#### ORDINANCE NO. 3307

ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE PROVIDING WILL COUNTY, ILLINOIS
FOR CORPORATE PURPOSES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING
MAY 1, A.D. 2021, and ENDING APRIL 30, A.D. 2022
IN THE VILLAGE OF FRANKFORT, WILL & COOK COUNTIES, ILLINOIS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF FRANKFORT, WILL & COOK COUNTIES, ILLINOIS.

SECTION I: That said President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Frankfort Will and Cook Counties, Illinois in accordance with the provision of the statute in such case made and provided, have duly ascertained and determined that the total amount of Fifty-Four Million, Six Hundred Seventeen Thousand, Nine Hundred and Ninety-Two Dollars and No Cents (\$54,617,992.00) necessary to defray all necessary expenses and liabilities of said municipality for the fiscal year A.D. 2022 for the following corporate purposes and objects, and that the following sums of money be and the same are hereby appropriated for the corporate purposes and objects of said Village hereinafter specified for the fiscal year commencing on the 1st day of May, 2021, and ending on the 30th day of April, 2022, to-wit:

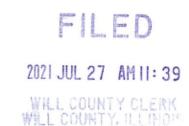

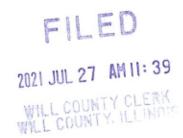
