					City Manager Rodriguez conveyed that the proposed agreement will utilize a 10'x10' area that will assist in identifying seismic activity related to tremors and earthquakes occurring in that location. This project needed to be in an undisturbed area to obtain reliable readings.
					Chris Bryan with TXO Holdings reported that the 84 th & 85 th Texas Legislature tasked the Bureau of Economic Geology to discover a method to monitor earthquake activity. This project was funded by the State and partnerships; and TXO's role was to locate additional areas where they could position their seismic reading information.
					This proposed agreement was for only one location which will contain a 150-watt self-sufficient solar panel. With more stations, there will be more readings, and a better understanding of the data. This was about learning how to manage activity that could be human induced.
