
The procedure for adoption of a Home Rule Charter includes:

- a. Selection of a Charter Commission.
- b. Charter Commission prepares the proposed Home Rule Charter and submits the proposed Charter to the City Council for review.
- c. City Council places the Charter on the ballot for the municipality's next general election.
- d. All registered voters of the City receive a copy of the approved and proposed Charter by mail thirty days prior to the election.
- e. During the election, citizens vote whether or not to adopt the proposed Charter. (*Adoption of the Charter requires a majority vote.*)
