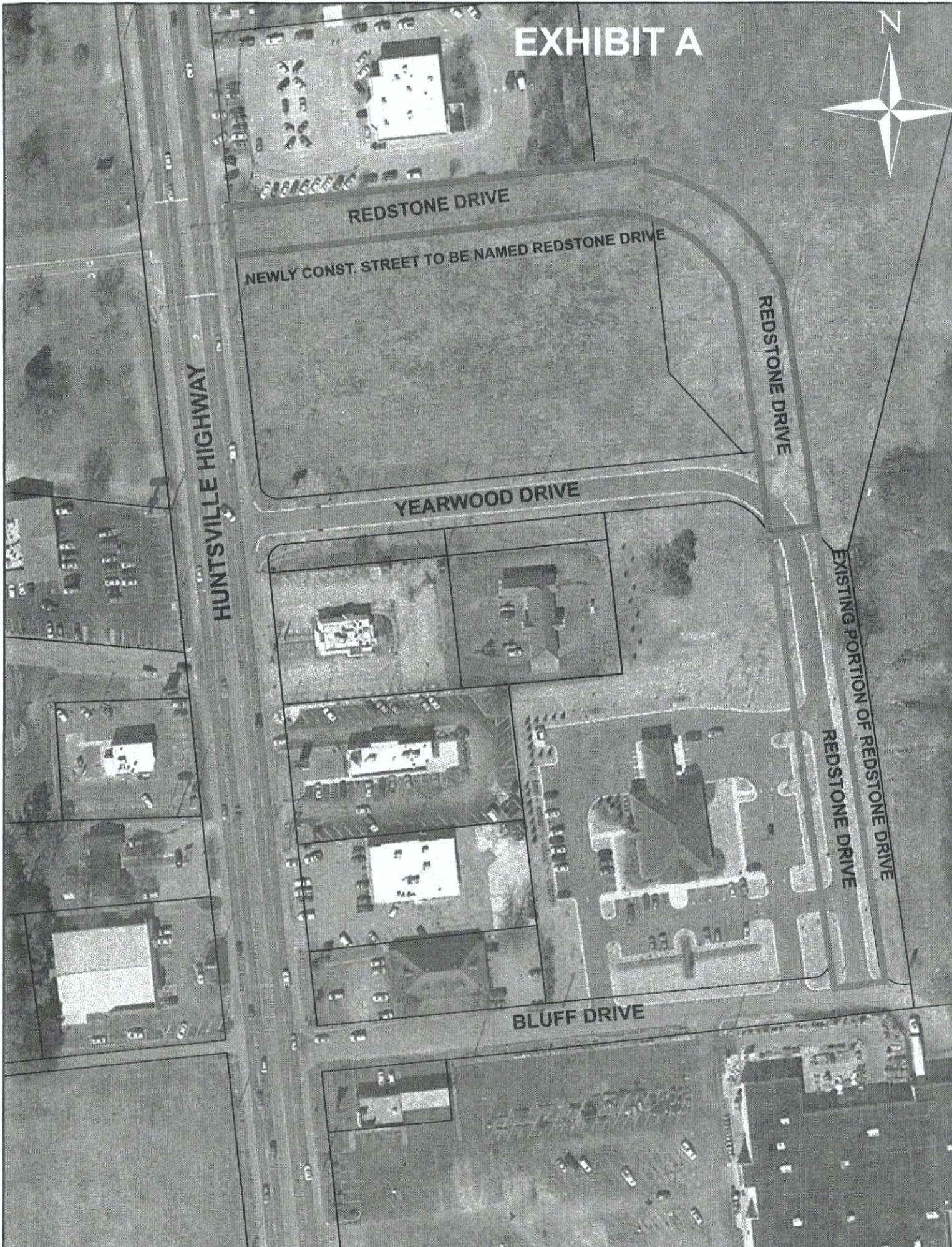
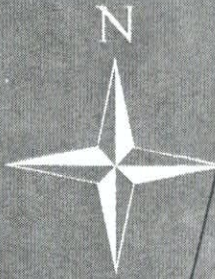
BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage, the public welfare requiring it.
