Mayor Alexander called the Regular Meeting to order at 5:33 p.m. after declaring a quorum present.

Mayor Alexander explained that the fire trucks don't fit in the old Fire Department. He explained that the location of the New Fire Department is vital. He gave an example of a neighboring Fire Department that was unable to reach a fire due to being stuck on the other side of the train tracks. It is important that our Fire Department can reach the fire regardless of what side of the tracks it is on.

Council Member Warnock thanked City Manager Rodriguez and Mayor Alexander for their role in making this come to fruition.

Mayor Pro-Tem expressed his excitement and appreciation of being a part of this plan.

Council Member Falcon inquired if a monetary value is needed.

Director of Finance Rodriguez explained that the City already has a value of the property according to their fixed assets.

Council Member Falcon voiced his enthusiasm that this project must be completed by December 31, 2025.

Mayor Alexander explained that the County has the new location for the Fire Station budgeted for their next fiscal year which will begin in January.
