# Oath of Office:

Police Officers John Counts and Tommy Hopson were sworn in by Mayor Underwood.

### Reports:

### Fayetteville/Lincoln County Industrial Development Board:

Elaine Middleton, Executive Director, explained that the Frito-Lay utility and road location is on-going, with the Tennessee Department of Transportation to bid the road work in January and the project to begin in March. Ms. Middleton stated that there is interest in the Spec building from a Chinese company.

### **Fayetteville Public Utilities:**

Britt Dye, the CEO/General Manager, explained that during the last few days of storms, the electrical system did not have any major issues, with only minor outages. Mr. Dye stated that the contractors have broken ground on the now water treatment plant. Mr. Dye discussed the good audit report for their last operating year, as well as controlling cost.

# Fayetteville/Lincoln County Library:

Jill Rael, the Library Director, reported that there will be a Latin Guitar Concert November 16<sup>th</sup>. Ms. Rael explained that they are working on a grant in conjunction with the Sci-Quest and Art with the STEM modules, which will be a year long program.

# Keep Fayetteville/Lincoln County Beautiful:

Gail Randolph, Director of Keep Fayetteville/Lincoln County Clean, presented a Stone Plaque to the Board of Mayor and Alderman in appreciation of their support "in recycling and fighting against litter". Ms. Randolph stated that they will be having an Open House on November 14, 2014, and invited everyone to come.

# **Tennessee Promise - Mentoring:**

Laura Monks, Motlow State Community College Director of the Fayetteville Campus, discussed the new program called Tennessee Promise Begins, which allows high school seniors who complete their Tennessee Promise application by November 1, 2014, and graduate from high school next spring to have the opportunity to attend a community college or technology school tuition-free beginning with the fall 2015 semester.

### Fire Report:

Fire Chief Danny Travis reported that the Fire Department had 71 calls for service, 51 medical calls, 3 accident with injuries and 2 bomb threats.

### Police Report:

Police Chief Richard Howell reported that there were 157 incidents with 68 arrests, 48 crashes and 91 citations for a total of 1,782 events.

# **Recreation Report:**

Ricky Honey, Recreation Director, stated that "Pink in the Park" at Stone Bridge Park October 20<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Honey reported that Halloween Happenings will take place October 21<sup>st</sup> and the Annual Christmas Parade will be December 6<sup>th</sup>.

# Public Works:

Eddie Plunkett, Public Works Director, reported that for the month of September there was 222 tons of sanitation was picked up, along with 425 tons of leaves and brush.

# Planning and Codes Report:

Jeff Siefert, Building Inspector, reported for the month of May there were eleven (11) building permits issued for approximately Sixty-Four Thousand, Three Hundred Seventy-One Dollars and 46/100 (\$64,371.46) in work to be done, with the fees being Two Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars and 30/100 (\$2,500.30).

### Administrator's Report:

Mr. Collins stated that the contract for the Washington Street paving project has been signed with paving to begin next week. Mr. Collins reported that the City is working on various grants: 1) Downtown Funding to help current business owners around the square and 2) a motor transportation grant.

### Camp Blount:

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF FAYETTEVILLE, TENNESSEE TO PROVIDE FOR THE INCLUSION OF REQUIRED REGULATORY CHANGES TO THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP

**WHEREAS**, the owners of the parcel of property listed below have requested that it be rezoned for the purpose of continuing to utilize the property as residential; and,

**WHEREAS**, on August 26, 2014 the Fayetteville Municipal/Regional Planning Commission did review and recommend for adoption, the following rezoning; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Fayetteville Regional Planning Commission does recommend to the Board of Mayor and Alderman that the "Zoning Map of Fayetteville, Tennessee," be amended as hereafter described; and,

**WHEREAS**, a public hearing was conducted by the Board of Mayor and Alderman of the City of Fayetteville, Tennessee on October 14, 2014; and,



WHEREAS, the Tennessee Department of Transportation has responsibility for the administration of the Tennessee Department of Transportation-Transportation Alternatives program (TA) which is designed to assist communities in their efforts to enhance transportation concerns; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fayetteville, acting by and through its Board of Aldermen proposes to apply for TA funds for the purpose of performing eligible transportation enhancement activities that will benefit the majority of the residents of the City of Fayetteville; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fayetteville will provide local financial support in conjunction with the TA funds to complete the project; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fayetteville, as a recipient is required to designate and appoint a Financial Officer to perform certain duties in the administration of said grant; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Fayetteville as follows:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, Mayor John Ed Underwood, Jr., is hereby authorized to execute and submit an application with appropriate assurances to the State of Tennessee, Department of Transportation, requesting Fiscal Year 2015 TA funds for the 2015 City of Fayetteville Downtown Improvement Project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, the City of Fayetteville will be responsible for the local cash /match toward the project to be provide in full by the general account; and

# Resolution No. R-2014-07

INITIAL RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000) GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE, TENNESSEE

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen (the "Board") of the City of Fayetteville, Tennessee (the "Municipality") that for the purpose of financing, in whole or in part, (i) construction, renovation, repair, improvement and equipping of a law enforcement facility and other public buildings; (ii) the acquisition of vehicles and equipment, including but not be limited to public works vehicles and equipment, public safety vehicles and equipment, computer hardware and software and other technological equipment; (iii) the acquisition of land for public facilities, preservation of open space, drainage systems, parks, parking facilities, recreation facilities, rights-of-way, highways, streets and roads, bridges, sidewalks, and public buildings; (iv) the construction, improvement, renovation and equipping of drainage systems, parks, parking facilities, recreation facilities, rights-of-way, highways, streets and roads bridges, sidewalks and public buildings and facilities; (v) acquisition of all property real and personal, appurtenant thereto, or connected with such capital projects and construction of related infrastructure; (vi) payment of legal, fiscal, administrative, architectural and engineering costs incident thereto; (vii) reimbursement to the Municipality for funds previously expended for any of the foregoing; and (viii) payment of costs incident to the issuance and sale of such bonds therefor, there shall be issued bonds of said Municipality in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$2,000,000, which shall bear interest at a rate or rates not to exceed 5% per annum, and which shall be payable from unlimited ad valorem taxes to be levied on all taxable property within the corporate limits of the Municipality.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board that the City Clerk of the Municipality be, and is, hereby directed and instructed to cause the foregoing initial resolution relative to the issuance of not to exceed \$2,000,000 general obligation bonds to be published in full in a newspaper having a general circulation in the Municipality, for one issue of said paper followed by the statutory notice, to-wit:

### NOTICE

The foregoing resolution has been adopted. Unless within twenty (20) days from the date of publication hereof a petition signed by at least ten percent (10%) of the registered voters of the Municipality shall have been filed with the City Clerk of the Municipality protesting the issuance of the bonds, such bonds will be issued as proposed.
